The Catholic Blog simply presents portions of the Catholic Catechism with relevant Bible verses and introspective questions to consider. This free resource will help you on your journey to consider the beliefs and practices of the Roman Catholic Church and examine for yourself, through tough questions, whether The Catechism of the Catholic Church is biblically valid and trustworthy.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church is a substantial document of significant history and tradition. If you have yet to read it, I encourage you to read it in its entirety. As you consider the "essential and fundamental contents of Catholic doctrine" (CCC, 11), I hope you will be like the Bereans of Acts 17:11 who always put the Bible first to test what they were learning.

Similarly, may we evaluate what we see in The Catechism of the Catholic Church in the light of the Bible to "see if these things were so."

Acts 17:11 "Now these Jews were more noble than those in Thessalonica; they received the word with all eagerness, examining the Scriptures daily to see if these things were so." (ESV)

A 3 Part Approach: Here is the approach you will find to this Bible study.

- 1) Interesting highlights and quotes Due to the massive volume of writings in The Catechism of the Catholic Church, I have picked quotes from the text that I think you will find most useful and fascinating.
- 2) Relevant Scriptures Likewise, I selected passages of Scripture that I thought particularly helpful in evaluating and understanding the Catholic teachings. Both The Catechism of the Catholic Church and the Bible passages should be considered in their original context and setting. There are many more possible Catholic teachings and Biblical passages to consider but I hope this is a helpful start to your studies.
- **3) Helpful Questions** I have chosen not to insert opinions and assertions but instead propose tough questions that help us to think critically for ourselves about what we are reading.

My end goal and hope is that we all follow God's directive to us in 2 Corinthians 13:5 to "Examine yourselves, to see whether you are in the faith. Test yourselves. Or do you not realize this about yourselves, that Jesus Christ is in you?—unless indeed you fail to meet the test!" (ESV). May we all have the joy of an eternity in the presence of Jesus!

Ephesians 6:10 "Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might." (ESV)

The story of the Bible is not a story about spiritual warfare. The story of the Bible is the story of God. As we clearly focus on who God is (His names and characteristic) and what He has done (miracles), our enemies and struggles will seem so much smaller. Although God is the Bible's primary focus, He reveals much to us about our chief enemy in Satan. Don't miss out on what God has to tell us about our enemy's names, character, and tactics that we be best prepared to live lives that enjoy and honor our Creator.

Colossians 1:16 "For by him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things were created through him and for him." (ESV)

God's created angels are important in the storyline of history. In Scripture God shares many stories that explain their purposes and abilities. This section will help you to rightly understand the mostly unseen angelic beings, both faithful (angels) and fallen (demons).

Humanity is divided by those who follow Jesus in faith (Christian believers) and those who follow Satan, the world, and their fleshly sin (unbelievers). It is essential to understand the identities of both groups as well as the evidences of their character and works. There is no neutral ground in this battle of the followers of Christ against the spiritual forces of evil. Here are some truths to help us be aware of who we are and rightly see the world around us with a spiritual understanding.

4. Heaven & Hell and Salvation

Luke 19:10 "For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost." (ESV)

Matthew 7:21–23 "Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but the one who does the will of my Father who is in heaven. [22] On that day many will say to me, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name, and cast out demons in your name, and do many mighty works in your name?' [23] And then will I declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from me, you workers of lawlessness.'" (ESV)

God speaks clearly to us both about eternal life (Heaven) and eternal death (Hell). He wants believers to look forward to being in His presence in Heaven and also wants unbelievers to be warned of the danger of eternal suffering in Hell. Salvation is God's offer and work through Christ and He has much to tell us in the Scriptures. Here are some truths about Heaven, Hell, and God's work of salvation.

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

WHAT DOES THE BIBLE SAY ABOUT SPIRITUAL HEALTH?

Am I Spiritually Healthy?

I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. [2] Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect. (Romans 12:1-2 ESV)

Take a Diagnostic Exam (Romans 12:9-21)

- · Am I increasing in my love of God? (v.9, 11, 12)
- · Am I increasing in my hatred of sin? (v.9)
- Am I increasing in holy living? (v.9)
- Am I increasing in my love of others? (v.10,14-18)
- Am I increasing in the fruits of God's Spirit? (v.12, 21)
- Am I increasing in generosity to God & others? (v.13,21)
- Am I increasing in forgiveness? (v.18-20)

