This free resource will help you on your journey to consider the beliefs and practices of the Roman Catholic Church and examine for yourself, through tough questions, whether The Catechism of the Catholic Church is biblically valid and trustworthy.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church is a substantial document of significant history and tradition. If you have yet to read it, I encourage you to read it in its entirety. Similarly, may we evaluate what we see in The Catechism of the Catholic Church in the light of the Bible to "see if these things were so."

Acts 17:11 "Now these Jews were more noble than those in Thessalonica; they received the word with all eagerness, examining the Scriptures daily to see if these things were so." (ESV)

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A 3 Part Approach: Here is the approach you will find to this Bible study.

1) Interesting highlights and quotes - Due to the massive volume of writings in The Catechism of the Catholic Church, I have picked quotes from the text that I think you will find most useful and fascinating.

2) Relevant Scriptures - Likewise, I selected passages of Scripture that I thought particularly helpful in evaluating and understanding the Catholic teachings. Both The Catechism of the Catholic Church and the Bible passages should be considered in their original context and setting. There are many more possible Catholic teachings and Biblical passages to consider but I hope this is a helpful start to your studies.

3) Helpful Questions - I have chosen not to insert opinions and assertions but instead propose tough questions that help us to think critically for ourselves about what we are reading.

My end goal and hope is that we all follow God's directive to us in 2 Corinthians 13:5 to "Examine yourselves, to see whether you are in the faith. Test yourselves. Or do you not realize this about yourselves, that Jesus Christ is in you?—unless indeed you fail to meet the test!" (ESV). May we all have the joy of an eternity in the presence of Jesus!

As we clearly focus on who God is (His names and characteristic) and what He has done (miracles), our enemies and struggles will seem so much smaller. Although God is the Bible's primary focus, He reveals much to us about our chief enemy in Satan. Don't miss out on what God has to tell us about our enemy's names, character, and tactics that we be best prepared to live lives that enjoy and honor our Creator.

2 Corinthians 11:14–15 "And no wonder, for even Satan disguises himself as an angel of light. [15] So it is no surprise if his servants, also, disguise themselves as servants of righteousness. Their end will correspond to their deeds." (ESV)

God's created angels are important in the storyline of history. In Scripture God shares many stories that explain their purposes and abilities. This section will help you to rightly understand the mostly unseen angelic beings, both faithful (angels) and fallen (demons).

Humanity is divided by those who follow Jesus in faith (Christian believers) and those who follow Satan, the world, and their fleshly sin (unbelievers). It is essential to understand the identities of both groups as well as the evidences of their character and works. There is no neutral ground in this battle of the followers of Christ against the spiritual forces of evil. Here are some truths to help us be aware of who we are and rightly see the world around us with a spiritual understanding.

Luke 19:10 "For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost." (ESV)

Matthew 7:21–23 "Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but the one who does the will of my Father who is in heaven. [22] On that day many will say to me, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name, and cast out demons in your name, and do many mighty works in your name?' [23] And then will I declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from me, you workers of lawlessness.'" (ESV)

God speaks clearly to us both about eternal life (Heaven) and eternal death (Hell). He wants believers to look forward to being in His presence in Heaven and also wants unbelievers to be warned of the danger of eternal suffering in Hell. Salvation is God's offer and work through Christ and He has much to tell us in the Scriptures. Here are some truths about Heaven, Hell, and God's work of salvation.



10 Reasons to Pray

- 1. **Encounter God** Pray is a meeting to intentionally and humbly communicate with God.
- 2. **Know God** Listening and speaking to Jesus enables us to know Him more personally.
- 3. **Glorify God** It pleases and honors God when we draw near to Him in prayer.
- 4. **Experience God's Power** Prayers of the righteous are answered powerfully.
- 5. **Understand God's Present Work** God desires to be related to and enjoyed daily.
- 6. Look Forward to God's Future Work Submit and yield your future into His hands.
- 7. **Protect from Satan's Attacks** We remember our real enemy in Satan, his demons, the world, and our flesh and are reminded that prayer is a spiritual weapon of offense and defense.
- 8. **Share True Hope with Others** We evangelistically pray for God's saving work.
- 9. Awareness of His Presence Failing to pray means ignoring His constant presence with us.
- 10. **Obedience** God has commanded and taught us to relate to

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Him through prayer.

