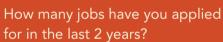

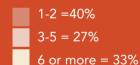


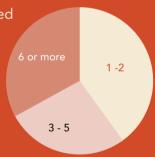

In 2021, The Roots Fund conducted a survey of the community and their experiences working to access careers in the wine industry. Our survey reinforced the need for change:







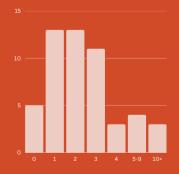

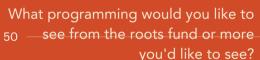

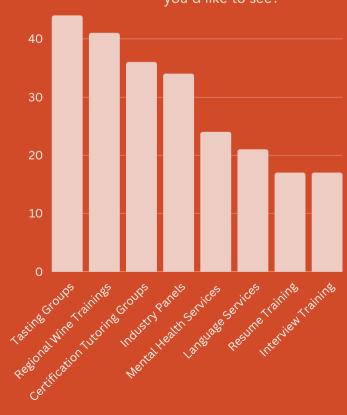

# CHECKING THE INDUSTRY CLIMATE

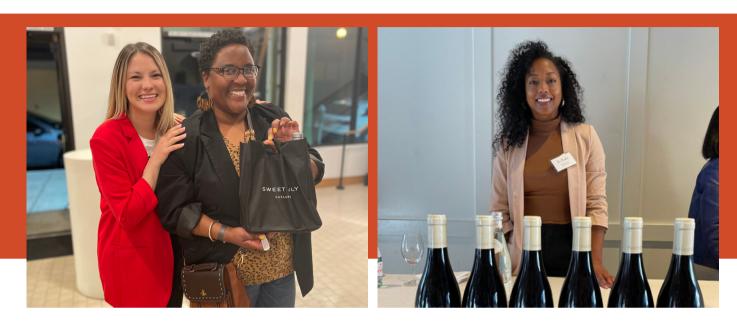
Question: What do you think the wine industry needs to do to attract communities of color?

"Wines are diverse. They carry so much history and have evolved through time. Different cultures and the BIPOC community carry the key to reflect that evolution. Instead of wines being one track minded, we can now be open minded and understand how they are appreciated, perceived, and enjoyed by different cultures."

"Exactly what the Roots Fund is doing, I've never experienced such an awesome organization who is not only holding people accountable but are actively engaging people within the wine world to expand their mind and work model to include all BIPOC. I believe all areas including distribution, sales, vineyards, etc. need to take a page out of The Roots Fund book and make a change! As long as they believe in the change that needs to be made, because if they don't believe then it's not meaningful and is not a genuine change. Their marketing needs to change and the faces behind their brand and company need to be more inclusive."

"Access is the big key for me. It's almost like the wine industry is a paywall. In certain circumstances, that's ok and it works. But for people like me, having the access is everything. There shouldn't be this paywall to get us in the industry. I think we're beginning to see how deserving we are to be here, but to make it easy on the rest and the new people wanting to get in, don't block the access."

# **OUR PROGRAMS**



### **MENTORSHIP**

Every scholar is mandated to have a mentor in our programs. We believe in a reverse mentorship process, so as the scholar is learning about the wine industry, the mentor learns about their life experiences. We encourage mentors to connect through happy hours, and online forums to improve their conversations. Mentorship moves the needle. Those who have great wine knowledge can share their methods for success. These monthly conversations will shape the future of our aspiring wine minds.

### **CAREER**

Utilizing our connections in the industry, we have secured dozens of wineries, retailers, restaurants, and distributors that have committed to hiring Roots fund students with the appropriate qualifications. We are well aware that recruitment and education do not carry value if we can not assist with job placement. Our organization goes through resume repair, interview training, and providing tips and tools in work environments. We make it a point to align with businesses doing true DEI work. Partnering triggers a level of accountability, that is unheard of in the current hiring processes.



### **EDUCATE**

Our fund is based on charitable donations from individuals, organizations, wineries, and educational institutions. Quality education is a necessity to arming these students with the tools they need to be successful in this industry. We focus on scholarships to the most elite oenology and viticulture institutions, HBCU's, as well as independent business schools, and WSET to provide quality education to our candidates that will help to ensure the skills necessary to play an active role in the wine industry.