Let love be genuine. Abhor what is evil; hold fast to what is good. [10] Love one another with brotherly affection. Outdo one another in showing honor. [11] Do not be slothful in zeal, be fervent in spirit, serve the Lord. [12] Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer. [13] Contribute to the needs of the saints and seek to show hospitality. [14] Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse

them. [15] Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. [16] Live in harmony with one another. Do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly. Never be wise in your own sight. [17] Repay no one evil for evil, but give thought to do what is honorable in the sight of all. [18] If possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all. [19] Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave it to the wrath of God, for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord." [20] To the contrary, "if your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him something to drink; for by so doing you will heap burning coals on his head." [21] Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good. (Romans 12:9-21)

- Fulfill your purpose with the body of Christ
 (Romans 12:3-8, 1 Corinthians 12, Acts 2:42-47)
 Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them... (Romans 12:6)
- Take Individual Responsibility let the Holy Spirit grow and use you in God's good work through His church
- **Intentionally Fellowship** develop caring and committed relationships
- Humbly Serve share towards each other in times of need & reach outside the church to show Christ's love in a tangible way
- **Passionately Worship** ascribe glory to God and enjoy His presence!
- Courageously Evangelize lovingly connect people to Christ by intentionally sharing the Gospel message
- Constantly Pray speak with God personally, regularly, and for one another
- Teach Yourself & Others personally and corporately study God's Word

WHAT DOES THE BIBLE SAY ABOUT PHYSICAL HEALTH?

8 Dimensions of Physical Health

Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, for you were bought with a price. So glorify God in your body.

(1 Corinthians 6:19-20)

Safeguards - Do I unnecessarily put my or others' lives at risk?

Diet - Am I given to gluttonous or unhealthy eating habits? The one who keeps the law is a son with understanding, but a companion of gluttons shames his father. (Proverbs 28:7)

Addictions – Do I take in substances which can harm me? "All things are lawful for me," but not all things are helpful. 'All things are lawful for me' but I will not be dominated by anything." (1 Corinthians 6:12)

Hygiene - Do I have good health habits to protect myself?

Medicine – Do I utilize the gift of medical wisdom?

Exercise – Do I use my body physically for its purposes? The sluggard says, "There is a lion in the road! There is a lion in the streets!" As a door turns on its hinges, so does a sluggard on his bed. The sluggard buries his hand in the dish; it wears him out to bring it back to his mouth. (Proverbs 26:13-16)

Stewardship – Do I recognize that my body is not my own?

Suffering – Do I trust God when He chooses or allows for my health or life to be taken away?

"Shall we receive good from God, and shall we not receive evil?' In all this Job did not sin with his lips." (Job 2:10)

Take Action & Improve Your Physical Health

- 1. **Endurance:** There is no easy or quick fix.
- 2. **Diet**: Watch what you take in. Discipline yourself.
- 3. **Exercise:** Work out creatively, effectively, regularly.
- 4. **Rest:** Pace yourself according to God's plan.
- 5. **Vanity:** Avoid living in self-righteousness.
- 6. **Guilt:** Avoid living in self-condemnation.
- 7. Medical advice: Seek it, take it, obey it.
- 8. **Addictions**: Recognize it, confess it, find help.
- 9. **Protection**: Protect yours and others' health and lives.
- 10. **Honor** the Lord with your health.
- 11. Trust the Lord in sickness and health
 - 1 Timothy 4:8 "for while bodily training is of some value, godliness is of value in every way, as it holds promise for the present life and also for the life to come."

Am I Mentally Healthy? Mind Games: What is going on in my head?

Satan, the World, and Our Flesh Wage a Mental War

- We destroy arguments & every lofty opinion raised against the knowledge of God (2 Cor 10:5)
- David (1 Chronicles 21:1), Judas (John 13:2), Ananias and Sapphira (Acts 5:1-10), Nebuchadnezzar (Daniel 4:34-37)

Pursue Mental Obedience: Take Every Thought Captive

- and take every thought captive to obey Christ (2 Corinthians 10:5)
- Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. (James 4:7)

How to Be Mentally Healthy

(2 Timothy 3:10-17 ESV)

- Fill Your Mind...with Truths from Trustworthy Lives [10] You, however, have followed my teaching, my conduct, my aim in life, my faith, my patience, my love, my steadfastness, [11] my persecutions and sufferings that happened to me at Antioch, at Iconium, and at Lystra—which persecutions I endured; yet from them all the Lord rescued me.
- Mental Suffering Happens [12] Indeed, all who desire to live


a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted, [13] while evil people and impostors will go on from bad to worse, deceiving and being deceived.

• Continue to Fill Your Mind with God's Truths [14] But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it

God's Truths are the Key to...

Eternal Life [15] and how from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus.