Personal Prayer (Matthew 6:5-15, ESV)

Prayer is Personal Conversation

v.5-6 "And when you pray, you must not be like the hypocrites. For they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, that they may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you."

Prayer is Meaningful Conversation

v.7-8 "And when you pray, do not heap up empty phrases as the Gentiles do, for they think that they will be heard for their many words. Do not be like them, for your Father knows what you need before you ask him."

Prayer is God-Focused Conversation

v.9 Pray then like this: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name.

10 Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

11 Give us this day our daily bread,

12 & forgive us our debts (sins), as we also have forgiven our debtors.

13 And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

14-15 For if you forgive others their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you, but if you do not forgive others their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses.

A.C.T.S.

Spend time praying over each of these areas

Adoration (of God) "Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name." (Matthew 6:9 ESV)

Confession (of sins) "and forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors." (Matthew 6:12 ESV)

Thanksgiving (for His work) "Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven." (Matthew 6:10 ESV)

Supplication

(how can you ask God to help you or others) "Give us this day our daily bread" (Matthew 6:11 ESV)

"And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil." (Matthew 6:13 ESV)

3 WAYS TO PREPARE FOR PRAYER

1. Make Your Focus God-ward "And when you pray, you must not be like the hypocrites. For they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, that they may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. [6] But when you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you." (Matthew 6:5-6 ESV)

2. Ask Genuinely and Significantly "And when you pray, do not heap up empty phrases as the Gentiles do, for they think that they will be heard for their many words. [8] Do not be like them, for your Father knows what you need before you ask him." (Matthew 6:7-8 ESV)

3. Sincerely Show Mercy & Grace to Others "For if you forgive others their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you, [15] but if you do not forgive others their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses." (Matthew 6:14-15)

Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord. [15] And the prayer of faith will save the one who is sick, and the Lord will raise him up. And if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven. [16] Therefore, confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person has great power as it is working. [17] Elijah was a man with a nature like ours, and he prayed fervently that it might not rain, and for three years and six months it did not rain on the earth. [18] Then he prayed again, and heaven gave rain, & the earth bore its fruit.
- (Philippians 4:4-7) Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice. [5] Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. The Lord is at hand; [6] do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. [7] And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.
- (Proverbs 28:9) If one turns away his ear from hearing the law,

even his prayer is an abomination.

- (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18) Rejoice always, [17] pray without ceasing, [18] give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.
- (Psalm 55:16-17) But I call to God, and the LORD will save me.
 [17] Evening and morning and at noon I utter my complaint and moan, and he hears my voice.
- (Luke 18:1-8) And he told them a parable to the effect that they ought always to pray and not lose heart. [2] He said, "In a certain city there was a judge who neither feared God nor respected man. [3] And there was a widow in that city who kept coming to him and saying, 'Give me justice against my adversary.' [4] For a while he refused, but afterward he said to himself, 'Though I neither fear God nor respect man, [5] yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will give her justice, so that she will not beat me down by her continual coming.'" [6] And the Lord said, "Hear what the unrighteous judge says. [7] And will not God give justice to his elect, who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long over them? [8] I tell you, he will give justice to them speedily. Nevertheless, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?"

(James 4:1-4) What causes quarrels and what causes fights among you? Is it not this, that your passions are at war within you? [2] You desire and do not have, so you murder. You covet and cannot obtain, so you fight and quarrel. You do not have, because you do not ask. [3] You ask and do not receive, because you ask wrongly, to spend it on your passions. [4] You adulterous people! Do you not know that friendship with the world is enmity with God? Therefore whoever wishes to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God.