# 2021 HIGHLIGHTS



### STEP (STUDY, TASTE, EDUCATE, PROSPER)

In partnership with Southern Smoke Foundation, The Roots Fund presents STEP (Study, Taste, Educate, Prosper). The program, which is co-owned by Southern Smoke and The Roots Fund, grants annual scholarship funding to support individuals of the BIPOC community seeking high-quality education as they prepare for certifications in all aspects of wine. Scholarships are awarded via the Wine and Spirit Education Trust (WSET). We're proud to share that the Southern Smoke Foundation has granted The Roots Fund \$80,000 to support this effort in 2021.

Southern Smoke is a nonprofit founded and powered by current and past food and beverage workers that is dedicated to creating a meaningful safety net of support that doesn't exist for most people in the world.







### **MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES**

During 2021, we entered year two of COVID. Time and again, our team noticed that the clients we interacted with were struggling mentally and emotionally. While some had access to therapy through insurance or other means, many simply could not afford it. Our team set to action, activating mental health professionals across the country to donate more than a thousand hours of mental health therapy sessions online. Nearly 50% of those we worked with during 2021 were using these services. We intend to evolve this program into a constant pillar of our work.

# BURGUNDY SCHOOL OF WINEASPIRITS BUSINESS

### **ROOTED IN FRANCE SCHOLARSHIP**

In 2021, The Rooted in France Scholarship was launched. The scholarship, sponsored by Domaine Dujac & Friends, BSB Foundation, Kermit Lynch and Wine Spectator, was created to provide an educational experience for HBCU students/alumni pursing Bachelor's degrees. The Roots Fund saw an opportunity to create awareness around the wine industry, through the Black college community. Most HBCUs have agriculture and business programs that correlate to the wine industry. Our goal was to build a bridge, and we did.

Led by Dr. Jérôme Gallo, the Burgundy School of Wine & Spirits Business is in the top 1% of business schools around the world. The Masters/MBA of Wine focuses on wine business, entrepreneurship, advanced WSET courses, and management skills. The Master of Science in Wine Management (MSc) program allows students to obtain a global vision in the wine industry and also gain management and financial skills in spirits and beer industries.

Scholarship recipients have the opportunity to gain their Masters of Science in Wine Management and/or an MBA in Wine. The MBA program is geared towards post-graduates with professional work experience, while the MSc program is a great fit for the aspiring professional.

Cherita, a proud Grambling graduate was awarded a full scholarship to The Burgundy School of Wine & Spirits Business in France, to pursue a Master of Science in Wine Management and an MBA in Wine & Spirits business. Learning alongside some of the most passionate people in the industry, while creating everlasting relationships to advance their careers in the world of Wine & Spirits. The scholarship is open on December 1st.

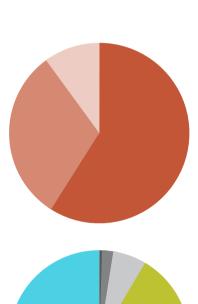

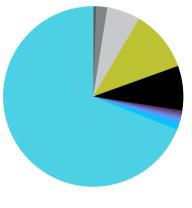

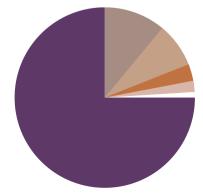

# LOOKING TO THE FUTURE

We are so thankful for those who support us and follow along on our journey to provide communities of color opportunities for career and education in all aspects of wine. As we look to 2022, we have a number of exciting projects and goals in mind. Here's what to expect in the coming year:

Build Fermenting the Future, a program set to launch in spring in NYC. This program explores the pipeline of high school to wine business or wine business college programs.

Expand our enrichment trip: We love taking scholars on trips outside of the country, and in order to expand this program we are focusing on modifying the passport process, TSA precheck, real ID, etc.

Expand our HBCU scholarship through partnerships with Thurgood Marshall, and others. In general, this will include modifying the scholarship process, and defining the program expectations.

Open staff positions in 2022: Educational director, career coordinator, mentorship coordinator. We need more people to create valuable support.
