CHAIRMAN'S NOTES



Good afternoon and welcome to The Ledger Stadium for our final home game of the season. I'd like to extend a warm welcome to the manager, players, committee, and supporters of Dunstable Town.

Well... we did it. Real Bedford are champions. Our third successive league title. And if that wasn't enough, our women's team secured back-to-back titles too. What a season. What an achievement.

When I bought this club, I laid out a vision – six promotions in ten years, a journey to league football. People laughed, and I don't blame them. It's a big ask. But here we are, three years in, three promotions won. Halfway there with seven years to go. Of course, every step forward now gets harder. We'll be facing other ambitious clubs, with serious infrastructure, rich histories, and strong budgets. But we're confident in our ability to keep challenging for titles.

Last weekend was something truly special. Not only did we seal the title at home, but we had a record crowd of nearly 1,500 people and the timing couldn't have been better – our investors were in town to witness it all. It was an unforgettable day. Huge thanks to everyone who made it happen – especially Emma, Neil and Conor – who each played massive roles in delivering a seamless, professional event for all.

Our investors continue to back this project. In our recent board meeting, we discussed the long-term future of the club, particularly our stadium needs. As a result, we've greenlit a feasibility study into developing a new longterm home for Real Bedford. This club has outgrown its past – and we need to build for our future.

Of course, none of this would be possible without the leadership of Rob, his coaching team, and the incredible group of players who gave everything this season. A massive thank you and congratulations to all of them. There were so many standout moments, but one game sums up this team's spirit: Flackwell Heath at home. We were 5-3 down, 10 minutes left, down to 10 men - and we still clawed it back. Joey stepped up to slot home a last-minute penalty and secured a vital point. That's the heart of this team.

Let's put Rob's achievement into perspective: three consecutive promotions. This has only been done three times in the entire history of British football - and never four.

I'm not talking about Premier League titles, which are often won by squads with the same core year after year. This is different. Every season at this level demands a rebuild – new players, new challenges, a step up. To keep delivering titles under those circumstances is remarkable. We want the record. We want to be the first team in British football history to win four promotions in a row.

This season has also been huge off the pitch. Our infrastructure has taken massive strides forward. Neil has done a brilliant job completing our ground grading. Emma has nailed every aspect of matchday operations, and Conor has managed an ever-growing merchandising operation. These things might seem small, but they're vital. I'm also hugely proud of our new club shop and café, Real Coffee, in the centre of Bedford. I'm actually writing this right now, sat in the shop, drinking the best coffee in Bedford (no bias, obviously).

Even though we've secured the title, the players are still going all-out to finish the season on a high. If we win today, we break 100 points. We could end the season on 104 points and a +100 goal difference. We're now 13 points clear of second. Let's call it what it is - total domination. People often talk about our budget, but they don't know it - they just assume. What's amazing is that for the majority of this season, only three of the starting eleven were new signings. That means eight of our starters were with us last year. That's down to Rob - his eye for talent, his understanding of culture, and his ability to get the very best from his squad.

So, yes, we'll celebrate. But we're already thinking about next season – making sure we've got everything in place to compete and challenge again.

Lastly, to all of you – whether you're a local supporter coming to games, or one of our international fans following the streams and buying merch – thank you. You are a part of this. You're helping us build something truly special here.


Enjoy the trophy presentation today, enjoy the summer break, and we'll see you back in June for pre-season. Up the Pirates,

THE PIRATES WIN THIRD CONSECUTIVE LEAGUE TITLE IN FRONT OF WINKLEVOSS TWINS

Real Bedford secured the Southern League Division One Central title, beating Kings Langley 1-0 at the Ledger Stadium. Joey Evans' first-half penalty was enough to secure a third title in a row for the Pirates in front of a record crowd of 1,426.

Co-owners Cameron and Tyler Winklevoss made their first appearance at The Ledger Stadium, congratulating Rob Sinclair and his side on the pitch after the game following another title-winning campaign.

The Pirates struggled to create chances in the first half. Evans had the first meaningful opportunity, lofting the ball just wide of the post from the corner of the box after 30 minutes.

Five minutes later, the visitors came close to opening the scoring when a misjudged backpass found Edu Toiny Pendred, but he shot into the side netting.

