Justice of the Peace Service

The JP Service at The Old Post Office which operates each week from Monday to Thursday 10.00am to 1pm is part of a state-wide network called "JPs in the Community" provided by the Department of Justice and the Attorney General. Last year, JPs in the Community volunteers worked together and volunteered over 135,000 hours at 220 signing sites, assisted over 672,000 clients and witnessed over 1.97 million documents. The above statistics do not take into account the countless JPs and CDecs who assist the public through the online after-hours register, at their workplace or within their local community networks.

Our Buderim JPs are proud to be part of this very significant volunteer network. To give you an idea of the contribution they make to the witnessing requirements of local citizens, they average about 300 clients and 1000 documents each month. In 2021, because of the Covid lockdowns, numbers were down somewhat, but the service at Buderim assisted 3088 clients, and witnessed 9619 documents.

BUDERIM FOUNDATION – Community Grants



The Buderim Foundation held its annual Community Grants Celebration on Saturday 10 September. This Celebration is considered one of the most important dates in the Foundation's calendar. The Community Grants are designed to support the activities of local organisations serving those who live in the 4556 postcode area. Since the grants program began in 2008, 201 grants totalling almost \$732,000 have been distributed to 90 organisations. This year, grants totalling \$59,879 were awarded to 14 local organisations, listed below:

Australian Volunteer Coast Guard Association – \$3,754 for upgrade of Automatic Identification System on Rescue Vessel "Rotary III"

Buderim Concert Band – \$3,850 for the replacement of musical stands and towards band uniforms

Buderim Historical Society – \$2,478 for upgrade of computer archiving system to facilitate access to the archive by members, school groups, etc

Buderim Male Choir – \$3,421 for a new keyboard to accompany the Choir at practice and performances

Buderim Men's Shed – \$4,620 for a wood turning lathe for use by members

Buderim Mountain State School P&C – \$10,000 for new, more sustainable lighting for the School Oval and Tennis Court.

Buderim Wanderers Football Club Inc – \$5,175 for a new public address (PA) system for use at Club games and events

Cittamani Hospice Service – \$5,061 for specialist medical equipment for loan to patients to enable them to remain at home comfortably and safely

LifeFlight Foundation – \$7,253 for new safety equipment to support LifeFlight rescue helicopter crew



Maroochydore SES – \$2,100 for a 'Short Throw' projector to be used during activations to display operational tasking information for the Incident Management Team

Siena Football Club – \$6,685 for 3 portable soccer goals for training, coaching courses and soccer game fixtures

St Mark's Anglican Church Buderim – \$458 to purchase and promote a street library and bench seat, encouraging personal connections and promoting reading in the community

SunnyKids – \$3,874 towards the cost of new case management laptops to help connect people and coordinate services for vulnerable Buderim families

University of the Sunshine Coast Athletics Club – \$1,149 for a portable public address (PA) system for use at training and events.

The Foundation's Community Grants are made possible by donations and bequests from supporters. Only the income from these donations is used for the grants, ensuring a forever fund for the Buderim community.

BUDERIM GARDEN CLUB - Celebrates The Spectacle of Spring

The annual Buderim Garden Festival will run from Friday 21 October to Sunday 23 October. The festival will attract gardeners and interested spectators from around South East Queensland. The festival will centre in and around the Buderim War Memorial Hall (corner of Main and Church Streets, Buderim). A major feature of the festival is the competitive Spring Flower & Photographic Shows including cut flowers, floral arrangements, potted plants, foliage, hanging baskets, bonsai plants and garden photography. Adjacent to the hall there will be a Quality Plant Markets selling a wide variety of garden plants.

The Flower & Photographic Shows and Quality Plant Market, based at the Hall, will be open - Friday 21 Oct (twilight session) 4-7pm, Saturday 8am-4pm and Sunday 8am-2 pm, see photos below.

There will be 6 Exclusive Open Gardens in the Buderim area which are selected to showcase the diversity in size and style of gardening in our area. Visitors will be able to see the Open Gardens by either using their own transport, or without traffic and parking problems via a free shuttle bus service operating from the Hall. The gardens will be open Saturday 8am-4pm and Sunday 8am-3pm. See photos below.



An inclusive weekend Festival ticket for all of the above is \$20.00, or \$3 each (\$5 family) entry only to the Spring Flower Shows in the main hall and the Garden Photography in the hall foyer.

We welcome bus groups, and a discount of \$15 is available for pre-booked groups of 10 or more. Please book as early as you can, so that arrangements can be made for your tickets to be sent (postage cost) or, these can be picked up at the Hall or at the 1st Garden visit on the day of your trip.

