President's Message

Welcome to our May Newsletter.

Last week, from May 19 to 25, was National Volunteer Week, Australia's largest annual celebration of volunteering, established in 1989. This special event highlights the important role of volunteers in our community and invites people not currently volunteering to give it a go.

Approximately 1/3 of our population Australia-wide volunteer in some form or another according to government statistics. This sounds like a lot of people, but you only have to consider the response to our many natural disasters to see the response from community organisations.

Our BWMCA is one such organisation staffed solely by volunteers with only one paid employee. Our Old Post Office is a good example of these volunteers at work with our team of approximately 24 Community JPs who give their time freely to help people with many differing legal documents vital to the efficient functioning of our society. Also in residence is a team of 33 volunteers staffing the OPO Information centre answering the many questions of visitors to our town, helping with local information, brochures, book sales and more.

The many events held by the BWMCA would not be possible without the dedicated committees that make the two "Anzac Day" services happen, the "Dawn Service and Street Parade" and "Memorial Service". This event is one of the biggest and best-attended on that day in our area. We also partake in "Australia Day" celebrations in the Buderim Park, another hugely popular celebratory event with local families.

"Remembrance Day" in Foote Sanctuary is held as a Memorial Day on 11th November to honour Armed Forces members who have died in the line of duty. This day would not be possible without dedicated community members who give their time freely to make this day a success.

Our "Buderim Community Carols", held prior to Christmas is another volunteer event that is hugely popular with families at this time of the year. "Jazz in the Park" and "Dogs Day Out" are both hugely popular with families and dog lovers alike which cannot happen without our dedicated groups of volunteers, among them "Buderim Muscle" and various event Management Committees.

In the back streets of Buderim resides our "Pioneer Cottage" which house the local "Buderim Historical Society" in this historic house built around 1882. The society established in 1966 consists of a group of dedicated volunteers working to preserve and maintain the Pioneer Cottage and the history of the area.

Our Community Hall along with the BWMCA organisation was established at the end of the Second World War in 1945 and has been maintained by dedicated local volunteers over the last 80 years. The decision was made at that time not to have a stone monument to honour our Diggers but to create a living monument to the sacrifice of our men and women in uniform, and so the BWMCA was formed.

Our Hall is currently the Hub of our community and is subject to approximately 1,100 single events with 32,000 regular users and approx. 50,000 total users each year. This puts enormous maintenance, and upkeep demands on this ageing building, all supplied by our BWMCA members, financed by the income from the Hall use and the activities held by the BWMCA. All maintenance, admin and upkeep is done by a small, dedicated team of volunteers aptly named the "Amigos", without whom the Hall could not function. We are all eternally grateful for their efforts. Any person with some time to spare and some practical skills is welcome to join the happy band.

Volunteering in your community has many benefits and is not just a past time for retirees, there are more volunteers in the under 40s age group than any other.

Volunteering offers numerous benefits for people, including improved mental health, enhanced social skills, and increased career prospects. It fosters empathy, builds confidence, and provides opportunities for personal and professional growth. Volunteering can also lead to greater self-esteem, a sense of purpose, and a stronger connection to the Community.

What's Happening at the Old Post Office

Hello to all our Members, Affiliates and Readers! Welcome to another edition of our newsletter.

I'd like to start by thanking Roxxie for all her hard work in getting this newsletter out each month. Having seen firsthand every month, the effort, time and creativity it takes to produce time after time, I can't help but be very thankful for each edition. So Roxxie – a BIG THANK YOU from all of us! We appreciate and look forward to this colourful, informative publication.

For those who love figures & statistics, the number of walk-ins and phone calls to the OPO over 21 operating days for May is a total of 674, which is an average of 32 per day.

We at The Old Post Office are very pleased to introduce you to another new product that we are involved in and selling. Have you heard about the "Australia Adventure Passport"? No? Neither had I, until a woman walked into the OPO one day and asked me if we had a stamp to put in her passport.

After finding a stamp with our name & address, I stamped it for her and started to do some investigating myself. Long story short, we are now participating in this new venture! They are passports that people travelling around Australia or State or wherever, can pop into any participating 'destination' and have a special stamp to add to the pages, to show the places/towns they have visited. They are great for anyone travelling and not only for children, (who will love them!) but some adults will also enjoy using them. If I travelled more, I would use one! Imagine giving your grandchildren & great-grandchildren one each, to use as they travel around with Mum & Dad or with you. You could also get stamps from places that are not participating in the program, like that woman when she came to us.

So now, we are officially a 'stamping destination' and have our very own, unique stamp, designed by Roxxie and have the passports to sell for \$10 each. The front-inside has a cover page to glue in your photo and write details, just like a real passport! In the back, there are two pages to make notes about the trips – My Adventure Notes, an Aussie Dictionary, Fascinating Facts about Australia, Travel Games, Aussie Word Search, Aussie drawings to colour-in. In size they are a good 17cmx12cm, 17 pages to fit lots of stamps as well as the pages that I mentioned above. They come in a quality, clear-plastic sleeve. Please pop into the Old Post Office to have a good look. They will make great birthday, or Christmas presents or 'just because'. 





BUDERIM VIEW CLUB CALLS ON COMMUNITY TO GIVE GENEROUSLY TO THE SMITH FAMILY'S WINTER APPEAL AND HELP REDUCE THE EFFECTS OF CHILD POVERTY

NEW SURVEY REVEALS OVERWHELMING SUPPORT TO MAKE TACKLING CHILDHOOD POVERTY A 'TOP NATIONAL PRIORITY

Buderim VIEW Club is urging the local community to give generously to The Smith Family's Winter Appeal this year, to support thousands of children and young people experiencing disadvantage with their education.

It comes as The Smith Family's latest Community Attitudes Survey (CAS) of the Australian public, shows four out of five respondents (83%) believe that tackling childhood poverty should be a top national priority.

The Smith Family CEO Doug Taylor says "poverty shouldn't limit a child's potential", which is why the charity is launching its Winter Appeal today.

The Appeal aims to raise almost \$8 million by the end of June 2025 to support students experiencing disadvantage by providing access to proven out-of-school educational

"The results of our Community Attitudes Survey show Australians recognise poverty has an impact on a child's education," Mr Taylor says.

"However, what many people don't see are the hidden impacts of disadvantage and the incredible emotional, social and academic toll that can have on students during and after their schooling.

"But the right educational support at the right time through The Smith Family's evidencebased programs can make all the difference to those students and give them the tools and resources to fulfill their potential.

"By donating to the Winter Appeal, Australians can help young people most in need by giving them access to extra learning tools, so they can get the most out of their education and create better futures for themselves.

The Smith Family's student2student is a one-on-one program that brings an older and younger student together to read once a week.

Learning Clubs are a free, after-school-hours support program that offers tutoring and help students with homework and assignments.

"The evidence-based programs The Smith Family is delivering are as crucial as the financial and personal support we provide to students and families." Mr Taylor says.

"Of the children participating in student2student, 94% say they improved their reading, while 81% of those taking part in Learning Club say it helped them do better in the classroom.

"For people in a position to do so, please consider donating to The Smith Family's Winter Appeal," Mr Taylor says.

"Donations mean we can support more students with access to our programs and provide more help for children and young people experiencing disadvantage.

"Your donation today can have an enormous, life-changing impact for a student."

"Let's make tackling childhood poverty and educational inequality a priority, beginning this winter."


BUDERIM LIBRARY