A Valued Life [16] All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness,



- Reproof Stop Wrong Beliefs Recognize Lies
- And without faith it is impossible to please him, for whoever would draw near to God must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him. (Hebrews 11:6)
- "For whatever does not proceed from faith is sin." (Rom 14:23)
- "Sin is anything that displeases God and since without faith you can't please God, therefore, if you don't have faith, everything you do it sin, because everything yo do displeases God." John Piper

How To Be Emotionally Healthy

(Psalm 55 ESV)

Seek God in Truth-Filled Prayer 1 Give ear to my prayer, O God, and hide not yourself from my plea for mercy! 2 Attend to me, and answer me; I am restless in my complaint and I moan,

Acknowledge Your Circumstances 3 because of the noise of the enemy, because of the oppression of the wicked. For they drop trouble upon me, and in anger they bear a grudge against me.

Honestly Share Your Emotions with God 4 My heart is in anguish within me; the terrors of death have fallen upon me. 5 Fear and trembling come upon me, and horror overwhelms me. 6 And I say, "Oh, that I had wings like a dove! I would fly away and be at rest; 7 I would wander far away; I would lodge in the wilderness; Selah 8 I would hurry to find a shelter from the raging wind and tempest."

Ask God to Act Righteously 9 Destroy, O Lord, divide their tongues; for I see violence and strife in the city. 10 Day and night they go around it on its walls, and iniquity and trouble are within it; 11 ruin is in its midst; oppression and fraud do not depart from its marketplace.

Prepare for Deep Emotional Wounds 12 For it is not an enemy who taunts me— then I could bear it; it is not an adversary who deals insolently with me—then I could hide from him. 13 But it is you, a man, my equal, my companion, my familiar friend. 14 We used to take sweet counsel together; within God's house we walked in the throng.

Watch Out for Temptations To... v.6 not by the way of eyeservice, as people-pleasers, but as bondservants of Christ, doing the will of God from the heart.

So, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God. [32] Give no offense to Jews or to Greeks or to the church of God, [33] just as I try to please everyone in everything I do, not seeking my own advantage, but that of many, that they may be saved. (1 Corinthians 10:31-33 ESV)

Be a Great Employee [7] rendering service with a good will as to the Lord and not to man, [8] knowing that whatever good anyone does, this he will receive back from the Lord, whether he is a bondservant or is free.

- Do Good: Look for Opportunities, Take Opportunities
- Trust in God's Reward, Not Your Position or Paycheck

Be a Great Boss [9] Masters, do the same to them, and stop your threatening, knowing that he who is both their Master and yours is in heaven, and that there is no partiality with him.

Work Is Your Every-Day Mission Field [12] Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience, [13] bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. [14] And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. [15] And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. A "Typical American" Retirement Is Not a Biblical Command or Concept

Life & retirement isn't about us - it is about glorifying God by enjoying & sharing Him!

Retirement Is a Gift & Responsibility, Not a Right - Don't Waste It!

Psalm 71:18 "So even to old age and gray hairs, O God, do not forsake me, until I proclaim your might to another generation, your power to all those to come." (ESV)

8 Opportunities In Retirement - Seize the Season!

- 1) More Spiritual Growth additional time allows for purposeful and intentional reprioritization, consider how to enjoy God more through your Bible and prayer!
- **2) More Service** within your church, among family, in your community
- **3) More Missions** cross some boundaries to go and tell the Good News of Jesus wherever He calls with fearless love
- **4) More Generosity** if you've been wise financially you will have less significant expenses that may free you for more chances to invest God's resources back into ministries and

missions

- **5) More Relationships** a slower pace creates space to be with you spouse, children, family, friends and neighbors more
- **6) More Travel** God's creation is amazing; free time allows more chances to enjoy God's blessings in His creation with those whom you love
- **7) More Learning** more time freed up from no work schedule can allow time to read, listen, and watch teachers and authors for personal growth that overflows to others
- **8) More Rest** many of us have worked at too furious of a pace and it has taken a toll, retirement can serve as a season of rest and reprioritization

5 Temptations in Retirement - Watch Out!

- 1) **Self-indulge** living for self and the pursuit of the pleasures and temptations of the world
- **2) Self-harm** overeating and under-exercising, lack of medical oversight or intervention
- 3) **Self-destruct** over-committing, over-working, not adjusting your pace to the physical realities of aging
- **4) Self-isolate** over-sleeping, overly-lazy and sedentary lifestyles lead to depression
- **5) Self-love** it's easy to prioritize yourself and your needs over others through self-focus

The second is this: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.'