- (1 John 5:14-15) And this is the confidence that we have toward him, that if we ask anything according to his will he hears us.
 [15] And if we know that he hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests that we have asked of him.
 - (Ephesians 6:18-20) praying at all times in the Spirit,

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with all prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints, [19] and also for me, that words may be given to me in opening my mouth boldly to proclaim the mystery of the gospel, [20] for which I am an ambassador in chains, that I may declare it boldly, as I ought to speak.

- (Romans 8:26-27) Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness. For we do not know what to pray for as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words. [27] And he who searches hearts knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God.
- (Matthew 6:5-15) The "Lord's Prayer": And when you pray, you must not be like the hypocrites. For they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, that they may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. [6] But when you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you. [7] "And when you pray, do not heap up empty phrases as the Gentiles do, for they think that they will be heard for their many words. [8] Do not be like them, for your Father knows what you need before you ask him. [9] Pray then like this: "Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. [10] Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. [11] Give us this day our daily bread, [12] and forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. [13] And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. [14] For if you forgive others their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you, [15] but if you do not forgive others their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses.
- (John 17) Jesus' Prayer to His Father The "High Priestly Prayer": When Jesus had spoken these words, he lifted up his eyes to heaven, and said, "Father, the hour has come; glorify your Son that the Son may glorify you ... [9] I am praying for them. I am not praying for the world but for those whom you

have given me, for they are yours. [11] ... Holy Father, keep them in your name, which you have given me, that they may be one, even as we are one. ... [15] I do not ask that you take them out of the world, but that you keep them from the evil one. ... [17] Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. ... [20] "I do not ask for these only, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, [21] that they may all be one, just as you, Father, are in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me. ... [24] Father, I desire that they also, whom you have given me, may be with me where I am, to see my glory that you have given me because you loved me before the foundation of the world. ... [26] I made known to them your name, and I will continue to make it known, that the love with which you have loved me may be in them, and I in them."

PRAYER IN THE PSALMS AND PROVERBS

A.C.T.S. - A helpful acronym to remember how to pray!

ADORATION (of God)

Humble Yourself - The reward for humility and fear of the LORD is riches and honor and life. (Proverbs 22:4)

• One's pride will bring him low, but he who is lowly in spirit will obtain honor. (Proverbs 29:23)

Respect the Lord - The fear of the LORD is instruction in wisdom, and humility comes before honor. (Proverbs 15:33)

• Blessed is the one who fears the LORD always, but whoever hardens his heart will fall into calamity. (Proverbs 28:14)

CONFESSION (of sin)

Turn Your Lips - Whoever conceals his transgressions will not prosper, but he who confesses and forsakes them will obtain mercy. - Proverbs 28:13

Turn Your Lives - Be not wise in your own eyes; fear the LORD, and turn away from evil. [8] It will be healing to your flesh and refreshment to your bones. (Proverbs 3:7-8)

• One who is wise is cautious and turns away from evil, but a fool is reckless and careless. (Proverbs 14:16)

• The highway of the upright turns aside from evil; whoever guards his way preserves his life. (Proverbs 16:17)

THANKSGIVING (to God)

Recognize the Source - For the LORD gives wisdom; from his mouth come knowledge and understanding; (Proverbs 2:6)

Rest in the Source - Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding, [6] In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths. (Proverbs 3:5-6)

• My son, do not despise the LORD's discipline or be weary of his reproof, [12] for the LORD reproves him whom he loves, as a father the son in whom he delights. (Proverbs 3:11-12)

Respond to the Source - Honor the LORD with your wealth and with the firstfruits of all your produce (Proverbs 3:9)

SUPPLICATION (asking)

Seek Him - Evil men do not understand justice, but those who seek the LORD understand it completely. (Proverbs 28:5)

