And this current squad? Just incredible. Only two league defeats all year. Some of the football and goals have been genuinely breathtaking. Rob's the mastermind — I'm just the guy who talks a lot.


There's so much more I could say, but today is about one thing: finishing the job. Let's close this title out, then go and celebrate like Pirates should.

SEVEN HEAVEN FOR THE PIRATES IN BEACONSFIELD DEMOLITION

Real Bedford moved nine points clear at the top of the Southern League Division One Central table, beating Beaconsfield Town 7-1 at the Ledger Stadium. Joey Evans grabbed four goals for the Pirates, while Drew Richardson, Ben Stevens and Jack Snelus also got on the scoresheet.

Rob Sinclair's side dominated the early proceedings, with Evans coming close to opening the scoring after only four minutes – hitting the post from close range after receiving a Stevens cross.

The Pirates were ahead in the 16th minute when captain Lee Watkins saw his effort from 20 yards out parried to Evans, who was there to tap the ball home.

Chances kept on coming after the opener, with Stevens and Evans both coming close to doubling the lead. Evans scored his second of the afternoon in the 26th minute, scoring the rebound from inside the box after Archie Jones' left-footed strike had initially struck the post.

Five minutes later, the lead became three. An Isaac Galliford corner was flicked on by Richardson, and after a mix-up between the Beaconsfield goalkeeper and his defenders.

Stevens then added a fourth in the 34th minute, receiving the ball from the left wing and calmly slotting a first-time effort into the bottom corner.

The Pirates had further chances to extend the lead but went in at the break with a four-goal lead after some scintillating attacking play

Second Half

The pressure didn't relent in the second half, with Evans and Richardson both going close to adding a fifth in the first few minutes after the break. Evans completed his hat-trick in the 49th minute, receiving the ball from Jones after a fantastic passing move that started from Shaheim Ward deep in the defensive half.

Further chances came for Richardson, Jones and Evans, as the Pirates continued to apply relentless pressure on the visitors. The number nine grabbed his fourth in the 58th minute, this time receiving a perfectly weighted through ball from Stevens, before easily tucking the ball past the goalkeeper.

It was a tough afternoon for the visitors, but they scored a consolation in the 66th minute as Josh Marcon's corner was met by Manuchim Oke-William at the backpost.

The Pirates had the last laugh, though. In the 88th minute, two substitutes combined, with Tom Hitchcock heading the ball past the goalkeeper and cutting it back to Snelus, who fired home from the six-yard box to score his first since returning from a long-term injury.

After the game, Sinclair said:

"In terms of their press, they are aggressive with it. We obviously spoke about that, they did it in the game at their place as well. We wanted to miss the initial press, which we did superbly well. So, yeah that was a big part of what we wanted to do, and the boys did that today."

Real Bedford moved 11 points clear at the top of the Southern League Division One Central table, beating Aylesbury United 4-1. Archie Jones, Joey Evans, and Ben Stevens scored the goals for the Pirates.

The Pirates started well, with Stevens coming close to opening the scoring after only five minutes when his lofted effort dropped just wide of the left post. Eight minutes later, Evans' through ball deflected to Jones, who tucked the ball past Jack Hopwood to put the Pirates in a deserved lead.

Chances kept on coming with Stevens dragging a left-footed shot from the edge of the box just wide and also striking the crossbar from a tight angle after receiving the ball from Josh Setchell.

The hosts settled into the game midway through the first half and tested Tyler McGregor in the 39th minute when Ben Kakembo's long-range effort was saved by the Pirates' number one.

Evans put any hopes of an Aylesbury comeback to bed with a quickfire double before the break. In the 42nd minute, Setchell took on multiple defenders before firing a low shot, which was only partially saved by Hopwood, leaving space for the Pirates' number nine to tap in from close range.

Two minutes later, Evans scored his second of the afternoon. This time, he chested home Isaac Galliford's corner, grabbing his 33rd league goal of the campaign.

Second Half

The second half continued to see the Pirates dominate and force Aylesbury deep into their own half. Jones struck a half-volley just wide two minutes after the interval, but Stevens got on the scoresheet in the 55th minute. His perfectly placed free-kick from just outside the box found the bottom left corner to extend the advantage to four. Tom Hitchcock, who came on in the 69th minute, nearly made an instant impact, forcing Hopwood to make an important save and volleying wide from close range.

Aylesbury got on the scoresheet in the 81st minute, denying the Pirates a well-deserved clean sheet. A free-kick from the corner of the box was swung in by Luqman Kassim and deflected off Hitchcock's head into the top corner.

Unfortunately, Jack Snelus was forced off in the late stages of the game due to an injury, meaning the Pirates had to play the last few minutes with ten men.

After the win at Aylesbury, Sinclair said:

"Really good performance again - first half we completely dominated, took our goals well and then the second half becomes a non-event really, the game was over.

Really happy with the performance, the intensity, and the energy levels that the boys played at was superb and we got our rewards."

(On the match against Kings Langley next Saturday) - "It's a big day for Pete and the football club in terms of the event that he puts on. We're expecting a big crowd, and we'll prepare properly on Tuesday and Thursday."
