

TIPS FOR FARMERS

- **During the test call** check how far your face is from the device you are holding for best sound levels etc.
- Prepare an opening sentence and set the scene, e.g. Kia ora/ Hi it's Farmer Marie here and today I'm standing in front of our milking shed....
- Don't worry about questions, you know your farm. It's okay not to know the answer, just let the class know you'll find out and get back to them at the next session.
- Feel free to send a follow-up video or email to your matched teacher about a question that was asked.
- When you receive a question from the students, it's a good idea to repeat the child's question- this gives you more time to prepare an answer.
- Talk positively and ramp up the energy when you can, as this increases the students' enthusiasm.

DO:

- Use headphones.
- Choose an interesting / relevant location (however your farm office is fine if this is where reception is best).
- Ensure you have a good internet connection.
- Use what's around you.
- Introduce your dog(s) and show the animals around you.

DON'T:

- Have a call in the wind.
- Use farming jargon or acronyms, or if you do, explain the terms. Check with your teacher as the class might like to create a farming vocabulary glossary.
- Use wild hand gestures.
- Feel the need to answer all questions.
- Solution Forget to charge your phone.

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