• Many seek the face of a ruler, but it is from the LORD that a man gets justice. (Proverbs 29:26)

Speak to Him - The LORD is far from the wicked, but he hears the prayer of the righteous. (Proverbs 15:29)

Make Godly Requests Two things I ask of you; deny them not to me before I die [8] Remove far from me falsehood and lying; give me neither poverty nor riches; feed me with the food that is needful for me. (Proverbs 30:7-8)

Seek His Favor - A good man obtains favor from the LORD (Proverbs 12:2)

Seek His Answers - The plans of the heart belong to man, but the answer of the tongue is from the LORD. (Proverbs 16:1)

What should guide our prayers?

Pray According to His Voice "If one turns away his ear from hearing the law, even his prayer is an abomination." (Proverbs 28:9 ESV)

• "I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God that you may know that you have eternal life. And this is the confidence that we have toward him, that if we ask anything according to his will he hears us. And if we know that he hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests that we have asked of him." (1 John 5:13-15)

Pray According to His Character "The sacrifice of the wicked is an abomination to the LORD, but the prayer of the upright is acceptable to him." (Proverbs 15:8)

• "Truly, truly, I say to you, whatever you ask of the Father in my name, he will give it to you." (John 16:23)

Pray According to His Relationship "The LORD is far from the wicked, but he hears the prayer of the righteous." (Proverbs 15:29)

- "And whatever you ask in prayer, you will receive, if you have faith." (Matthew 21:22)
- "and whatever we ask we receive from him, because we keep his commandments and do what pleases him." (1 John 3:22)

PRAYING THE PSALMS

Donald Whitney (Praying the Bible by Donald S. Whitney) has shared an outstanding method of using the Psalms as a guide and format for our prayers. There are 150 Psalms, with around 30 days per month, which provides about 5 Psalms/Day to Choose To discover which daily Psalms you might consider praying through, take the day of the week and add in increments of 30. For instance, on January 7th you would have Psalm 7, 37, 67, 97, and 127 to choose from (Day of the Week + 30). Skim over those five Psalms until you discover one in which your heart resonates for that particular day. Then read a verse at a time, pausing to reflect and pray over and according to that particular truth to God.

Take a few minutes and try praying personally through Psalm 7.

Psalm 7

REFUGE [1] O LORD my God, in you do I take refuge; save me from all my pursuers and deliver me, [2] lest like a lion they tear my soul apart, rending it in pieces, with none to deliver.

DISCIPLINE [3] O LORD my God, if I have done this, if there is wrong in my hands, [4] if I have repaid my friend with evil or plundered my enemy without cause, [5] let the enemy pursue my soul and overtake it, and let him trample my life to the ground and lay my glory in the dust. Selah

PROTECTION [6] Arise, O LORD, in your anger; lift yourself up against the fury of my enemies; awake for me; you have appointed a judgment. [7] Let the assembly of the peoples be gathered about

you; over it return on high.

RIGHTEOUSNESS [8] The LORD judges the peoples; judge me, O LORD, according to my righteousness and according to the integrity that is in me.

JUSTICE [9] Oh, let the evil of the wicked come to an end, and may you establish the righteous—you who test the minds and hearts, O righteous God!

PLEASING OR DISPLEASING GOD [10] My shield is with God, who saves the upright in heart. [11] God is a righteous judge, and a God who feels indignation every day.

WRATH [12] If a man does not repent, God will whet his sword; he has bent and readied his bow; [13] he has prepared for him his deadly weapons, making his arrows fiery shafts.

THE WICKED [14] Behold, the wicked man conceives evil and is pregnant with mischief and gives birth to lies. [15] He makes a pit, digging it out, and falls into the hole that he has made. [16] His mischief returns upon his own head, and on his own skull his violence descends.

PRAISE [17] I will give to the LORD the thanks due to his righteousness, and I will sing praise to the name of the LORD, the Most High.