After struggling to break down Kings Langley, the Pirates were awarded a penalty just before half-time after Archie Jones was tripped in the box. Evans stepped up and slotted the ball into the bottom left corner - his 34th league goal of the season.

Second Half

Sinclair's side improved after the interval, with Isaac Galliford and Drew Richardson both seeing their efforts narrowly miss the target.

Josh Setchell nearly put an end to the game, wriggling past a couple of defenders and striking the post from the corner of the box in the 74th minute.

With the clock ticking down, the tension was high in Bedford, but the Pirates continued to pepper Josh Bowler's goal. The Kings Langley shot-stopper denied Jones with an impressive one-handed save in the 89th minute, but Evans' first-half penalty was enough to secure a third consecutive league title.

After the match, Chairman Peter McCormack said:

"I love the town of Bedford. I want Bedford to win. There are so many good things happening right now – we have got the football here, the Universal project, so many good little businesses. There are good people in Bedford.

"We have the chance to be the fastest-growing town in the country. We've got so much opportunity. I just feel really happy for the people in Bedford, there is so much to be excited about."

LATE GOALS SECURE IMPRESSIVE AWAY WIN AT LEIGHTON TOWN

Real Bedford moved closer to securing 100 points in the league, winning 4-1 away at Leighton Town. Drew Richardson, Joey Evans, Ben Stevens and Archie Jones scored the goals for the Pirates in front of a 756 crowd at the Freed Veneers Community Stadium.

Before the game, the Pirates were given a guard of honour by the hosts after wrapping up the league title last weekend. The Pirates dominated the early stages, with Stevens and Tom Hitchcock both seeing their efforts narrowly miss the target after some intricate passing play.

Hitchcock, who played 90 minutes for the first time since the Bedfordshire Senior Challenge Cup semifinal against AFC Dunstable, was lively throughout and saw his header cleared off the line from a corner in the 27th minute.

Rob Sinclair's side were rewarded for their dominance two minutes later when Richardson won the ball back in midfield and rifled a perfectly placed right-footed effort into the top corner from 20 yards. The hosts responded immediately, with Kyal Williams driving through the midfield and threading the ball to Godlove Oppong, who tapped home from close range in the 31st minute.

Both teams had chances to go ahead before the break, including Evans, who chested the ball straight at the goalkeeper from point-blank range after a floated cross from Stevens from the right wing.

There was 10 minutes of added time due to a head injury to Lee Cooksey. We wish him a speedy recovery.

Second Half

The second half was a scrappy affair, with Leighton causing the Pirates problems, particularly through Lynton Goss.

Stevens thought he had made it 2-1 in the 63rd minute, placing his free-kick from just outside of the box perfectly into the top corner. The goal was disallowed though due to a foul by Hitchcock in the box.

Fabio Silvestri, who replaced Cooksey in the firsthalf, came closest to putting the hosts in the lead when he hit the post with a right-footed effort in the 72nd minute

With the game finely poised, Evans put the Pirates ahead in the 76th minute in bizarre fashion. George Rose's clearance hit the number nine's back and dribbled into the back of the net for his 35th league goal of the season.

After his first free-kick was disallowed, Stevens ensured that he wasn't denied twice. In the 82nd minute, in an almost identical position, he sent the goalkeeper the wrong way and slotted the ball into the bottom corner to put the game beyond the hosts.

There was time for one more in the 87th minute, with Hitchcock lifting a perfectly weighted ball to Jones at the backpost, who smashed home from close range.

The victory puts the Pirates 13 points clear at the top of the Southern League Division One Central table, needing two points from the last two matches to become centurions.

After the match. Sinclair said:

"Getting to 100 points is the goal and the motivation now. When you win leagues before the end of the season, sometimes it can fizzle out, but you look at the boys today, they didn't let that happen. That's the target to try and get to that 100-point mark."

CROWN dependencies offshore football clubs have become part and parcel of the Non-League Pyramid in recent years with Guernsey, Jersey Bulls and FC Isle of Man all valued members of our National League System.

But I wondered what the arrangements entail for opposition teams flying across to play on these islands, so I joined the official Southall party heading to Guernsey for their Isthmian South Central, fixture last Sunday to find out more.

The build-up saw Guernsey sending travel details to their opponents. In effect, the host club covers the cost of return flights for a group of up to 25 people from Southall plus coach transport to and from Guernsey Airport. This forms part of Guernsey's agreement to compete in mainland competitions.

