FC CLACTON MATCH

Real Bedford twice fought back from Clacton goals in a 2-2 draw to take the FA Cup clash to a replay at McMullen Park.

Goals from Luke Knight and a late finish from Josh Setchell ensured the Pirates kept their Wembley dreams alive.

The game started end-to-end, with Clacton creating the first chance where Charlie Collis forced a strong save out of Tyler McGregor within the first 5 minutes. Real Bedford responded with Ben Stevens causing issues for the Clacton defence, with two chances narrowly missing the target in quick succession.

It wasn't long before the home side took the lead from a corner. Mekhi McKenzie, Clacton's top scorer from last season, rose the highest in the area to give Clacton the lead within 15 minutes. However, The Pirates managed an instant response from a corner of their own. Charlie Smith's cross found Luke Knight, who knocked the ball over the line to bring things back level.

Real took control after the goal, and Jordan Brown broke free through on goal, but the linesman flagged him offside, to the disappointment of the travelling fans. Upon review of the replay, the linesman had made the correct call.

Both teams created chances throughout the first half. Still, there was nothing to test either keeper, so the players went in at the break with little to separate them as the heavens started to open and rain fell across Clacton, worsening conditions for the second half.

Second Half

The rain did not cease as the players returned to the field, preventing the game from flowing as mistimed tackles became more regular, with several Clacton players seeing yellow.

The stop-start nature of the second half seemed to suit the hosts as they put early pressure on the Real defence, rewarded with their second goal to re-establish their lead 5 minutes into the second period. Jake Clowsley broke through the Real

defence before beating McGregor with a chip.

Despite conditions and the scoreline against The Pirates, Rob Sinclair's team showed resilience, pushing hard for an equaliser. Despite the end-to-end action, there were few clear chances until The Pirates levelled the game in the 85th minute. Jordan Brown held a ball up well before laying off to Joey Evans, who hit a first-time pass over the Clacton defence to put Josh Setchell clear through on goal. The new signing for Real placed the ball under the keeper's legs, to the delight of the travelling fans.


The aftermath of the goal celebration led to an altercation off the field which soon involved players from both sides. As the Clacton bench raced across the field and jumped over the fence to join the melee, they were soon followed by the Bedford team. The referee then brandished a red card to Real Bedford captain Luke Knight for his involvement, a puzzling decision that left The Pirates at a significant disadvantage with time still on the clock.

Real Bedford controlled the latter stages of the game, snuffing out multiple chances for the home team to put the game to bed, forcing the fixture to a replay at McMullen Park.

After the game, manager Rob Sinclair was proud of his side's spirit and determination: "The boys showed real character tonight in conditions that suited Clacton way more than ourselves, the game management shown by this young side, especially when reduced to 10 men was outstanding in what was a crazy game. Hopefully, we can now go finish the job at home."

FROM THE BOARDROOM

As we gather under the floodlights of McMullen Park for what promises to be another gripping FA Cup game against FC Clacton, I want to thank you all for coming out tonight and supporting the team. The growing crowds at McMullen Park help support our target of climbing the pyramid while building a sustainable revenue model.

Looking back, I feel so much pride in the progress we have made in the short time we have been working on this project. Just compare the record crowd of 362 who came out for our opener against MK Irish to the 40-50 that would come along less than two years ago. Crowds are the lifeblood of any sustainable football club, they help the players and support the business model.

Equally noteworthy was the turnout of 211 spectators for our ladies' opening fixture against Stevenage. The highest crowd we have had for a ladies' game

since we started working with them and higher than the average gate we had for the mens last season. The Bedford community is embracing Real Bedford, and we are committed to giving back to you.

I won't mince words – this season presents new challenges for us to navigate, both on and off the pitch. Manager Rob Sinclair worked tirelessly over the summer to enhance his squad, and our match against Cockfosters featured seven new players in the starting lineup. The speed at which they have gelled is impressive, and if we had been awarded the penalty we felt we deserved in the dying moments of this weekend's fixture, we could have finished our opening two league games with a maximum of six points.

Our ladies started their season with an impressive 4-1 home win over Stevenage this weekend gone. Under the guidance of new manager Dean Perrett, and his coaching team of Joe and Georgia, they



have built a squad that can put last season behind them and challenge for trophies.