Pre-Purchased Festival tickets will be available at Manawee Nursery, the Old Buderim P.O., Buderim Newsagent or Buderim Bendigo Community Bank branch and on sale @ Hall during the Festival. At the Craft Cottage, adjacent to the Hall, is the home of Buderim's artists, potters and sculptors who will present their exhibitions including "The Sculptured Garden" which features sculptures, along with unique planters, outdoor wall art and functional and decorative pottery.

Next door to the Hall is St Mark's Church which will be decorated with floral arrangements. Light refreshments will be available on site at the Craft Cottage, with the Buderim Village Green across the road having local Cafés, the park being an ideal place to wander and picnic.

SUNSHINE COAST CHORAL SOCIETY

The year 2022 is the final year that Adrian King will be the conductor and music director for the Sunshine Coast Choral Society, the Noosa Chorale and the Sunshine Coast Symphony Orchestra. Recently, on 10th September, at Venue 114 Lake Kawana, and again on 17th September at St Andrew's Anglican College, Peregian Springs, all three combined in a program featuring three of Adrian's favourite pieces of music – two compositions by George Gershwin:

An American in Paris Suite, and Rhapsody in Blue, and Carl Orff's monumental choral Cantata, Carmina Burana. It was the final combined choral performance for Adrian King, retiring conductor of both choirs and orchestra, and very special for all involved.

The solo pianist for the Rhapsody was Theodore Pike, who is originally from the Sunshine Coast and who has had a long and fantastic association with the Orchestra. Adrian King described his execution, interpretation and style as superb.

Judit Molnar, Soprano, Ron Morris, Tenor and Daniel Smerdon, Baritone, were the concerts' brilliant and wonderful vocal soloists, with pupils of the Sunshine Beach State High School, under the tutelage of Andrew Burns, covering the 'Ragazzi Chorus' parts. Both concerts achieved full houses of enthusiastic and appreciative audience members.

The Choral Society's final performance under Music Director Adrian King will be a Christmas concert, to be held on Sunday 11th December 2022, at 2pm, at Gregson and Weight Memorial Chapel, Wisers Road Buderim. We are very happy to welcome new singers. The choir rehearses on Wednesday nights from 6.45pm to 9.30pm at the Lakeshore Community Church of Christ, North Buderim.

Conducted by Emily Cox, the magnificent, combined chorus will be joined by Brisbane Philharmonic Orchestra and soloists Leanne Kenneally, Soprano, Tobias Merz, Tenor and Jason Barry-Smith, Bass.

Haydn's monumental oratorio *The Creation* depicts and celebrates the creation, the wonder and beauty of the world. This radiant vision of the Genesis creation story sparkles with vivid word painting and exuberant choruses. Haydn's musical wit and astounding inventiveness as he describes a whole menagerie of creatures with a great sense of humour is delightful and the glorious and optimistic music is truly uplifting.

Oriana is so excited to be joining with Brisbane Chorale for this once in a lifetime opportunity," said Oriana President, Melissa Innes. "A work of this scale is something rarely seen or experienced and we know Sunshine Coast and Brisbane audiences are in for a real treat."

The Creation is one of the most popular of all oratorios. The first public performance of the work in 1798 in Vienna was sold out well in advance, so patrons are advised to book early. You won't want to miss this musical event of the year.