There is no other commandment greater

than these." (Mark 12:31 ESV)

When do we love? Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends. (John 15:13)

At all times. At desperate times. A friend loves at all times, and a brother is born for adversity. (Proverbs 17:17)

Why do we love? For I could wish that I myself were accursed and cut off from Christ for the sake of my brothers (Romans 9:3)

Because Christ loved & died for us. And walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God. (Eph 5:2-3)

Who do we love? But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, [45] so that you may be sons of your Father who is in heaven. (Matthew 5:44-45)

• Spouses. Children. Family. Church. Friends. Strangers. Enemies.

What does it mean to love? Which of these three, do you think, proved to be a neighbor to the man who fell among the robbers?" [37] He said, "The one who showed him mercy." And Jesus said to him, "You go, and do likewise." (Luke 10:36-37)

Love thinks, feels, and gives mercy & grace. How do you love yourself?

• 5 Ts – Thoughts & Feelings – Talk - Time – Talents – Treasures

Walk in Christ-like obedience and holiness. put on the armor of light. [13] Let us walk properly as in the daytime...[14] But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires. (Romans 13:12-14)

How do we love others? Brothers, my heart's desire and prayer to God for them is that they may be saved. (Romans 10:1)

- We ought to lay down our lives for the brothers (1 John 3:16)
- 5Ts Thoughts & Feelings Talk Time Talents Treasures

Share the Gospel Love: Warnings & Promises: Owe no one anything, except to love each other, for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. [9] For the commandments, "You shall not commit adultery, You shall not murder, You shall not steal, You shall not covet," and any other commandment, are summed up in this word: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." [10] Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore love is the fulfilling of the law. (Romans 13:8-10)

- Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. [4] Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others. (Philippians 2:3-4)
- 6/10 Commandments: Exodus 20:12-17 (see Ephesians 4:17-32)
- **5. Honor & Respect Others** (v.12) "Honor your father and your mother"
- 6. Grant Forgiveness (v.13) "You shall not murder."
- 7. Be Sexually Pure (v.14) "You shall not commit adultery."

WHAT DOES THE BIBLE SAY ABOUT SEXUAL HEALTH?

1 Corinthians 7:1-7 (ESV)

Sexual Virginity Is Precious and Beautiful [1] Now concerning the matters about which you wrote: "It is good for a man not to have sexual relations with a woman."

God-Given Singleness Is a Gift [6] Now as a concession, not a command, I say this. [7] I wish that all were as I myself am. But each has his own gift from God, one of one kind and one of another.

Marital Fidelity Is the Solution to Sexual Immorality [2] But because of the temptation to sexual immorality, each man should have his own wife and each woman her own husband.

Sex Is for Heterosexual Marriage. [3] The husband should give to his wife her conjugal rights, and likewise the wife to her husband.

• God's plan for marriage is "the joining of one man and one woman with the promise of being faithful to one another for a lifetime" (Baptist Faith & Message). Marriage is a spiritual, covenantal, and lifetime union of two souls by our Creator God. (Mark 10:1-12)

Your Body Belongs to God, But Is Placed Under the Authority of Your Spouse

(Past, Present, or Future) [4] For the wife does not have authority

over her own body, but the husband does. Likewise the husband does not have authority over his own body, but the wife does.

Willing Sexual Abstinence In Marriage...

- ...Is Not an Option ([5] Do not deprive one another,)
- ...Unless Both Spouses Agree (except perhaps by agreement)
- ...For a Brief Period of Time (for a limited time,)
- ...For the Purposes of God-Focus (that you may devote yourselves to prayer)
- ...With an Intentional Plan for Sexual Re-Union (but then come together again, so that Satan may not tempt you because of your lack of self-control)

We Will Be Held Accountable for Our Sexual Health Let marriage be held in honor among all, and let the marriage bed be undefiled, for God will judge the sexually immoral and adulterous. (Hebrews 13:4)

How to Be Sexually Healthy

But sexual immorality and all impurity or covetousness must not even be named among you, as is proper among saints. (Ephesians 5:3)

Single? Remember you have an enemy. Repent where you have failed. Don't have sex... in your mind...in your heart...with yourself...with others. Don't take steps towards sex outside marriage. Save sex until you are married according to God's plan.

Married? Remember you have an enemy. Avoid the appearance of sexual immorality. Avoid temptations towards sexual immorality. Avoid all sexual immorality. Have sex regularly (aim for twice a week). Make sex special, spiritual, and significant. When sex is not possible, find alternatives (HINT: hands & mouths & bodies...read Song of Solomon).