The first half was tight, with our new goalkeeper Sarah Hudson pulling off two excellent saves to ensure we went into the halftime break in the lead. Penalties on either side of the break from Gemma Croucher, goals from Tasha Fensome and Neve Mayes, and a player-of-the-match performance from Amy Reed ensured we started the season with a win.

As we look forward to the rest of the season, I want to thank Real Bedford Ladies Chair Jill Upton for supporting our vision. Please do come down and watch the ladies too, this club has two first teams and they are of equal importance to Bedford.

Now we turn our attention to the FA Cup, with McMullen Park hosting its first match in the competition for years. The players deserve credit for holding FC Clacton to

a draw in the first game in challenging conditions. Two attempts at playing the game, a long Tuesday drive to the coast and harsh weather conditions did not suit us. Still, Josh Setchell's well-deserved equaliser kept our Wembley dreams alive.

We may be in the competition's very early stages, but we would love to put together a little cup run. If we overcome FC Clacton tonight, then we will welcome back MK Irish to McMullen Park for the next round. In future years we hope to climb the pyramid and see what teams we can get to McMullen Park.

I want to reiterate my immense gratitude for your support. Let us hope that when the final whistle blows tonight, it does so with The Pirates heading into the next round.

THE BIG INTERVIEW WITH

This week, we sat down with versatile winger Claston Gordon, who joined The Pirates mid-way through last season from Moulton. Since then, he's developed his game to become a key part of not only the team's success last campaign but Sinclair's plans for this one. Despite that, it's been a tricky road to get to McMullen Park for Gordon as we found out through this interview.

First of all, cast your mind back over the last few weeks, how have you found pre-season?

Pre-season was good, does feel like we've been back longer than we actually have! It was a hard graft initially, but the hard work is what makes us such a tight knit group as we all strive to be better for each other.

Your first pre-season at the club as you signed half way through the campaign last year, how was it joining a club mid-way through the season especially one pushing for the title?

It was certainly something new, for me it was a big jump from where I'd been before, from the standard of training, matches, ambition and professionalism of the club. But on the whole, it was a great experience. Everyone

around the club is so welcoming and friendly so it felt quite easy to mix into the team culture and environment.

Last time out at McMullen Park it was a tough win over MK Irish, how did you find that game and what do you think the squad have learnt from that 90 minutes?

The game was a real battle, we knew they would be strong but I still thought they came as a bit of a surprise to us, especially in the first half, where we started slow. Despite getting the win, we certainly learnt a lot from the game. I don't think we hit anywhere near our potential, which is actually quite exciting.

Your link up with summer signing Joey Evans has been there for all to see in these last few games, what's the relationship like between you two?

Joey and I have a really good relationship. We both joined Moulton during the same season, but I hadn't crossed paths with him during any youth football. So it's been great getting to know him over the last 18 months or so and I feel we're now on the same wavelength on the field. He's so good in the box, so as long as he's there, I'll keep delivering.



WITH CLASTON GORDON

You seem to be becoming quite the versatile player! How have you found moving into more of a defensive role this season?

It's actually been really good. If I'm honest, when the gaffer told me the sort of role he wanted me to play I was a little unsure as I've always been more of an attacking minded player. But playing in the fullback role has been really eye opening, I still have the licence to move forward but feel like I've been able to develop my defensive skills massively in such a short space of time. Also, having someone like Luke Knight alongside me in the back 4. He's very vocal so helps me during the game and has allowed me to fit into this new role a lot quicker.

The crowd at McMullen Park against MK Irish was a record one, just how much does that positively impact your time on the pitch as players?

It's massive for us. The crowd makes such a difference, so to have such a good fan base at this level it pushes us that little bit further on match day. The whole club just feels so together at the moment.

What's your footballing background, how did you get to where you are today?

I won't like it's been a struggle to get here. I've had a lot of set backs in my career already, from failed trials at more clubs than I can remember, to injuries cutting stints short. I feel proud therefore, to be where I am today. No matter how many "no's" I've heard, I've kept on grinding and therefore to still be playing football at this level is a big achievement for me. I'm also so grateful to my mum who has stuck by me throughout and driven me around the country to trials when I've needed it. I've played this sport since I was 2 and I'm still in love with it which I'm so thankful for.

What are you expecting from tonight's games against FC Clacton?

