The Cloud City Wheelers Mission: To Create, Enhance, Preserve, and Promote trail opportunities in Leadville and Lake County, Colorado.

Since 2007 The Cloud City Wheelers have been building and maintaining trails in the central mountains of Colorado. Not just for cyclists, these trails provide locals and vistors to Leadville/Lake County with unique outdoor recreation opportunities adding to the quality of life and to the economic vitality of the Upper Arkansas River Basin.



Some words from our Executive Director... It gives me great pleasure to see the amount of work we've been able to accomplish since that first meeting in a living room on 5th Street in 2007. Since then we have grown the Leadville Winter Mountain Bike Series into the premier fat bike series in the state and added year round trail opportunities to our region with the addition of groomed singletrack in the winter. We've built over 25 miles of trail mostly within 3 miles of downtown Leadville with 14 miles of trail built since taking the Executive Director role in 2018.

2022 brought our community one of our most productive years ever, as we welcomed back some of our amazing trail builders Scott Giffin and Michael Wilks along with some great new hands and a new excavator (Thanks Trail 100 Legacy Foundation) that helped build 3.5 miles of new directional trails on private prop-

erty (3 years of planning and negotiations) let's not forget the start of our new and very much improved Huck Finn Park. Because of our AMAZING members, supporters, partners, and donators (YOU) we were able to build the new pumptrack after 3 years (2020 doesn't count) of local fundraising and grant writing efforts. We did this while we maintained our existing trails and worked with our land management agencies to decrease the maintenance backlog on our local system trails.

One more thing we did this year was tweak our mission to better reflect what we do. We changed our mission from providing cycling opportunities to TRAIL opportunities as we see our efforts benefitting a wide range of trail us-ers; we build trail so all types of users can get outside and have fun. Our Leadville/Lake County community relies on groups like ours to step up where others can't, to build and maintain community assets and infrastructure that help increase our important quality of life and to add to the economic vitality of our rural mountain county. We are able to do all this because of YOU: our members, our donors, our local businesses, our volunteers, our racers, our community. Unlike a lot of surrounding areas where the trails rest for the winter and inside work takes over, our work ramps up. We hosted over 500 racers in the 2022 Leadville Winter Mountain Bike Series and groomed over 300 miles of the Timberline Trail System providing Leadville with the best winter singletrack system in the state. In addition to that we added an additional 1.75 miles of winter only trail to an already awesome system!

NEW TRAILS!

IEW/WINTE TRAIL BUILT BY

After 3 years of negotiations regarding easements and land use we broke ground on our first trails located on property otherwise closed to the public. These new trails are the closest singletrack to town as they leave from the Landfill Rd. and travel up to the Swamp Angel tailings pile overlooking the Yak Treatment Plant and Leadville. The new trails aptly named Yakety Yak and Swamp Angel are directional trails helping to eliminate any user conflict caused by speed and two way traffic. The trails were made possible through funding from Climax Molybdenum, The Leadville Trail 100 Legacy Foundation, and The Life Time Foundation.

12 NEW MILES

The Wheelers built all these trails (3.5 mi.) for under \$40,000. The average construction cost of trail in Colorado is \$30,000 /per MILE!
