10th Down Under Berlin Film Festival Announces Lineup

All Screenings in Kreuzberg at Kino Movimento, 21-23 October 2022

BERLIN, 20 September 2022 - **Down Under Berlin** Australian and New Zealand Film Festival (DUB) is back after a 2-year hiatus. The festival announces the

film lineup for its 10th edition, themed "Back to our Nature." The 2022 edition will feature 5 German premieres. In total, **Down Under Berlin** will show six features and sixteen shorts.

The official selection is a combination of films from Australia and New Zealand as well as overseas-based Aussie and Kiwi filmmakers. The full lineup includes five narrative features and one documentary feature. The festival will also present 9 narrative shorts, 3 animations, and 3 experimental short films and one surprise world premiere.

On 21 October, **Down Under Berlin** will open the festival with a Berlin premiere screening of the touching Australian environmental-activist drama **Blue-back**, written by Robert Conolly and Tim Winton, and directed by Connolly himself. With an A-List Aussie cast. The screenplay is based on Tim Winton's 1997 best-selling novel of the same name. It tells the story of Abby (Mia Wasikowska), a young woman reconnecting with her mother Dora (Radha Mitchell), both determined to protect the coral reef of their tranquil seaside town from greedy industrial developers. Australian star-actor Eric Bana is seen here in a supporting role. Watch the official trailer here.

Festival Co-Director Mala Ghedia said: "The last 2 -3 years have been a bit of a wake-up call for most of us. Pandemic, lockdowns (where most Aussies and Kiwis were literally locked out of their homelands), disastrous wildfires and floods, war and inflation. Life seems very grim. We want to be part of a solution so this year, the 10the year of Down Under Berlin we have carefully curated a selection of films reflecting an inner urge of going back to our roots, back within, back to our nature. Here is where we find community, unity, and hope."

Down Under Berlin acquired new collaborations with Tourism Australia and Humboldt Forum Berlin for this year's festival. The Australian and New Zealand embassies in Berlin are returning as long-standing supporters.

The festival films from Australia and New Zealand filmmakers span a variety of genres and topics such as

- Climate change and environmental activism
- Australian indigenous life and dreaming
- Queer identity and fantasy
- Gang violence and questioning belonging
- Self-discovery, love and culture clash

Festival Co-Director Angus McGruther agrees: "With all this happening - people all over the world have felt trauma. With Australian and New Zealand borders open again, families have been able to reunite with expat relatives and friends. The 2022 lineup is about the simple things, real emotions and empathy."
