Eryc Taylor, Artistic Director

Eryc Taylor is the Artistic Director of the NYC-based nonprofit dance company Eryc Taylor Dance (ETD), its community outreach program, ETD Outreach, and the New Choreographer Grant (NCG) program. He holds an MFA in Dance from NYU Tisch and has been creating and touring original works since 1995, founding ETD in 2006. His choreography has been presented nationally and internationally, including tours to Mexico and South Korea.

As the curator of ETD Outreach, Taylor oversees 20+ weekly movement workshops for underserved communities across NYC. He has received grants and government support from NYSCA, LMCC, SVOG, DCLA, and Dance/NYC.

His past projects include: photos

- EARTH (2019): Featuring past NCG recipients, showcased on PBS ALL ARTS' "Climate Artists"
- Uncharted Territory (2020): A dance film created during the pandemic, receiving critical acclaim and festival selections
- Factory/Refractory (2022-2023): A site-specific immersive production inspired by 1990s NYC nightlife, presented at SLATE NY

Born in the Bronx, Nhyira graduated magna cum laude from NYU with a B.F.A. in Dance (Tisch School of the Arts) and a B.A. in Sociology. She trained at Dance Theatre of Harlem, The Ailey School, Hubbard Street Dance Chicago, MOVE|NYC|, Ballet Hispánico, and HAMU in Prague.

Her performance credits include works by Robert Garland, Jamar Roberts, Sidra Bell, Trisha Brown, and Bill T. Jones, and she was featured in Jacolby Satterwhite's digital installation at Lincoln Center.

As a choreographer, Nhyira's work has been showcased at Battery Dance and Forza Dance. In 2022, she received the Upsurge Dance Festival choreographic mentorship with Sidra Bell. She has also worked with brands such as Kaliii, Travis Scott, SNIPES USA, and Amika.

- Production innovation

In the 2025-2026 cycle, ETD Outreach will award four \$1,000 grants to emerging choreographers. The application will open Summer 2025.

A quartet of four men navigate a world of control and disruption—moving through rigid lines, breaking patterns, and shedding layers of programmed identity. Flashes of vignettes unravel their journey, where voice becomes both a weapon and a whisper, and opera's grandeur collides with raw, fractured sound. They oscillate between robotic precision and visceral release, bound by an electric pulse that drives them toward overstimulation, anxiety, and transformation. Shadows stretch, bodies glitch, whispers cut through white noise. Physical theatre merges with movement, blurring the line between the familiar and the unknown. The metronome ticks—a relentless rhythm of order, defiance, and rebirth.