PRAYERS OF ENDURANCE (Psalm 69 ESV)

No Situation Is Hopeless: Run To God!

[1] Save me, O God! For the waters have come up to my neck. [2] I sink in deep mire, where there is no foothold; I have come into deep waters, and the flood sweeps over me. [3] I am weary with my crying out; my throat is parched. My eyes grow dim with waiting for my God. [4] More in number than the hairs of my head are those who hate me without cause; mighty are those who would destroy me, those who attack me with lies. What I did not steal must I now restore?

Confess Your Sin

[5] O God, you know my folly; the wrongs I have done are not hidden from you. [6] Let not those who hope in you be put to shame through me, O Lord GOD of hosts; let not those who seek you be brought to dishonor through me, O God of Israel. [7] For it is for your sake that I have borne reproach, that dishonor has covered my face. [8] I have become a stranger to my brothers, an alien to my mother's sons.

Messengers Are Often Attacked For Their Message: Stay Humble But Zealous

[9] For zeal for your house has consumed me, and the reproaches of those who reproach you have fallen on me. [10] When I wept and humbled my soul with fasting, it became my reproach. [11] When I made sackcloth my clothing, I became a byword to them. [12] I am the talk of those who sit in the gate, and the drunkards make songs about me.

God Is Aware, Able, And Good: Never Doubt

[13] But as for me, my prayer is to you, O LORD. At an acceptable time, O God, in the abundance of your steadfast love answer me in your saving faithfulness. [14] Deliver me from sinking in the mire; let me be delivered from my enemies and from the deep waters. [15] Let not the flood sweep over me, or the deep swallow me up, or the pit close its mouth over me.

Seek His Presence In Your Loneliness

[16] Answer me, O LORD, for your steadfast love is good; according to your abundant mercy, turn to me. [17] Hide not your face from your servant; for I am in distress; make haste to answer me. [18] Draw near to my soul, redeem me; ransom me because of my enemies! [19] You know my reproach, and my shame and my dishonor; my foes are all known to you. [20] Reproaches have broken my heart, so that I am in despair. I looked for pity, but there was none, and for comforters, but I found none. [21] They gave me poison for food, and for my thirst they gave me sour wine to drink.

Seek And Trust God's Just Vengeance And Punishment

[22] Let their own table before them become a snare; and when they are at peace, let it become a trap. [23] Let their eyes be darkened, so that they cannot see, and make their loins tremble continually. [24] Pour out your indignation upon them, and let your burning anger overtake them. [25] May their camp be a desolation; let no one dwell in their tents. [26] For they persecute him whom you have struck down, and they recount the pain of those you have wounded. [27] Add to them punishment upon punishment; may they have no acquittal from you. [28] Let them be blotted out of the book of the living; let them not be enrolled among the righteous.

Trust His Salvation Plan: Now & Future

[29] But I am afflicted and in pain; let your salvation, O God, set me on high! [30] I will praise the name of God with a song; I will magnify him with thanksgiving. [31] This will please the LORD more than an ox or a bull with horns and hoofs.[32] When the humble see it they will be glad; you who seek God, let your hearts revive. [33] For the LORD hears the needy and does not despise his own people who are prisoners. [34] Let heaven and earth praise him, the seas and everything that moves in them. [35] For God will save Zion and build up the cities of Judah, and people shall dwell there and possess it; [36] the offspring of his servants shall inherit it, and those who love his name shall dwell in it.

PRAYERS OF PROTECTION

(Psalm 31)

Admit You Need Outside Help!

[1] In you, O LORD, do I take refuge; let me never be put to shame; in your righteousness deliver me! [2] Incline your ear to me; rescue me speedily! Be a rock of refuge for me, a strong fortress to save me!

Praise Your Protector

[3] For you are my rock and my fortress; and for your name's sake you lead me and guide me; [4] you take me out of the net they have hidden for me, for you are my refuge. [5] Into your hand I commit my spirit; you have redeemed me, O LORD, faithful God.

