**CAST Debuts its Inaugural Exhibition Inspired by a Tarot Deck for the Times** *Tarot in Pandemic and Revolution* honors the collective experience of living through a pandemic with a multidisciplinary event featuring 62 artists from around the SF Bay Area

San Francisco, CA – On Saturday, March 25, 2023, <u>Community Arts Stabilization Trust</u> (CAST) in partnership with <u>Baldocchi Projects & Collaborations</u> and artist/curator <u>Adrián Arias</u> presents *Tarot in Pandemic and Revolution*, an exhibition that unites 62 visual artists and poets from across the San Francisco Bay Area in an immersive display of art, poetry, live music, interactive installations, local food, and tarot at <u>447 Minna</u> and the Parks at <u>5M</u>.

Reflecting on our collective experience of living through a pandemic and responding to this critical moment of social awakening, this multidisciplinary project was inspired by a lucid dream from Peruvian-born, Oakland-based visual artist, poet, and curator Adrián Arias in 2020. After seeing a fortune teller and cards embellished with images of viruses, masks, Black Lives Matter marches, and protests, Adrián set out to make his dream a reality. Inviting over 60 internationally-recognized visual artists, writers, and poets from his community spanning three generations, this project became an outlet for capturing a moment in history unlike any other.

This collaboration brings together award-winning poet laureates, novelists, authors, muralists, painters, graphic artists, performance artists, musicians, and dancers with deep roots across the San Francisco Bay Area. Over 40 artists/poets will reunite for the March opening to activate CAST's indoor community spaces (black box theater, lobby, and 2nd floor) and surrounding park in synchronous creativity. Activities range from live screen printing, mural making, poetry and tarot card readings to an interactive "Illusion Show", another recurring project by Adrián that invites viewers to engage with a blank slate–a room wrapped in white paper–with live drawing, music and poetry readings happening simultaneously.

"Every artist has their own philosophy and way to talk about what is happening in our reality," said curator Adrián Arias. "I'm not the creator, I'm just the instigator. It shows if you use your dreams in this way with your community, you can make it a reality and help reality to be better."

Participating artists and poets used their experiences of the pandemic to create a unique 81-card deck with a corresponding poem for each arcane. This exhibition at 447 Minna marks the first time all 81 original works will be on view to the public and the first time all four floors of the 447 Minna building will be open since CAST completed the last of its renovations in February. Though partially

open since March 2022, CAST's newest 2nd floor was built out specifically to address the needs of the SoMa community for a flex arts and community space. The opening, which honors cultural exchange, community connections, and the vibrancy art brings to neighborhoods, also ushers in a celebration of CAST's 10th anniversary.

"There is so much pride and heart at the foundation of these programs," said CAST Director of Events and Programming Matthew McTire. "It extends beyond the long-term projects we are known for and serves as a foundation for immediate physical space for healers, art practitioners, and creative beings to strengthen their communities and creative practices."

Three years after the initial shelter-in-place order was issued in the Bay Area, this project is both a commentary on life and a symbol of hope and how we can overcome hardship. As a tarot deck and now a community-centered event, *Tarot in Pandemic and Revolution* is a bold expression of resilience, resistance, and the courage to continue forging a path to justice and love.

"This [deck] is a historical document...it captures this moment that we were all in with the uprisings and revolutions and the deep changes and the loss that we're all experiencing at that time," noted Nomadic Press Founder and Executive Director J.K. Fowler, who collaborated on the project and published the deck in December 2021. "It also is a marker for us, of who was in the Bay Area at this particular time. Everyone who played a part in this deck is so much more than their craft, they're actually involved in their communities. They were advocating for change, and they're change makers themselves."