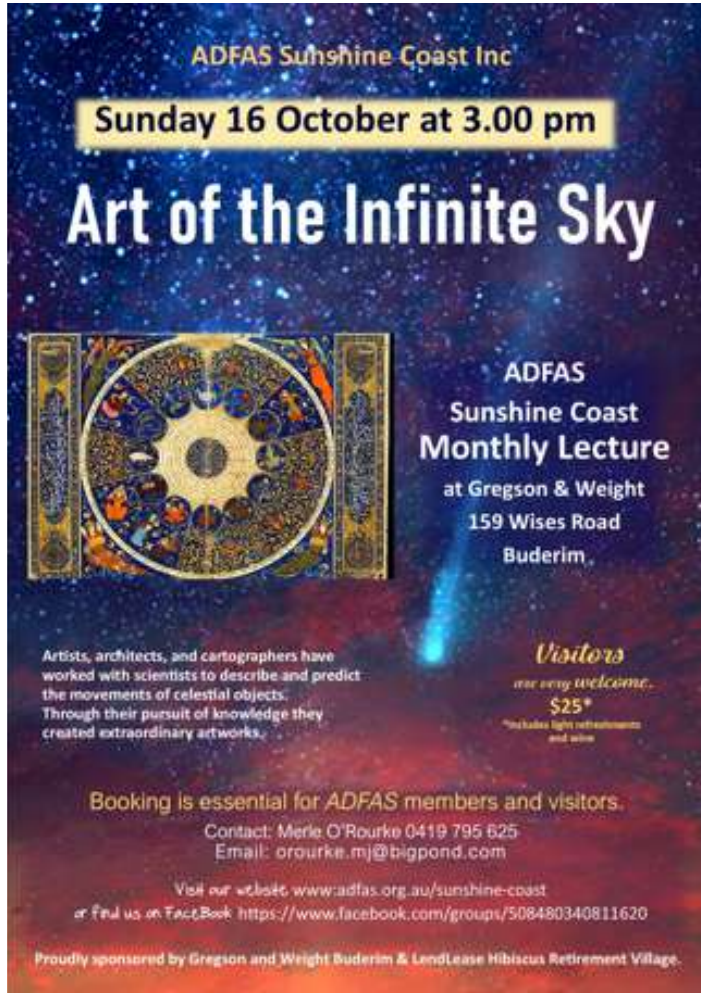

ADFAS SUNSHINE COAST – October Lecture

Our October lecture is Art of the infinite Sky, presented by Sam Bowker, on Sunday 16 October at 3.00pm



Dr. Sam Bowker has graciously stepped in for our October lecture.

Sam's lecture will take us in a different direction through celestial artworks. He will survey some of the most remarkable astronomical artefacts from the early modern period, including Indigenous Australian, Indian, Islamic and Renaissance astrological charts, astrolabes, armillary spheres and orreries, as exquisite relics from the history of art and science.

Artists, architects, and cartographers have worked with scientists to describe and predict the movements of celestial objects. Through their pursuit of knowledge, they created extraordinary artworks. Now that the James Webb telescope is fully operational, we are seeing magnificent new images of ancient and distant stars that no one has ever seen before.

Dr Sam Bowker is the Senior Lecturer in Art History and Visual Culture at Charles Sturt University, where he is also the Sub Dean of Graduate Research.

And I knew there was hope for me yet.

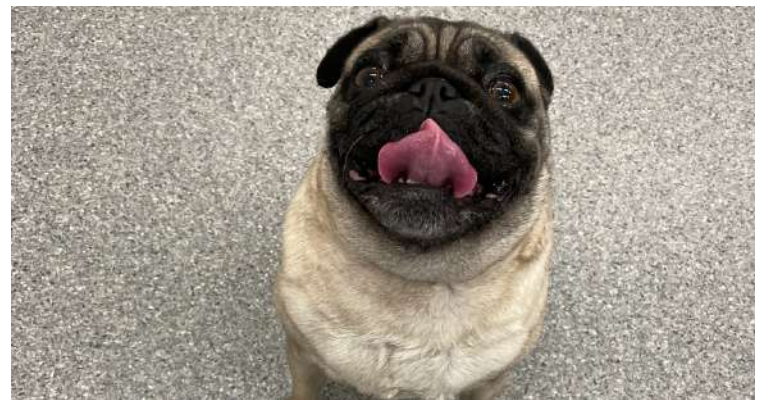
I loved the makeover that they gave me then

LOCAL AMBULANCE COMMITTEE



Did you know that the Queensland Ambulance Service provide fact sheets – these have recently been updated and you can find them at <https://www.ambulance.qld.gov.au> – fact sheets. Make sure that you take the time to peruse these fact sheets.

Heart attack

A person experiences a heart attack when there is a sudden partial or complete blockage of one of the coronary arteries that supply blood to the heart muscle. As a result of the interruption to the blood supply, there is an immediate risk of life-threatening changes to the heart rhythm. If not corrected quickly there is also a risk of serious, permanent heart muscle damage. To reduce the chance of sudden death from heart attack, urgent medical care is required – **every second counts**.

A heart attack is usually sudden and onset may occur at rest or under exertion. A heart attack is different from – but may lead to – cardiac arrest.

Recognition

The casualty may experience one or more of these symptoms:

- ◆ Pain, pressure, heaviness, tightness or discomfort
- ◆ In the chest, neck, jaw, arm/s, back, shoulder/s
- ◆ Nausea, a cold sweat, dizzy or short of breath.

Discomfort or pain in the centre of the chest may start suddenly or come on slowly over minutes. It may be described as pain, pressure, heaviness, tightness or discomfort. The pain may be severe, moderate or mild. The pain may be limited to, or spread to, the neck, jaw, arm/s, back or shoulder/s.

Some people are more likely to describe atypical or minimal symptoms and include:

- ◆ The elderly
- ◆ Women
- ◆ People with diabetes and/or chronic inflammatory conditions (eg rheumatoid arthritis)
- ◆ Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders, Māori and Pasifika people.

These people should seek urgent assessment by a health care professional if they have any warning signs of a heart attack, no matter how mild.

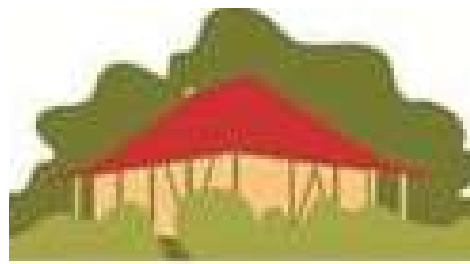