Recognize Your Enemies & Increase In Your Love Of God

[6] I hate those who pay regard to worthless idols, but I trust in the LORD. [7] I will rejoice and be glad in your steadfast love, because you have seen my affliction; you have known the distress of my soul, [8] and you have not delivered me into the hand of the enemy; you have set my feet in a broad place.

Be Transparent With The Depth Of Your Need!

[9] Be gracious to me, O LORD, for I am in distress; my eye is wasted from grief; my soul and my body also. [10] For my life is spent with sorrow, and my years with sighing; my strength fails because of my iniquity, and my bones waste away. [11] Because of all my adversaries I have become a reproach, especially to my neighbors, and an object of dread to my acquaintances; those who see me in the street flee from me. [12] I have been forgotten like one who is dead; I have become like a broken vessel.

Regardless Of Your Circumstances, Trust In The Lord!

[13] For I hear the whispering of many—terror on every side!—as they scheme together against me, as they plot to take my life. [14] But I trust in you, O LORD; I say, "You are my God." [15] My times are in your hand; rescue me from the hand of my enemies and from my persecutors! [16] Make your face shine on your servant; save me in your steadfast love!

Ask Specifically For Help

[17] O LORD, let me not be put to shame, for I call upon you; let the wicked be put to shame; let them go silently to Sheol. [18] Let the lying lips be mute, which speak insolently against the righteous in pride and contempt.

Thank God Profusely And Specifically

[19] Oh, how abundant is your goodness, which you have stored up for those who fear you and worked for those who take refuge in you, in the sight of the children of mankind! [20] In the cover of your presence you hide them from the plots of men; you store them in your shelter from the strife of tongues. [21] Blessed be the LORD, for he has wondrously shown his steadfast love to me when I was in a besieged city. [22] I had said in my alarm, "I am cut off from your sight." But you heard the voice of my pleas for mercy when I cried to you for help.

Never Forget That God Is In Control

[23] Love the LORD, all you his saints! The LORD preserves the faithful but abundantly repays the one who acts in pride. [24] Be strong, and let your heart take courage, all you who wait for the LORD!

TOP 30 WAYS TO PRAY

Here are some suggestions and ideas for ways to pray!

- 1. ACTS: Spend time praying over each of these areas: Adoration (of God), Confession (of sins), Thanksgiving (for His work), Supplication (how can you ask God to help you or others)
- Pick a Psalm and pray through it, reflecting how you might be feeling and thinking in a similar way or situation (150 Psalms, ~30 days/month, 5 psalms to choose from per day)
- 3. Pray over the names of God. Reflect on who He is and adore Him (from God Is by Ken Hemphill): Alpha (beginning), Omega (end), Our Advocate, the Almighty, the Author & Finisher, the Beloved Son, the Bread of Life, the Bright Morning Star, Captain of our Salvation, the Chief Shepherd, the Cornerstone, Our Creator, Our Counselor, Our Deliverer, the Door, the Faithful Witness, Everlasting Father, the First Begotten, the Good Shepherd, the Great High Priest, the Holy Child, the Head of the Church, the Great I AM, Immanuel, Jesus, the Just One, the Life, the Lamb of God, the Light of the World, the Lion of Judah, the Lord of All, the Lord of Glory, Our Master, the Man of Sorrows, Our Mediator, the Messiah, the Mighty God, Our Redeemer, the Prince of Peace, Our Rock, the Resurrection & the Life, Our Savior, the Rose of Sharon, the Son of God, the Son of Man, the True Light, the True Vine, the Truth, Wonderful, the Word of God, & the Way

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- 4. Pray the Lord's Prayer (Matthew 6:5-15)
- 5. Remain in silence reflect on who the Lord is and how the Lord is working upon your life
- 6. Pray for Missionaries International, across North America, & Military chaplains

Use *Pray for the World* by Patrick Johnstone as a guide!

