This was followed by a festival in the Hall gardens, various display stalls inside the Hall followed by music and dancing demonstrations by local groups. Our adjoining Craft cottage exhibited their local art competition to very large audiences. The Evening was capped off by drinks on the veranda and supper dance. All these activities were very well organised and well attended.



BWMCA Annual General Meeting

President's Report to AGM

Well, what a way to close off the year with the hugely successful celebrations marking the centenary of our Memorial Hall. There were so many highlights featured in the three functions; be it the fabulous variety showcase on Friday night; the procession of classic cars and affiliates' displays inside the hall and on the stage or dancing to the Big Band on the Saturday night.

All embraced and strongly supported by the Buderim community. A big thank you to our Secretary, Ian McKaskill and his dedicated committee for planning and executing what must go down as landmark event in Buderim.

Funding

Speaking about our hall, you may have noticed that we have stepped up the maintenance programme over the past few months and our thanks go to volunteers Col Parker, Kevin Power and Craig McMillan who have saved the BWMCA thousands of dollars through their efforts.

However, there are some projects of a much larger scale that require attention e.g. roof repairs to the hall and library, internal and external painting of the hall and roof replacement of Pioneer Cottage.

In an attempt to meet these costs, we have embarked on a fund-raising campaign by seeking long-term sponsors, establishing a GoFundMe page and conducting a major Art Union in the new year.

You will see from the financial results that we have had a successful year overall. The hall is the major contributor to that despite ever-rising costs. It is also our major asset (apart from Roxxie) and we need to keep it attractive and its facilities in good repair. Our thanks to Treasurer John Meckan for keeping all the dollars and cents together and his valuable commentary on the state of the nation every month.

Some of our funding comes from grants to assist in staging events, procuring additional facilities or for general administration. During the year, nine grant applications were successful yielding \$50,200 whilst eight event sponsorships raised \$13,500. These funds ensured that BWMCA could undertake projects here at the hall and provide events for the Buderim community.

We acknowledge Buderim Foundation, Buderim Bendigo Community Bank, Sunshine Coast Council grants program and the inaugural Sunshine Coast Airport community fund. We are grateful for the expertise of Vice-President Dougal Pitt for his input in this area.

Events

I spoke earlier about the success of Hall's centenary celebrations. We seem to have a reputation of doing things rather well. You just have to look at the Anzac Day parade, the Dawn service, the Main service and the Remembrance Day commemorations organized by the sub-committee, chaired by Brett Green. Jazz in the Park, chaired by Teale Ring. The Community Carols lead by Andrew Butterworth (10 years). This year we featured a new event, Dogs Day Out, organized by a sub-committee under the stewardship of Executive Committee member Steve Budden.

All very successful due to the quality of chairman and members of those sub-committees. That success also relies on the support of our very hard-working volunteers, without whom we could not function, we are very fortunate in this area. Again, a big thank you to all concerned.

Affiliates

We continue to receive great support from our affiliated organizations as members of our Association and we value that support. This community is unique because of its strong community spirit, something this organization is charged with promoting. There is so much goodwill, support and co-operation between each other as evidenced, not just by those participating in the hall celebrations, but throughout the year at every community event, this is truly a special community.

Administration

As we raise our profile in the community by introducing new events such as Jazz in the Park and Dogs Day Out and the one-off Hall Centenary celebrations, the workload in the administration area has increased proportionally with all the myriad of extra tasks required. Fortunately for us we have Roxxie.

Roxxie handles all the multitude of requests from numerous people and the public so professionally, always willing to help, is courteous, shows respect and above all she gets things done, never stinting of her after-hours time to meet a deadline and the monthly Newsletter is just sensational. Always supportive of me as President, which has been fantastic, always acting with the best interests of the BWMCA at heart and coming up with new ideas. We are really blessed to have Roxxie. Thank you for all you do Roxxie, it is greatly appreciated, you are a true treasure.

Conclusion

Over the past four years that I have been privileged to be your President, we have together, in a small way, lifted the profile of the Association in the community by successfully staging the various events that we do.

We have focussed on refurbishment and maintenance of our properties, painting the exterior and interior and refurbished the layout of the OPO, upgraded electronic equipment, installed new air conditioning, stage lighting and sound system in the hall, revised procedures in the administration area and maintained good relationships with our affiliated members whist maintaining the

VALE: GEOFFREY REYNOLDS HOLE



3 January 1938 - 14 November 2024

Our Buderim community recently lost a much-loved mate and tireless community worker, aged 86, after a period of illness in recent years.

Upon retirement after a lifetime's career in journalism and media, Geoffrey Hole and his beloved wife Leona moved to the Sunshine Coast over twenty years ago and purchased a home in Buderim's Eckersley Avenue.

