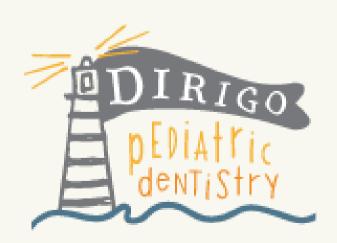

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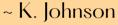




COMMUNITY impact

"I insisted that I breastfeed my daughter but faced numerous challenges in getting the breast milk to her from prison. I reached out to the Maine State Breastfeeding Coalition and The Opportunity Alliance and to my surprise they set up a range of volunteers willing to transport my breastmilk over an hour away to my daughter 2 times per week.

As soon as I was reunited with my daughter almost 5 months later, we were able to get her to latch and our bond has never been stronger."
