The King is Here: Full Healing

On Sunday we spent some time looking at the incredible story in Luke 17v11-19.

What we can ascertain from this story is that God's intention behind signs and wonders is always relational. Jesus' ultimate goal on earth was to restore connection and right relationship between God and the people He created.

Every healing, every miracle you experience in this life is designed to draw you to the feet of Jesus and bring you into deeper connection with Him.

We received our ultimate healing, salvation, and deliverance through Jesus' perfect sacrifice on the cross. May your heart be stirred up again to respond in praise and thanksgiving for all that His blood has done for you.

Go Deeper.

Our desire is that every person would be empowered to have a deep and intimate relationship with God. We want people to not just hear a word on a Sunday, but get activated in whatever the Holy Spirit is doing throughout the week. The guide is a tool for you to dive deeper into what God is doing in you and through you as an ambassador of the Kingdom.

You can work through these activations and questions on your own or in a group setting. After each activation, take time to pray into whatever the Holy Spirit is speaking. It is also encouraged to have a journal and Bible with you.

For each activation focus will be key. We become like what we give our attention to, and one of the best ways to worship is to focus. Often we will ask that you close your eyes, if this helps you focus, then great, if it's something else that helps you focus, then do that.

Before each activation, take a moment to be still before the Lord. These are not exercises to rush through or items on a to-do list to check off. They are invitations to commune with God and to go deeper. Turn your attention toward Him and invite Him into this time.

At Saints' Hill, we believe that connection with the Holy Spirit is vital to the life of a believer. Discussion and activation are ways to take the teaching and give God a space to speak to you about how it impacts your life with Him. Below are activation options for you to do individually or in a group setting.

For groups:

Discussion

- What stood out to you about this story in Luke when you first read it?
- Think back to a time where Jesus performed a significant miracle in your life/a time where you had a major breakthrough. Did that miracle or breakthrough draw you back to the feet of Jesus in gratitude? Why or why not?
- Do you think it's possible to idolize your physical health and wellbeing in this life? If yes, how so?
- Do you find it hard to believe that everything you need is at the feet of Jesus, and not in the miracle you're praying for? Why or why not?

Activation

Have each person in the group share what Jesus saved, healed, and delivered them from when they gave their life to Him. Confess to one another where you've tried to complete in the flesh what God began in you by the Spirit.

Out loud, all together, collectively thank God for the miracle of relationship with Him, and commit yourselves again to live in His love no matter the circumstance.

Pray for anyone in the group who needs physical healing or breakthrough.

For individuals:

Be Still

What sickness does to the body, sin does to the soul. Take a moment to thank Jesus for what He saved, healed, and delivered you from when you gave your life to Him.

Ask Holy Spirit to highlight ways that you've idolized the breakthrough over connection with Him.

Write down what you hear.

If the Holy Spirit revealed something to you, it's for freedom! Repent of those things and declare these truths over yourself:

I was made for connection with you, God.

Knowing you and loving you is my great reward.

No matter my life circumstance, I have everything I need in Your Presence.

Ways to Pray

We believe that prayer changes things. We invite you to pray with us for a move of God in our town.

- That we would see people in our town come to know Jesus!
- That our people would be hungry for fresh outpourings of His Presence and for the fruits of the Spirit.
- That we would agree with what God says about us and therefore walk in authority and power.
- That as we look at Jesus, our faith for what He desires to do in the earth would increase.
- That there would be an increase in bridal love for Jesus that leads to unprecedented consecration and holiness in the Church.
