



## Pastor Jon Aamodt as Guest Preacher today!

We welcome Pastor Jon Aamodt, his wife Cheryl, and three adult children and their families to Charity this weekend. Pastor Jon earned a Master of Divinity degree from Gateway Seminary and has been a Christian minister for more than 30 years. He has served as a senior pastor, retirement community chaplain, worship leader, youth pastor, church planter, retreat leader and guest speaker, as well as a high school teacher and football coach. He's also ministered internationally in Africa, Southeast Asia, and South Asia.



Since 2014, Pastor Jon has pastored the Evensong Chapel Service, a mission worship outreach he founded in Hillsboro, Oregon. In 2020 he began sharing his weekly sermons in a Hope on The Way podcast that reaches a global audience. He has been involved with the Alliance of Renewal Churches, formerly the Lutheran Renewal Movement. And, he has a special interest in ministry to children, teenagers and young adults, as well as grassroots generational harvest and revival.

Pastor Jon's father grew up in the Rugby, North Dakota, area before moving to Idaho as a young man. A veteran, Pastor Jon served in the U.S. Army as an airborne infantryman in Alaska. ## The Advent Wreath

The Advent wreath first appeared in Germany in 1839. A Lutheran minister working at a mission for children created a wreath out of the wheel of a cart. He placed twenty small red candles and four large white candles inside the ring. The red candles were lit on weekdays and the four white candles were lit on Sundays.

Eventually, the Advent wreath was created out of evergreens, symbolizing everlasting life in the midst of winter and death as the evergreen is continuously green. The circle reminds us of God's unending love and the eternal life He makes possible.

The most common Advent candle tradition involves four candles around the wreath. Additional decorations, like holly and berries, are sometimes added. Their red color points ahead to Jesus' sacrifice and death on the cross, shedding his blood for our sins. Pinecones can symbolize the new life that Jesus brings through His resurrection.

A new candle is lit on each of the four Sundays before Christmas. Each candle represents something different, although traditions vary.

Often, the first, second, and fourth candles are purple; the third candle is rose-colored. Sometimes all the candles are red; in other traditions, all four candles are blue or white.

Occasionally, a fifth white candle is placed in the middle of the wreath and is lit on Christmas Day to celebrate Jesus' birth.



The first candle symbolizes hope and is called the "Prophet's Candle." The prophets of the Old Testament, especially Isaiah, waited in hope for the Messiah's arrival.

# Charity's Advent Banners

This is the first Sunday in Advent, a time of transition from darkness and death to new life and fulfillment, with the birth of the Christ Child at Christmas.

Around 1988, several women from Charity created the banners for the wall to your right. There are four panels in a series depicting the prophecy of Christ's birth as written in Isaiah. Each Sunday, a new banner will be added crafting the sense of anticipation and progression during the Advent season. This series is based on Old Testament readings.

These lessons from Isaiah tell about a time when people will return to God. There will be justice and peace. The stump of Jesse and the barren desert will sprout and bloom. Sorrow will give way to joy, war will be replaced by peace and God will give his people the ultimate sign: a virgin shall conceive and bear a son. Although each banner is independent, all four together form a unified panorama.

**The first banner** is a mountain towering over a barren desert. This represents the mountain of the Lord spoken of in the first reading from Isaiah.