- 7. Pray over the 10 commandments and ask for forgiveness of those you have broken (Exodus 20)
- 8. Journal out (write) down a prayer
- 9. Write your sins on a dry erase board or a paper. Pray for forgiveness and then destroy the writing.
- 10. Pray out loud.
- 11. Pray for five of your friends by name.
- 12. Pray for students and senior adults in your church by name.
- 13. Pray for a non-believer by name. Pray for a struggling Christian by name.
- 14. Pray for the leaders of our church: Staff. Lay leadership. Sunday School teachers. Volunteers.
- 15. Pray for five members of your family by name.
- 16. Pray for opportunities to witness and for love, boldness, wisdom, and courage to do so.
- 17. Pray for increased growth in your own spiritual walk with Christ: Bible Reading, Prayer, Worship, Stewardship, Service, etc.
- 18. Thank God because we are: the salt of the earth, the light of the world, witnesses of the Gospel, branches in God's vine, friends of Jesus, called by Christ, Saints of God, justified before God, walking in newness of life, in the Spirit, Sons of God, more than conquerors, one body, strong for the weak, filled with God's goodness, not Spiritually lacking, in Christ Jesus, God's field and building, God's temple, the Members of Christ, known by

God, the Aroma of Christ, given over to death, protected from Fear of Death, a new creation, ambassadors for Christ, strong when we are weak, crucified with Christ, heirs with Christ, sons and not slaves, not under the law, sealed with the Holy Spirit, created to do good, fellow citizens with the Saints, Christ's household, not quitters, protected by God's power, God's people, blessed when we are cursed, called God's children, from God (from *We Are* by Ken Hemphill)

- 19. Pray for strength and ways of escape with certain struggles and temptations you are dealing with. Pray for Satan to remain far from you.
- 20. Prayer walk: Walk around and pray for the areas and people you see.
- 21. Pray for specific needs/concerns of others.
- 22. Pray for your future spouse, children, or grandchildren (if the Lord wills).
- 23. Randomly open your Bible and pray over the Scripture you read. Reflect how you may have experienced or are experiencing similar things.
- 24. Pray freely as you feel led use a devotional book to guide you (try *Everyday Prayers: 365 Days to a Gospel-Centered Faith* by Scotty Smith).
- 25. Pray an ancient prayer of a Puritan (try a book called: *The Valley of Vision: A Collection of Puritan Prayers & Devotions* by Arthur Bennett)
- 26. Pray through a church prayer sheet. Pray in a group over each other's needs/requests & as you feel led.
- 27. Pray sitting (2 Sam 7:18), standing (Mark 11:25), kneeling (Chronicles 6:13; Daniel 6:10; Luke 22:41; Acts 7:60, 9:40, 20:36, 21:5; Ephesians 3:14), with your face to the ground (Matthew 26:39; Mark 14:35), and with hands lifted up (1 Timothy 2:8).
- 28. Pray as you watch the news. As you are sitting in

class. As you are driving a car (eyes open). Let your surroundings guide and instruct your prayer.

- 29. Pray when you receive news by email, text message, phone calls, or Facebook.
- 30. Read Luke 18:1-8. Pray for a situation that you've "lost heart" over?

• **Absolute Fast** – fasting from all food and all water (Ezra 8:21-23, Esther 4:12-16, Paul - Acts 9:9, David - 2 Samuel 12:15-23)

• **Supernatural Fast** – requires God's intervention to survive Moses (Deuteronomy 9:9), Elijah (1 Kings 19:8)

- **Private Fast** in a way not to be noticed (Matthew 6:16-18)
- **Congregational Fast** united focus (Joel 2:15-16, Acts 13:2)

 Other than food - "a voluntary denial of a normal function for the sake of intense spiritual activity" - Richard Foster
 Fasting from sex within marriage for more focus on prayer (1 Corinthians 7:3-5)
