#### **CHAIRMAN'S NOTES**





# LATE MISSED PENALTY LEAVES REAL BEDFORD FRUSTRATED IN 0-0 DRAW

LEDGER STADIUM SOUTHERN LEAGUE • 12TH NOVEMBER 2024





On a cold Tuesday evening, Real Bedford hosted Leighton Town in a goalless draw. Both sides worked hard but found clear-cut chances hard to come by as Leighton's tight defence matched The Pirates all out attack. Bedford had a golden opportunity to snatch victory with a penalty in stoppage time, but the chance went unconverted.

The game began cautiously, with both teams working to understand each other's tactics and maintain defensive solidity. In the early exchanges, neither side managed to establish dominance, resulting in a calm opening.

Leighton's first real opportunity came in the 20th minute when Goss broke through Bedford's back line and fired a shot, only to see it blocked well. Bedford had their first meaningful chance in the 34th minute, with Ben Stevens whipping in a cross to Jack Morrell, whose volley flew just over the bar.

Just before halftime, a mix-up between Longden and Morrell gave Goss another opportunity, but he blasted his shot well over, offering Bedford a let-off. The half closed at 0-0, with neither team able to capitalise on the few chances created.

#### Second Half

Both teams emerged with more intensity but still found it challenging to carve out a decisive breakthrough. Bedford had a promising play down the right in the 58th minute as Stevens, Setchell, and S. Ward combined. Stevens unleashed a shot, but Hunt in the Leighton goal made a brilliant save, keeping the game level.

Leighton continued to press forward, and in the 62nd minute, Goss slid a pass through to King. The Bedford defence was quick to respond, clearing the threat effectively. In the 80th minute, a scramble in Leighton's box saw Stevens attempt several shots, all of which were blocked before his final effort rolled just wide.

Leighton posed a late threat as Cerqueira skilfully bypassed Longden, but S. Ward was on hand with a crucial diving block to put the ball out for a corner, preserving Bedford's clean sheet. The drama peaked in stoppage time when Bedford were awarded a penalty after Archie Jones was brought down by Pyman. Hitchcock stepped up to the spot in the 90+3 minute but was denied by Hunt, who saved comfortably. Bedford had one last opportunity in the 90+5 minute when a Stevens cross found Jones, whose mis-timed shot resulted in another easy save for Hunt.

Despite Real Bedford's determined efforts to find a late breakthrough, they were left frustrated, with the match ending 0-0

## Football Academy Noah: Transforming Lives Through the Power of Football

In 2016, tragedy struck Johan Mortier & his family when his 16-year-old son, Noah, was tragically killed in a fatal accident while cycling. Before his untimely passing, Noah had expressed a desire to help the most impoverished areas of South Africa. Inspired by this heartfelt wish, Johan launched Football Academy Noah (FAN) in honour of his son. FAN's mission is simple yet profound: to provide underprivileged children with football equipment, coaching, food, and, most importantly, a sense of purpose. Moved by Noah's story and with Jamie Carter having recently become a father, he immediately offered his support.

Since its inception, FAN has made extraordinary progress. Together with colleagues at Belron International, Jamie has helped raise nearly €70,000 through various fundraising initiatives, including an annual 12-hour, 5-a-side football marathon at his workplace, complete with a BBQ and raffle. Jamie plays the entire 12 hours, and every penny raised goes directly to FAN. Last month, Jamie had the privilege of visiting Mtubatuba in KwaZulu-Natal, South Africa, to witness firsthand the remarkable work being done. The experience was life-changing. Despite having so little, the children radiated joy and positivity, which made leaving them even more heartbreaking.





FAN now works in over 60 schools, supporting more than 7,000 children by providing food, clothing, equipment, and coaching. During the COVID-19 pandemic, the charity distributed food boxes, saving countless lives in the region. On Jamies visit, it was clear that the impact of FAN goes far beyond the children. The gratitude from parents, teachers, community leaders, and even the even the sports commission of Mtubatuba was overwhelming, underscoring how much this programme means to the entire community.



To date, FAN's focus has been on primary schools, but the programme is expanding into secondary schools. FAN's next step is crucial because it allows them to support older children during a pivotal stage of their lives, steering them away from the potential pitfalls of crime and providing them with opportunities to pursue education, sport, and brighter futures.

The programme has already achieved incredible milestones. Two boys have signed contracts with Amazulu Durban, a South African Premier League team, and one girl has joined a national team development squad. Jamie watched these children play on makeshift farm pitches while avoiding roaming goats, it's clear that their raw talent, determination, and potential are extraordinary. FAN is not only transforming lives but also uncovering future stars.

For Jamie, FAN represents everything he's passionate about: making a tangible difference in children's lives, honouring Noah's memory, and showcasing the power of football as a force for good. At the same time, he's equally passionate about Real Bedford and the ambition of the club to put the town on the map. Jamie shared stories about Real Bedford with his colleagues, in South Africa, and across Europe. The vision of Bedford one day having a team in the football league inspires him, and he believes FAN and Real Bedford share a common goal—to change lives and unite people through the beautiful game.

As well as Jamie, all of us at Real Bedford support FAN in changing the lives of those who are not as fortunate, through the power of football, to create a better future for all.

We will continue our partnership with FAN and plan to run future fundraising events in partnership.