Geoffrey promptly threw his considerable energies into supporting his new community and provided valuable contributions to the Buderim War Memorial Community Association and especially its ANZAC Day Sub-Committee, the Buderim Foundation and the Foote Sanctuary Association. Geoffrey also played a key role in the establishment of the Buderim Community Bank - a franchise of Bendigo Bank. He also keenly enjoyed a regular round at Headland Golf Club of which he was a member.

Geoffrey was a 'one-off' and social occasions were enlivened by his countless, hilarious anecdotes of sundry characters from his media days.

The following delightful and loving eulogy was penned by Geoffrey's brother Keith Hole who clearly displays the same wonderful penmanship for which Geoffrey was renowned.

"In speaking about my beloved brother, my mind is inevitably cast back to our younger days when we lived together under the one roof. We body-surfed together, played backyard cricket, and the highlight was when Geoff was diagnosed with myopia, and our elder brother (Gil) and I used to mock the boy with our hands up to our eyes simulating spectacles. The resultant follow-up was being chased around the yard by a cranky Geoff wielding a lump of firewood.

When our father died in 1956 (I was 13, Geoff in fourth year high school), the family was left virtually destitute. The family (sans me) decided that, for Mum to have some form of income, Geoff would have to leave school early. The Walsh family (our mother's maiden name) sisters' mafia (several of whom were married to Bank of NSW managers) pulled strings and lo and behold lucky Geoff got a job in the Wales main branch in Newcastle. He loathed it, but stuck with it and attended Tech at night studying Accountancy. Many a night whilst studying I would hear him coming down the driveway accompanied by a squealing noise. Geoff's bike did not have the luxury of braking capacity, so a well-placed foot on the front wheel sufficed. I didn't dare look to see if he had any lighting.

I will never forget this act of selflessness - I was regarded as the one to go on to Uni so could not be permitted to leave school early. He persevered for several years and got transferred to Sydney. This was his making. He left the bank and travelled to New Zealand on a yacht with some mates. Whilst in NZ his yearning for journalism came to the fore - he had always been keen on literature. He jagged a job with the NZ Truth (the name gives it away that it was a bit of a rag). He quickly learnt one of the tricks of the trade when, whilst sitting in the pub with his colleagues, he announced to them that he had an assignment to go and report on an international hockey match. They said to him, "Look it's not a rugby match, it's a nothing game," and convinced him to stay in the pub, as all good journalists do. So they turned on the radio, listened to the game, and Geoff wrote his match report accordingly.

He came home from NZ in 1962 for Gil's marriage – he was best man, I was groomsman, and yes it was a formal wedding. So there we were, the three of us, in "Tails". God I felt stupid as did Geoff. Mum thought we looked wonderful. A photo was taken of the three of us standing in chronological order, and Mum in front addressing us. Here's a fine example of Geoff's sense of humour. The ultimate photo was in pride of place, when Geoff struck. We had an aunt Queen (mum's sister) who was an imperious soul, older than mum, and a bit of a bully. Geoff wrote a caption which he put under the photo. It was Mum saying, "Look I know it's only aunty Queen coming but I just wanted you to look nice".

He landed a job with the Sydney Daily Telegraph, and quickly had success. He was made Shipping Roundsman, apparently one of the best positions in the game. One day he was told he was to go out very early the next morning on a launch, with a photographer, to catch the arrival of the then largest warship afloat – the USS Enterprise – an aircraft carrier of enormous proportions.

It was a drizzly, misty morning as they went out to the Heads and awaited the ship. Geoff wrote a prize-winning article, which hit the front page of the Telegraph together with his by-line attached, an honour indeed. His heading was, "Out of the mist rose a Wellsian monster".

During this time his political leanings had subtly moved across the great divide, from centre-left to ever so slightly centre-right. He landed jobs over the next years with various conservative politicians (Ian Sinclair, Peter Coleman, John Fahey). He and Leona married in 1965 (I was his best man), and they set off for the UK. In late 1965 I went the same way with a group of rugby buddies, and on the six week boat trip I advised them that Kathy was following me over and that we would get married. Boy was that a buck's party and a half. Geoff and Leona were absolutely great in looking after Kathy, and he was my best man.

It was from then on that we started to lose contact with them. We arrived home in early 1969 and by then they had acquired a house and shortly afterwards two beautiful daughters, Justine and Sam. We caught up intermittently over the following years, less so when they moved from Woolwich in Sydney to your part of the world in Buderim. No doubt Sam can fill you in on the happenings of those years. The last time we had face-to-face contact was in November last year when we assembled in Brisbane for Gil's 90th. As usual, Geoff was as generous and loving as always.

