This is the Day of Resurrection

The joy of Great Lent rests in knowing that we are preparing for the day without evening and without darkness; the bright and everlasting day of Pascha. It is for this very reason that the spiritually brightest service of the whole year is served as early as possible, in the physical darkness. The Paschal Divine Liturgy brings light and fills the darkness with bright joy. As the earliest Divine Liturgy of the year by prescription, we serve it just after midnight, or in the early morning. This is *intended* as a disruption to our normal schedule, just as the resurrection of Christ is a disruption of the power of death. Light breaks through and throws down the darkness. On this night we do something that we do on no other night in recognition of how momentous the resurrection of Christ is to our lives. Orthodox Christians around the world celebrate the same way as the Holy Fire emerges from the altar, the Church sings "Thy Resurrection O Christ our Saviour..." and soon after, the great Paschal troparion.

This disruption is easier for some than for others. Parents struggle to know when and how it is appropriate to bring younger children. What we have found over the years is that, one, children absolutely love going to Church in the middle of the night; and two, it serves as a kind of rite of passage as they get older. Younger kids can come in their pajamas and even bring pillows and sleeping bags. They love sitting in the dark Church and receiving a candle to hold. But eventually they need to sleep and can go in the corner, or, if there's room, on the pew, or in the children's room or library with a parent standing nearby. The younger ones may get up to receive communion or they may sleep through it. They will usually remember the first Pascha they made it all the way through without sleep, and some will do it much younger than others. When *we* approach it with anticipation and joy, they pick up on it and do so also. It becomes a highlight of their memories of Church while growing up.

For other members, it may be hard to drive at night, or their health may not permit it. It's good to plan

ahead and carpool with others if driving at night is a worry. And even if that is not possible, the Holy Church does not leave us without benefit. The Vesperal Liturgy on Saturday morning already contains the Gospel of the Resurrection, and it is the service in which we change the colors to white. If we receive the Mysteries then, and come back later on Sunday for Paschal Vespers, we still enter into the bright joy of this greatest of feasts. Even the Liturgy on Bright Monday follows the exact same pattern and spirit as the Paschal Liturgy in the middle of the night – we call it Bright Week because the light of Pascha just keeps on shining, and no matter what our station in life or our limitations, we can still enter into the joy of the Lord.

The more we embrace Great Lent and see it as a wonderful tool to grow in Christ, the more we experience the overwhelming beauty of the Paschal services.

Pascha is coming this month. Pictured below are some items you may need. Consider EGG WRAPS, which are easy to use, and it looks as though you've made Passanky eggs. (medium eggs work the best). We have WOODEN EGGS in various patterns, too. We have various BASKET COVERS besides the one below. You might need a DECORATED CANDLE for your basket or your table. We do have several patterns of PASCHA CARDS that come with envelopes. The HOLY WEEK CROSS comes with a stand to display in your home.

The board in the picture is filled with Faberge-Style RESURRECTION EGGS. You wear these in place of your cross from Pascha until Ascension. We have BOW PINS and some CHAINS for attaching your egg.

If you need CHEESE MOLDS OR BUTTER MOLDS, we may need to order them. Remember, too, we have individual service books for Holy Week. Please advise us now if you need special icons or other items not mentioned, so we can order them.
