

Sarah and Fergus, a hopeful young Aboriginal couple, give birth to their second baby. But what should be a joyous time of their lives becomes sinister when Sarah starts seeing a malevolent spirit she is convinced is trying to take her baby. Fergus, who can't see it but desperately wants to believe her, grows increasingly worried as she becomes more unbalanced. Is the child-stealing spirit real or is she the biggest threat to the safety of their family? Jon Bell is one of the most experienced Indigenous Screenwriters in Australia. His television credits include *Cleverman* (ABC), which won a Screen Producers Australia Award for Best Drama as well as being nominated for an AACTA for Best Television Series in 2017. Jon recently made his feature film directing debut from his own script with *The Moogai*.

Sahela (Companion) tells the story of Vir Oza and Nitya Behl, an Indian-Australian couple living in suburban Sydney. Both grapple with Vir's recently discovered gay identity. They must navigate traditional expectations and modern norms, the pressures of family, finances, and Nitya's dreams for their future. **Raghuvir Joshi** embarked on his filmmaking journey by studying directing in Mumbai, India's cinematic epicentre. Following his studies, he built a successful career, contributing to critically acclaimed international films such as *The Man Who Knew Infinity*, *Hotel Mumbai*, and *The Best Exotic Marigold Hotel*.

In addition to his directing prowess, Raghuvir showcased his versatility by co-producing the film *Monkey Man*.

With a growing list of accomplishments, Raghuvir Joshi continues to captivate audiences and solidify his reputation as a talented force in the world of cinema.

With problems on the home front, 16-year-old Murra is on the verge of lashing out. That is, until her policeman uncle averts her self-destructive behaviour with a lifeline: a "photosafari for at-risk kids". On the trail, the teens learn about friendship, first crushes and their true selves, as well as the forces of 'reality' that puncture the bubble of youth. Jub Clerc is a Nyul Nyul/Yawuru woman from the Kimberley in Western Australia. Jub spent many years in theatre before moving into film and television. In 2014, she directed and adapted Abbreviation, a chapter from Tim Winton's The Turning and in 2020 she directed 2 episodes of The Heights S2. Jub's debut play The Fever and the Fret premiered at Yirra Yaakin Theatre Co, and won the 2017 Kate Challis Award. The French translation of the play is in partnership with Maison Antoine Vitez and The Australian Embassy in Paris. Jub credits the experience of the Photo Safari as the inspiration for her life's journey as a filmmaker. It is fitting that her first feature film should be inspired by this remarkable story.

Three very different women's lives fleetingly intersect as they search for belonging in an upside down world. Natalia, a mail-order bride who discovers that her dream of running a cafeteria at her shy husband's remote petrol station is far from reality. Briar, a lonely anaesthetist whose online relationship with her sister's ex disintegrates on their first romantic weekend together. Faith, a wealthy empty-nester forced to reassess her opulent life when her latest investment property includes a dead tenant in its chattels. **Loren Taylor** is a director, actor and writer from Aotearoa New Zealand. Her feature directorial debut *The Moon is Upside Down* won Best First Feature at Tallinn Black Nights and played to sell out houses at the 2024 Sydney Film Festival. Her most recent short film *Hey Brainy Man* co-directed with Jo Randerson was awarded Best Short Film at NZIFF 2023.

Two Hands

AU | 1999 | 103 min | Dramedy English | English subtitles Director: Gregor Jordan Starring: Heath Ledger, Rose Byrne

Nineteen-year-old strip club promoter Jimmy (Heath Ledger) is just scraping by in the red-light district of Sydney. When local crime lord Pando (Bryan Brown) offers him a shot at working for his syndicate, Jimmy jumps at the chance to deliver a costly package. But, when Jimmy gets jacked by a couple of kids, he's indebted to the dangerous gangster for \$10,000. Running out of time, he schemes to rob a bank to save himself and the beautiful girl he desires (Rose Byrne) from a gruesome demise. **Gregor Jordan** is an Australian film director, writer and actor. Jordan's films include *Two Hands*, *Buffalo Soldiers*, and *Ned Kelly*. Two Hands won the Australian Film Institute Award for Best Direction and Best Screenplay in 1999.

As we mark the 25th anniversary of *Two Hands*, we remember the film that not only captivated audiences with its gritty charm and Australian authenticity but also introduced us to the remarkable talent of Heath Ledger at the dawn of his career. This iconic film, blending crime, comedy, and drama, set the stage for Ledger's meteoric rise in Hollywood, showcasing his undeniable charisma and depth as an actor. *Two Hands* remains a timeless classic, reminding us of the early brilliance of a star who would leave an indelible mark on cinema history.

A 17-year-old student is forced to get off the fence he has actively sat on all his life to stand up for himself, his whanau (family) and his future in this heartwarming story of identity. Paul Middleditch has directed four feature films to date and is regarded as one of the top performance/ action TV Commercial Directors in the world. He is Australasia's most awarded Commercial Director, having over 300, with 8 Cannes Lions, 4 of which are gold, and numerous International and National awards to his credit. He was recently ranked 8th Best Commercial Director of all time, based on Lüzer's Archive. He has continually upheld a Number One Director World Ranking on Best Ads on TV, with Carlton Draught's Big Ad being awarded the Best Beer Ad of All Time. His work has featured at the Super Bowl for 6 consecutive years and he is one of the few Australian creatives to have appeared on the cover of Shots Magazine.

The Bells and their workers have a mission: to keep their carnival alive and thriving, and to keep it in the family. This sixth-generation travelling show family have been touring Australia for a hundred years, and now, facing some of the toughest times they've ever seen, are preparing to hand over the reins to the next generation with the empire expected to be handed down to the next boy in line. Filmed over 7 years, this epic road trip unveils not only the mystery of the travelling show-people, but also reveals a family grappling with traditional life in a modern world.

Isabel Darling's feature documentary, The Carnival, made its debut at the 70th Sydney Film Festival and received considerable recognition in The Guardian, Sydney Morning Herald, and had The Monthly hailing it as one of the 'top two Australian films at the Melbourne International Film Festival'. Her short film Being Frank (2015) received international recognition and her film Corey The Warrior (2017), was a finalist at both the Melbourne Documentary Film Festival and the **Cannes International Film Festival on** Disability. In 2023, Isabel was nominated for a prestigious Walkley award for her work on *The Carnival*, which is currently screening on SBS.

Beautifully told in their own words, *Freedom Is Beautiful* is an uplifting story of the power of love and our shared humanity.

Angus McDonald is an award-winning visual artist and documentary filmmaker. He is a committee member for Human Rights Watch Australia and was an Ambassador for World Vision's #KidsOffNauru campaign. *Freedom Is Beautiful* is McDonald's first feature film.

From the heart of the desert to the islands and estuaries of Sea Country, Indigenous Protected Areas span over 93 million hectares of land and sea and now cover over 50% of Australia's reserves on land. Indigenous Rangers are on the frontline. Working in some of the most remote corners of the planet they are safeguarding endangered species, fighting wildfires and invasive species, and practising culture in the face of a changing climate.

Beginning her career at ABC TV Sydney, **Bettina Richter** went on to work on documentaries *John Farrow: Hollywood's Man in the Shadows*, *Global Haywire, AQUA, Namatjira* and has written, directed and produced two ABC Radio National documentaries. Bettina oversees all the films at Country Needs People, an Indigenous-led NGO that supports Indigenous Rangers across Australia.




