6. 2020 Post-Fire Watershed Restoration Process Improvement <u>Final Report</u> (Sean Chambers & Brian Craig, Northern Water) (25 min.)

The new normal for fires in our watersheds are increasing acreage megafires. In 2020 there were four wildfires and are the largest now on record. Multiple landowner agencies are involved in larger fires that create more complex responses. Discussed black water events after fires that strain water providers. Whenever velocity picks up it brings down debris from fires and becomes an ongoing issue

for water providers. Costs for fire recovery were shared. Liability and other policy issues were discussed. Outreach, resources, and recovering community engagement take-aways were provided.

7. Colorado Water Plan Letter of Support Request (Barb Biggs)(10 min.)

 Big Dry Creek Restoration Project (Michelle Danaher, City of Westminster and Mile High Flood District) Ecological restoration and nature education project near Westminister City Park. There is severe degradation and poor water quality. The project is approximately 1.7 miles. The full project costs will be in excess of \$15 million. They are asking for a CWCB CWP grant of \$650,000.

A motion was made by Alex Davis for MRT to approve the Big Dry Creek Restoration Project Letter of Support and seconded by David Nickum. The motion carried unanimously.