# HADLEY

Founded in the 1882/83 season, Hadley Football Club enjoyed a golden era in the late 19th century, including a notable 1-0 win against Tottenham Hotspur, albeit during the club's formative years. Crowds of several hundred would gather on Hadley Common to watch games. However, with the rise of Barnet FC, many players migrated to the rival team, leading to a decline in Hadley's prominence by the early 20th century. Despite challenges, the club experienced a resurgence post-World War II, joining the Barnet and District League and later playing at Wrotham Park before moving to Barnet Playing Fields in 1955.

The club's first major success came in the 1975/76 and 1976/77 seasons, winning the Mid Herts League Premier Division and the Premier Division Shield. After moving to various grounds, including St. Albans Road and Chandos Avenue, Hadley joined the Herts Senior County League, winning Division Three in their first attempt. By the mid-1980s, they transitioned to the Southern Olympian League and played at the Woodside Park Club, Totteridge, before eventually settling at Brickfield Lane, Arkley, in 1992.

Hadley re-joined the Herts Senior County League in 1999 and achieved significant success under manager lan Gray, winning the Division One championship in 2001/02 and the Premier Division in 2003/04. The 2004/05 season brought further triumphs with consecutive league titles and the prestigious Aubrey Cup. Despite setbacks, including a blocked application to join the Spartan South Midlands League, Hadley regrouped and saw all three teams win their respective leagues in the 2007/08 season.

The club's entry into the Spartan South Midlands League in 2008/09 marked a turning point, with promotion to Division One and a Division Two Cup victory. Further success followed in 2009/10 with promotion to the Premier Division and strong perfor-

-mances in national competitions like the FA Vase. By 2010/11, the club was competing at Step 5 of the National League System, and their first FA Cup appearance added to their growing reputation.

The 2012/13 season saw Hadley secure their first FA Cup win, a 2-0 victory over Hertford Town, and reach the Premier Division Cup final. Despite management changes, the club maintained steady progress, highlighted by matches against higher-level teams, including Watford FC in the Herts Senior Cup. In 2015/16, Hadley celebrated its highest-ever league finish and claimed the Herts Charity Shield with a victory over Tring Athletic.

In 2017, the club returned to Brickfield Lane after extensive facility improvements funded by grants and donations. This milestone was celebrated with an impressive FA Cup run, reaching the Third Qualifying Round. Under new management, the team continued to thrive, achieving their best-ever league finishes in the Spartan South Midlands League, including third place in 2018/19.

In 2019, Hadley moved laterally to the Essex Senior League as part of the FA's restructuring. Despite the disruption of the COVID-19 pandemic, the club reached the Fifth Round of the FA Vase for the first time. A return to the Spartan South Midlands League in 2021 coincided with the club's most successful season, culminating in promotion to Step 4 of the National League System and victory in the Gladwish Challenge Trophy.

Competing in the Southern Football League Division One Central, Hadley achieved back-to-back top-ten finishes, including their first-ever FA Trophy win in 2022/23. With each season, the club continues to build on its remarkable history and looks ahead to the 2024/25 campaign with optimism.

YOU know Christmas is approaching fast when the Step 1 sides enter the Isuzu FA Trophy – and the third round draw has thrown up some tasty ties! Wembley is just five wins away. Just ask Gateshead what that meant last May when, after trading blows with Solihull Moors for 120 minutes, Dajaune Brown fired in the winning penalty in the shoot-out.

Can the Heed get back there again for a third year in a row having lost the previous final to FC Halifax Town? Time will tell but the competition is already producing great storylines. Not least in the second round where some big Step 2 sides crashed out. In total there are three Step 4 sides still standing. Brentwood Town pulled off one of the biggest upsets in round two after travelling to National League North Hereford and emerging victorious.

Benas Vaivada slammed in an 82nd-minute winner for the Isthmian North outfit to secure one of their most famous days. The reward? A home date with Southend United! It promises to be a full house. They're joined by Isthmian South East side Sittingbourne who are writing club history with their run. Ryan Maxwell's side beat Winchester City 5-4 on penalties last weekend and next welcome National League South side Enfield Town.

In their previous guise of Telford United, the Bucks have lifted the Trophy three times. But it was a bad day for AFC Telford United last weekend as they fell to Southern League Division One Central Hadley 1-0. They've been handed a trip to Oxford City as they aim to keep their fairytale run alive. There are intriguing ties in both the north and south sections of the draw.

Step 3 Chertsey Town - who knocked out Bath City last time out - host Dagenham & Redbridge, Hanwell Town welcome Eastleigh and Biggleswade Town's run continues with a home clash against AFC Totton. A real cracker comes in Berkshire where Slough Town face off against local rivals Maidenhead United. The NLP cameras will want to be at that one.

There's a big derby in the north section too with Robbie Savage's Step 3 Macclesfield - fresh from beating Curzon Ashton - off to Altrincham-Stockton Town will be dreaming of an upset at home to Oldham Athletic, while Basford United take on FC Halifax Town. Last year's winners? Gateshead will play Farsley Celtic, while Solihull Moors entertain Radcliffe. Wembley re-match anyone? After last year's drama it wouldn't be a bad thing but there will be plenty of others hoping to have a big say of their own.
