

CHAIRMAN'S NOTES



I'd like to offer a very warm welcome to The Ledger Stadium to the manager, staff, players, committee, and fans of Stotfold. They're a club we know well and respect greatly. When we acquired Real Bedford, it was Stotfold who were setting the standard—top of the league and flying under Brett Donnelly's guidance. They went on to achieved back-to-back promotions and have settled into a brilliant new stadium setup. Their rapid growth has been a clear marker of what's possible with vision and ambition, and they've been a real inspiration as we continue to build our own club.

For us it's been another busy month off the pitch. We've finally completed and opened Real Coffee, our new coffee shop in the heart of Bedford town centre. This project began back in May and has been a massive challenge from start to finish. It's more than just a café—it's a physical hub for the club and a vital new revenue stream. I want to say a huge thank you to everyone who helped make this happen: PJH for the amazing fit-out, Sallie Chater for her stunning interior design work, Grace and Jason for getting us up and running, Conor for his support, and all of the brilliant new staff behind the counter. And of course, a massive thanks to those of you who have already popped in for a drink—your support has given us a great start, but we've got work to do to keep building it. I hope to see more of you there soon.

Opening the coffee shop has also opened my eyes more than ever to the sad decline of our town centre. I've seen, firsthand, the rise in anti-social behaviour—open drug use, shoplifting, aggressive begging, alcoholics flouting PSPOs, and a general feeling of fear and abandonment. Pinewood House is like something out of a dystopian nightmare. I've spoken to locals who now avoid town altogether and shopkeepers who are being battered daily by theft and vandalism. Combine this with the crushing weight of failed government policy and you have a town centre that feels on the brink—but not beyond saving.

The root causes are deep: economic mismanagement and failure to manage addiction, crime and the changing mode of a town centre. This failure sits squarely with government and policing.

We're suffering from policies that strangle business and an attitude of suicidal empathy that enables anti-social behaviour to flourish. There's a complete lack of courage and creative thinking. But I'm not prepared to accept this decline. This is my town. I've written publicly: if the police and council won't fix it, I will. No more empty platitudes—I want action. I'm working on a manifesto for Bedford, and I'll be asking for your support when the time comes to implement it.

Next month, we welcome back CheatCode to Bedford—a weekend where our town becomes the centre of the Bitcoin universe. We're proud to be hosting former Prime Minister Liz Truss and my Real Bedford co-owners, the Winklevoss twins, who'll both be speaking at the conference. As ever, football will take centre stage that weekend too, with both our men's and women's teams playing—and there's a real possibility that one or both sides could be crowned champions.

The buzz around that weekend is building, and we can't wait. Speaking of which, I want to congratulate our incredible managers, their staff, and the players. You've all been magnificent again. On the women's side, a special shoutout for their emphatic 5-0 win over Luton in the County Cup Final—an absolute statement.

Despite the challenges we face as a town, this season has been full of real progress and positivity. I'm more excited than ever for the future. And as always, none of this would be possible without you—the fans. Your continued support keeps this club pushing forward.



FIVE-STAR HOME PERFORMANCE AS THE PIRATES MAINTAIN THE LEAD AT THE TOP

Real Bedford stayed three points clear of Berkhamsted with a dominant 5-0 home victory against Northwood FC. Josh Setchell, Archie Jones, and Joey Evans scored the goals for the Pirates to secure a seventh consecutive league victory.

Bedford Mayor, Tom Wooton, and Bedfordshireborn singer Tom Grennan attended the game at the Ledger Stadium, and they witnessed a lightning start from the hosts. With only a minute on the clock, Setchell received the ball from Ben Stevens and slotted past Aymen Azaze.

The chances kept on coming for Rob Sinclair's side in the opening 15 minutes, with Isaac Galliford and Jones both narrowly missing the target.

Northwood did provide a threat going the other way, though, and in the 18th minute, Nnaemeka Anyanwu saw his shot go across the face of the goal. The Pirates extended their lead in an end-to-end first half two minutes later through Jones. A deflected cross found the number 14 at the near post who tapped it home.

The goalmouth action didn't stop there. Three minutes later, Jones turned creator and was fouled in the box by Jayden Ashbourne. Evans took the resulting penalty – sending the goalkeeper the wrong way to add a third.

Sinclair's side pressed relentlessly for the rest of the first half, controlling all aspects of the game coming close to the fourth through Drew Richardson and Stevens.

Jones, who impressed throughout the afternoon, put the game beyond the visitors in the 35th minute, heading home his rebounded shot which had originally hit the woodwork.

Second Half

The Pirates' pressure didn't ease in the second half, with Setchell making it five in the 52nd minute. After some neat footwork around the box, the dynamic number seven fired past Azaze.

There were chances to extend the lead – most notably, Evans was denied from close range by an impressive Azaze save.

Northwood had a late chance through Sam Folarin to get on the scoresheet, but his effort hit the side netting, meaning the Pirates walked away with three points and a clean sheet.

After the match, Sinclair said:

"We were brilliant first half, the game was over. A really pleasing performance – our attacking play was at a really good level. The energy and the intensity we pressed at off the ball was pleasing. Second half was complete control, and we saw the game out."

Stotfold is a small country town in Bedfordshire with a population of around 9,000, situated near the North Hertfordshire border. Football in the town dates back to at least 1904, with early teams competing in the Biggleswade and District League, followed by nearly three decades in North Herts Football. Stotfold FC was officially founded in 1946 after World War II and joined the South Midlands League in 1951. Their first ground was the Hitchin Road Recreation Ground before moving to Roker Park in 1965, where they remained for 54 years. The club achieved steady progress, including a league championship in 1980.

The late 1990s and early 2000s were marked by success and challenges. Under Phil Pateman's management, the club won several trophies, including the Beds Senior and Premier Cups and the UCL League Cup. Despite a difficult period in 2006/07, the team turned their fortunes around with lan Allison and Ian Donnelly at the helm. Their efforts led to the most successful season in the club's history in 2007, with both the first and second teams winning their respective league and cup competitions, a feat still unmatched.

The 2010s brought significant restructuring and challenges. Stotfold moved back to the Spartan South Midlands League in 2010/11 and faced relegation battles in several seasons, requiring managerial changes and internal promotions. By the mid-2010s, plans were drawn up to sell Roker Park and build a new stadium in exchange for housing development. The club merged senior and junior teams to form an inclusive programme with over 60 teams and-

-700 participants, marking a turning point for the club's infrastructure and community focus.

The 2020s started with a landmark move to the new Roker Park JSJ Stadium, a £2M facility opened in February 2020. On the pitch, the club celebrated success with promotion runs and cup wins, including the Beds Senior Trophy in 2020. Off the pitch, long-time chairman Phil Pateman stepped down after two decades, with Rob Parkin taking over the role. Under Brett and Paul Donnelly, the first team achieved unprecedented success, including back-to-back promotions to Step 4 in the Southern League Central Division 1.

The club continued to grow in strength with achievements across all teams. The first team finished a commendable 7th in their debut Step 4 season in 2023/24, while the Development team gained promotion to Spartan South Midlands Division 1, and the Women's team secured third place in their Premier Division debut. Despite managerial changes at the end of the season, the club recognised the contributions of Brett and Eddie, who moved on to new roles at Hitchin Town.

The 2024/25 season marks a new chapter with Paul Donnelly, Callum Donnelly, and Ryan Frater leading the first team. The Development and Women's teams retain their management, while the U18 side has been discontinued to ease pitch demands. With strong foundations and ongoing success on and off the field, Stotfold FC continues to grow as a community-focused club with ambitions for the future.