Well the benefit of playing them last week is of course we have a good idea of how they'll go about the game tonight. However, knock-out football is a dangerous beast so we just need to focus on ourselves and hopefully with the home advantage and good conditions we can come out on top this evening.



Real Bedford got their league season off to the perfect start with a 1-0 victory over a strong MK Irish outfit at McMullen Park on Tuesday Night.

In front of a record crowd, new signing Joey Evans bagged a 78th-minute winner which capped off a resilient display from The Pirates who showed defensive acumen throughout the 90 minutes to keep the clean sheet.

Despite winning, there was little to separate the sides, especially in the first half. It was the away side who did get the first chance of the game a mere 3 minutes in, a cross from George Shrieves finding the head of the unmarked Ty Ward who failed to head it towards the target keeping scores level.

MK Irish then caught The Pirates on a strong counterattack 15 minutes later leaving Shrieves one on one with McGregor who pulled off his first of

many superb stops to deny the MK Irish attacker from any real threat.

Bedford showed promise up the other end of the pitch too, with Ben Stevens putting in a wicked cross towards Joey Evans in the 19th minute, but the striker couldn't get a touch on the ball to guide it into the net.

MK Irish then got the best chance of the half moments later, in what was turning out to be an end-to-end affair. Winger Andre Olukanmi, driving down the flank before cutting inside and releasing a shot which was initially parried by McGregor and forced over the bar by the head of Luke Knight, with MK Irish players swarming the box in search of a rebound, the skipper did well to keep things at bay.

The final opportunity of the half saw another superb stop from McGregor in goal. This time a Shrieves cross found Mason Spence in the middle whose headed chance was deflected



away by the keeper to ensure proceedings were level at the break.

Second Half

Real Bedford came out the blocks well in the second half. Good footwork from Watkins and Corbit in the mid-field unleashed Gordon on the flank who found a direct pass to Jordan Brown who after contact from the MK Irish defenders went down in the box, calls for a penalty were waived away by the referee who instead brandished Brown with a yellow card for simulation.

It was MK Irish with a chance once more on the hour mark, George Shrieves causing more problems cutting in from the wing and getting a shot off. However, it was blocked well by McGregor as Corbit cleared the ball mitigating any further danger.

15 minutes later and Bedford finally broke the deadlock. Great interplay

between Lee Watkins and substitute Josh Setchell gave Claston Gordon room on the wing, his perfect cross found the head of Joey Evans who guided it in off the far post and over the whitewash. McMullen Park subsequently erupted as Bedford gave themselves a lead with just over 10 minutes to go.

The final few moments were not without tension. MK Irish continued to knock on the door with more chances for Ward and Shrieves who were the biggest threats throughout the game, but ferocious defending from The Pirates meant that the home team walked away with all three points.

COCKFOSTERS MATCH

The Pirates share the points in a 1-1 draw on the road against Cockfosters.

A frustrating 90 minutes saw Rob Sinclair's men leave North London with a draw after having claims for a penalty waved away in the final minutes.

Real Bedford were back on the road this weekend in a tough battle against Cockfosters, who finished 5th in last season's campaign and from the off, both sides created chances, with initial chances falling to Ben Stevens and Mo Ahmed in the opening ten minutes for The Pirates.

Cockfosters created the first clear-cut chance. A defensive mistake opened up the defence, but Tyler McGregor continued his impressive start to the season, saving well at his near post.

The away side would take the lead with a goal from Joey Evans made

by Josh Setchell, the winger following up his equaliser at FC Clacton on Tuesday with an assist. Running clear down the right, Setchell's cross found the head of Evans, who nodded it home to make it two goals in two consecutive league games for Real Bedford's summer signing.

However, it wasn't long before Cockfosters level. The referee awarded the home side a penalty after an untimely challenge from Bedford defender Tom Wood on Cockfosters' George Sippetts. Captain Matty Thomson stepped up and converted from the spot, bringing Cockfosters back into the game.

The rest of the half was relatively stagnant, with Real gradually taking control of possession without creating clear-cut chances while Cockfosters pushed hard on the break.

Second Half

The second half began similarly. Real continued to play the ball around the pitch, while Cockfosters would counterattack hard when back in possession.

Ben Stevens had the opportunity to put the visitors ahead after Real broke free down the wing, but his shot tantalisingly hit the post. Bedford kept knocking, and Charlie Smith's corner floated into Curtis Hartley before being cleared off the line by a tightly-packed Cockfosters backline.