Here is my diary of how the mammoth matchday experience unfolded...

7.00am - Meet up deadline at Gatwick Airport South Terminal. The Southall players arrive on time smartly dressed in club tracksuit toos.

7.15am - Southall's enthusiastic chairman Sanjeev Sharma does a final headcount to make sure everyone is present. He grins: "I'm feel like I am the players' dad looking after them all!"

8.00am - We are through security and on to the plane. I am sitting next to Southall manager Max Howell. He admirably video calls his young children prior to take-off.

8.35am - The Aurigny Airline flight to Guernsey departs on schedule. It's a one-hour journey spanning 160 miles. Also on board are the three match officials for this afternoon's game. Not surprisingly, they respectfully keep their distance.

8.50am - There is escalating merriment amongst the Southall squad because midfielder Chris Mulindwa has fallen asleep with his mouth wide open. So, his crafty teammates rest a coffee stirrer on his lower lip. I take a photo to capture the moment for posterity.

9.00am - Max explains his deep-thinking managerial philosophy to me. "My players are chess pieces that I move around the pitch," he says, reflecting on his nine years at Southall as a player, then coach and now manager.

9.35am – We touch down in Guernsey and the local coach appears outside the tiny airport. Our driver is a dead ringer for TV personality Bill Oddie. Much to my amazement, he negotiates the narrow island roads by frequently mounting pavements to pass oncoming cars. This time, I am sat alongside chairman Sanjeev. He describes his burning desire to find his beloved club a permanent stadium in Southall, It will end 33 years of nomadic groundsharing following the loss of their spiritual home at Western Road. They are currently based out of the area at Burnham but will switch to Hayes & Yeading next season.

10.00am - We stop off at a very nice hotel where Southall booked pre-match breakfast. It is good to see the players choosing healthy options from the buffet spread although some of us older guys readily tuck into fried eggs and black pudding! 12noon - The coach is ready to take us to the game.

12.30pm - We pull up at Guernsey's newly unveiled £10 million Victoria Park Stadium which is staging only its second fixture. The Southall party are warmly greeted by Guernsey directors John Loveless and Nic Lega.

12.35pm - I take a peek at the facilities consisting of two excellent grandstands on either side (offering 700 seats combined) and covered terracing behind both goals. I am thoroughly impressed by the 3,000 capacity venue. It is easily up to National League South grading criteria. The Guernsey Football Association offices are here too.

1.00pm - Several of the Southall players don't have football boots compatible with requirements specified by Victoria Park's artificial pitch manufacturer. However, Guernsey are able to loan replacement boots.

1.10pm - I approach Southall director Stephen Harrison for an indepth chat. His family possess a long association with the club and Stephen outlines how he decided to become a co-owner. In addition, I spot a couple of loyal Southall supporters visiting Guernsey for the weekend.

2.00pm - Klok-off in our Isthmian League South Central Division encounter. Guernsey have the wind behind them and dominate pulsating first half exchanges without scoring. Into the second period, Southall muster a great 20 minutes peppering the home goalmouth. All of a sudden, Guernsey break away and Sam Murray decisively shoots into the net. Two minutes later, Southall are reduced to ten men (Ryan Hope red card) thereby affecting their chances of gaining a positive result.

3.50pm - Final score...Guernsey 1 Southall O, attendance 891. A vital three points for the 'Green Llons' in battling against relegation, 4.20pm - Guernsey serve a delicious sit-down meal of Thal green curry to the Southall party in a reserved section of the plush clubhouse. Yet the West London players are visibly disappointed by the match outcome and eat in near silence.

5pm - The coach returns to take us to the airport ahead of our 6.10pm flight.

7.10pm - After the Southall contingent waited patiently in Departures throughout an unexpected one-hour delay, we embark on our plane back to London. I'm seated again beside manager Max who is considerably deflated by this defeat. He gives me a fascinating blow by blow analysis of the match I've just watched. I tell him that he can take plenty of positives from his team's performance.

8.15pm: We land at Gatwick Airport to conclude our lengthy day out. There are handshakes all around as the exhausted Southall party go their separate ways freshly anticipating local derbies versus Rayners Lane and Uxbridge over Easter.

Needless to say, I was pretty cream crackered when I eventually arrived home, but the trip will go down as one of my most memorable ever.
