

INTRODUCTION

This consultation aims to collect the views of research institutions, businesses, consumer organisations, as well as non-governmental organisations, public authorities, and other stakeholders on the European Union Framework Programmes (FP) for Research & Innovation, **Horizon 2020** (8th FP) and **Horizon Europe** (9th FP).

The consultation has five sections:



Section A "About you" asks information about the respondent's profile.

- Section B focuses on the past programme Horizon 2020 (2014 2020) and aims to collect feedback and evidence to draw lessons from the past. This part of the consultation will feed into the ex-post evaluation of Horizon 2020.
- Section C focuses on the current programme Horizon Europe (2021 2027) and aims to take stock of what stakeholders are currently experiencing to possibly adapt current actions. This part of the consultation will feed into the mid-term evaluation of Horizon Europe, covering the period 2021 2023.
- Section D collects views and opinions for the upcoming Strategic Plan of Horizon Europe (2025 2027). The questionnaire concerns the future societal challenges that should shape future EU research and innovation activities, the strengths and weaknesses of the European R&I system, EU Missions, European Partnerships and synergies with other EU programmes.
- Section E asks about the key lessons learned and messages for the future. If you wish so, you can upload a position paper in this section.

As the consultation looks at the **past**, **the present and the future of European Research Framework Programmes**, some topics are addressed under multiple sections.

Likewise, questions on the programme's implementation and administrative procedures are asked in the two sections to account for the simplification measures introduced in Horizon Europe.

Rationale: Mental health conditions represent the area of unmet needs par excellence and the WEF Global Risks Report 2023 identified severe mental health deterioration as one of the key risk in the years to come. Psychedelic-assisted therapies are emerging as a potent new class of treatments for mental, neurological and substance use disorders, as indicated by the rapidly growing, rigorous, and compelling body of research. In conjunction with proper psychosocial support, they hold the potential to provide safe, rapid acting, and robust clinical improvements with durable effects.

Are there European scientific areas of strengths or weaknesses which should be prioritised in Horizon Europe to keep Europe at the forefront of international scientific competition?

The following major weakness in the area of public health research that needs to be urgently addressed: increased prioritization of psychedelic novel treatments. This is due to the following reasons:

- 1. Mental healthcare is in crisis, and we don't have the tools to truly help millions of Europeans in need. In the EU, a shocking number of over 100 million people are affected by mental health conditions, including alcohol
- use disorder and yet no truly new pharmaceutical treatments have emerged out of the pharmaceutical industry in the last few decades. We urgently need more innovation in these areas and psychedelic-assisted therapies (PATs) are emerging as a potent new class of treatments for mental, neurological and substance use disorders, as indicated by the rapidly growing, rigorous, and compelling body of research. In conjunction with proper psychosocial support, they hold the potential to provide safe, rapid acting, and robust clinical improvements with durable effects.
- 2. There has been a considerable scientific, policy and regulatory progress happening overseas in this area but Europe is badly lagging behind. Taking the US developments in 2022 as an example:
- In January, three Federal agencies: the National Institutes of Mental Health, Drug Abuse, and Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism co-hosted a two-day virtual workshop "Psychedelics as Therapeutics. Gaps, Challenges, and Opportunities".
- In March, the National Academies for Sciences, Engineering and Medicine organized a two day workshop "Exploring Psychedelics and Entactogens as Treatments for Psychiatric Disorders".
- A US Administration letter from May announced that President Biden's administration anticipates that regulators will approve MDMA and psilocybin within the next two years for PTSD and depression. The administration is exploring "establishing a Federal Task Force to monitor and address the numerous complex issues associated with emerging substances. Collaboration across federal agencies with outside stakeholders will be the most effective way" to coordinate this work.
- In June, the US National Institute of Health and the FDA provided details on current US Federal funding of psychedelic research amounting to \$35 million in 2021 alone (https://bit.ly/3RklB4v).
- US Senators introduced the Breakthrough Therapies Act legislation that may enable the Drug Enforcement Agency to make the findings necessary to transfer breakthrough therapies involving Schedule I substances such as MDMA and psilocybin from Schedule I to Schedule II. The bill would remove burdensome federal regulations that impede research and development of drugs that may be inappropriately listed in Schedule I despite their potential to save many lives.

There has been no significant EU-funded research conducted in this area.

Rationale:

Brain health conditions have a huge prevalence, massive costs, can be deadly or highly disabling and are on the rapid rise.

Understanding our brain is an enormous task and brain research is extremely complex. Despite huge scientific efforts, mental and neurological conditions are leading the list of diseases without a known cure. Estimates show that - at a current pace - by 2040 we can prevent only a small proportion of a burden from neurological and mental health conditions: 23% and 14% respectively (https://mck.co/3Hn4aN6)