One last anecdote. He often used to come down to Newcastle for his Newcastle Boys' High annual re-union, then meet up again with all his buddies for morning coffee on the Monday. I often joined them, and on one occasion I was to then take him to the train for his trip to Sydney. I loaned him my Seniors Opal card for the trip. One of his mates said, "Keith, do you think Geoffrey will return the card?" My reply was, "I'm not worried about the card, it's the \$2.50 I'm concerned about". Sam, please take note of that for when the estate is being settled.

To finish I can't really put into words (he was the wordsmith) our strong, deep love for the man. When Sam sent the message that he had gone, I cried – a lot. As Sam said to me in a text, "He was a gentle man".

Geoffrey, when next we catch up, just remember that your drink is Pinot, mine is Shiraz.

Goodbye, my darling brother. Geoffrey, you made a difference.

Requiescat in Pace! Keith



On Friday the 8th and Saturday the 9th of November 2024, the Buderim Community celebrated the centenary of the opening of what is now known as the Buderim War Memorial Hall. In 1924, the Hall was officially opened as the School of Arts and after a couple name changes and some renovation works and extensions, the Hall became the centre piece of Buderim as we know it today.

At the instigation of the Buderim War Memorial Community Association, BWMCA, an initiative was born in early 2024 to have a major celebration of the 100 year birthday. Starting with an invitation to all the BWMCA Affiliate Groups, an ideas workshop was held and out of that came the draft of a two-day program. A Committee was formed by willing volunteers and over the next 6 months the program was fleshed out, broken into stand-alone activities that would all come together as a complete seamless program. The underlying aim was to be true to the 1924 birth of the Hall and to link that through time to our celebration in 2024.

On Friday the 8th November, a Variety Concert was held in the Hall to recognise local talent, including Oriana Choir, Buderim Male Choir, Sunshine Statesmen and Riley Cope Creative. 

It was great news to hear from the Sunshine Coast Council in October that Buderim Craft Cottage's (BCC) application for funding the Upgrade of Solar Power at BCC in the "Major Grants Community Facilities August 2024" round had been successful. Amount Funded: \$10.000. This will enable the installation of a 19.8kW solar system and a roof access system for the maintenance of the system. It will be part funded by the Sunshine Coast Council with the remaining cost of \$14,962 funded by BCC. Council consent for the Upgrade of the Solar System project has been given and an instalment is scheduled for December 2024. The Buderim Historical Society has received a National Library Community Heritage Grant of \$16,000 to engage an expert conservator.

The conservator will assist the Society to identify significant objects in the collection requiring conservation. Mentoring and training will also be provided for the Society's volunteers in both preservation and conservation techniques.

The National Library Community Heritage Program provides community organisations with funding to assist with the preservation of locally owned, but nationally significant collections.

The Buderim Historical Society's collection includes items that illustrate Buderim's nationally significant role in sugar, coffee and ginger production and manufacturing.

Society President Kevin Briggs thanked the National Library of Australia for the community heritage grant.

"It will enable the Society to preserve significant items in the collection from the effects of heat, humidity and light in Buderim's sub-tropical climate, ensuring that they will be available to future generations."



Major Track Upgrade Completed

The steepest walking track in the Foote Sanctuary is the Northern Boundary Track. This track links the Grant Street entrance to the access through Irene Sheen Park off Jeune Drive. It has been a challenge for regular walkers and dedicated fitness fanatics due to its steepness. The original track was very badly eroded, due to inadequate drainage and stone steps originally installed by volunteers were becoming unstable.

Foote Sanctuary Association volunteers looked at existing alternatives to the track, and consultation with staff of Sunshine Coast Council, developed a proposal to rehabilitate the track. This involved relocating the top half of the track to reduce the slope and install additional prefabricated concrete steps on the steepest section of the track.

The creek crossing at the lower end also needed modification to allow easier access. A grant of \$6,000 was received from the Council in 2023 to purchase the materials for the upgrade. The work was to be carried out by Foote Sanctuary volunteers who attended for a few hours every Thursday morning. Work was suspended during the summer months due to the hot weather, but resumed in May 2024. It was estimated that the work by volunteers would take up to three years to complete, with volunteers already committed to routine maintenance in the Sanctuary.

Work started at the top, with clearing of the new track, and as the track was formed the surface was covered in Road Base gravel. The work has now been completed, with additional steps supplied with assistance from the Sunshine Coast Bushwalking Club. Approximately 120 steps were installed and twelve cubic metres of road base spread on the track surface. It appears that the work has been successful with an increase in the number of people using the track. With the onset of wet weather Sanctuary volunteers are monitoring how well the new track is coping with heavy rain.