The home side then saw their fair share of chances go begging after a shot from George Lutaaya was saved well by McGregor; this was followed by a one-on-one opportunity for George Sippetts, who failed to get a shot away with Tom Wood tracking back and robbed him of possession.

Cockfosters had another chance to take the lead following another mistake at the back, but again, Bedford's number one saved well to keep the game level.

The best chance of the second half was the most controversial. Winger Mo Ahmed raced into space on the left flank, driving the ball from past the halfway line into the box before being brought down recklessly by Aiden Read for what looked like a stonewall penalty. However, the referee waved the claims away, frustrating Real Bedford players and travelling fans.

Following the demise of Clacton Town, FC Clacton was formed in June 2007. After a lot of hard work behind the scenes the Club was granted the FA Charter Standard Community Club Award in May 2012, the highest FA kitemark for Clubs.

The Club entered its first season playing in the Ridgeons League First Division with former Fulham and Colchester player John Reeves at the helm, assisted by David Coyle.

The 2008/09 season, with Coyle in sole charge, saw the start of a successful period for the Club. We progressed to the Fourth Round of the FA Vase (equalling the Club record of Clacton Town) and a seventh-place finish in the League gave optimism for the future.

The following season saw promotion back to the Premier Division, finishing runners up to Great Yarmouth Town. In the process we scored 117 League goals and won the First Division Knockout Cup, beating Halstead Town in the final at Hadleigh.

During the 2010 close season Coyle stepped down due to work commitments and was

replaced by former Wivenhoe Town manager Steve Pitt. Pitt brought in his own players and there was a very different look to FC Clacton by the start of the season. Pitt's side finished 16th and Pitt left to take the reins at Stanway Rovers.

Former Colchester United Youth team player Andy Taylor was appointed manager and another upheaval of players saw us finish in 15th place in his first season. Taylor left early in the 2012/13 season and was replaced by Ray Turner. Turner's team struggled, winning just four games and, unsurprisingly, finished bottom of the table, only avoiding relegation due to an FA reprieve.

2013/14 saw the club thrust into the national TV spotlight when BT Sport adopted FC Clacton as their non-league team of the competition following us through to the 2nd qualifying round. Turner left the club in December 2013 and was replaced by Phil Yearling but he in turn only lasted four matches before he was dismissed. Glenn Eldridge was promoted from the U18s to take over as caretaker manager and he steered us to a 15th place finish and was rewarded by getting the job full time. In October 2014 Eldridge was sacked



following a run of poor results and David Coyle was brought back to the club. Sixteen points from the final seven games saw us comfortably avoid relegation. Coyle assembled arguably the strongest squad the club had seen for the 15/16 season and we secured our highest placed finish since the club was formed, eventually achieving a top half finish.

Coyle resigned at the end of the season and was replaced by Tom Gooder. However this proved to be a disastrous appointment and he was sacked after a run of eight consecutive defeats at the start of the 16/17 season. Kieron Shelley was then appointed manager. We finished in a relegation position but were again reprieved following a restructuring of the Leagues.

In 2017/18 Tom Austin was appointed to replace Shelley. After securing safety when relegation seemed inevitable, he then guided us to a top six finish in 2018/19, our best-ever as FC Clacton.

Former Brightlingsea Regent Head Coach Ryan Salter joined the club to work alongside Austin for the 2019/20 season. We reached the Third Round Proper of the FA Vase, and were on course to achieve another top half finish in the Thurlow Nunn

Premier Division before the season was prematurely curtailed.

After a good start to the 2020/21 season, Austin & Salter moved on to take the reins at Brightlingsea Regent in October and the club moved quickly to appoint ex-Chelsea player Mark Nicholls as our new First Team Manager.

After the season was again curtailed in 20/21, the club was moved laterally to the Essex Senior League in May. Nicholls stepped down from his role as Manager in October following a 2-1 win at Southend Manor, and David Collis was appointed as our new head coach, his time in charge ending after a 2-1 win at White Ensign the following month. Tom Austin and Ryan Salter returned to the club for a second spell in charge in November. After a strong end to the season, the club finished in seventh position.

Last season saw the club enjoy its most successful campaign in nearly 50 years, securing a top four league finish and reaching the final of the Peter Butcher Memorial Trophy, where we narrowly lost out to Redbridge.
