



# WELCOME TO THE 11<sup>TH</sup> IRISH FILM FESTIVAL LONDON

Poetry. Music. History. Humour. What vision of Irishness, if any, binds the films in this year's festival together? As recurring themes started to emerge in films we watched on our programming journey for IFFL 2022, we reflected on the stories associated with Irishness the world over. Contemporary Irish cinema presents us with visions of modern Ireland but that longing to understand ourselves through more established cultural practices seems ever present. Perhaps that's why filmmakers in the programme this year have found themselves focusing somewhat on the past?

Here in London, we've been focused in other ways, too. In 2022 we've spent time focusing on what's important for us: as a cultural organisation; as a festival; as Irish people ourselves. That focus has led us to create distinct spaces for both contemporary and more traditional stories in the festival programme going forward. We hope this approach allows audiences to find more of what they want from IFFL as part of a continually growing programme.

We're also more focused in the sense of bringing most of our festival venues back into the West End for this edition. Irish film culture deserves to have a place in the heart of the city during this flagship event and we're thankful to our venue partners for believing in this vision too.

A note on the design focus we've chosen for this festival edition, which was once again crafted with care and attention by Veronica Humphris: for this edition we looked for a way to represent the different strands of activity in the festival, illustrating how they - like us - are interconnected. The resulting design represents a playful approach which might echo the way we think of the emigrant experience as something which is always trying to diverge away from itself in some way. The festival now also has its own distinct logo, emerging from the IFL branding that's become ubiquitous over the years.

Finally, though the festival is a celebration, we also remain focused on the precarity that many in our community find themselves in this year. Households and businesses, cultural and community organisations alike, are all under threat from what feel like successive waves of crisis. In so many ways, we are stronger together than we are apart. So above all, we hope the vision this festival leaves you with is one of a community bound together through the stories we share.

## **AISHA**

Opening Gala

Plus Q&A with Frank Berry and Letitia Wright

Aisha (Letitia Wright), a young Nigerian woman seeking asylum in Ireland, is floundering in a maze of social services and bureaucracy. Alone and unwilling to sacrifice her dignity to satisfy the demands of the authorities, she finds an ally in Conor (Josh O'Connor), an employee at her residence home, a local young man with a troubled past of his own. Together they struggle to maintain their tender friendship in the face of Aisha's increasingly dire predicament and her rapidly diminishing options.

Director Frank Berry's reputation as a filmmaker concerned with highlighting social issues often leads to comparisons with Ken Loach, the difference being Berry's focus on stories which reflect issues in Irish society, rather than Loach's preoccupation with English malaise. With *Aisha*, Berry is tackling the very current issue of Ireland's direct provision system - a system of asylum seeker accommodation which see people living in hotels, sometimes for years at a time.

# **RÓISE & FRANK**

Closing Gala

Plus Q&A with directors Rachael Moriarty and Peter Murphy.

Róise & Frank tells the story of the recently widowed Róise (Bríd Ní Neachtain) who in a small Irish seaside town is struggling in the aftermath of her husband Frank's passing. Grief-stricken and lonely, Róise has distanced herself from the world around her and those dearest to her. But when a stray dog starts to follow her every move, a rejuvenated Róise starts to believe in the reincarnation of her husband and the power of enduring life in its next, hopeful steps.

Róise & Frank is an up-lifting tale of shaggy dogs, a grieving widow and finding hope in the darkest of places and is winning audience's hearts everywhere it goes.

The latest Irish language feature film from Macalla (producers of last year's *Arracht*) and funded by the popular Cine4 scheme is a delightful comedy which has already charmed audiences at the **Dublin Film Critics Circle Awards** and at **Santa Barbara International Film Festival**, picking up awards both times.

We are delighted to close this year's festival with Rachael Moriarty and Peter Murphy's film, which is full of the joy of life and Irish community spirit.

## **AFTERSUN**

Sophie reflects on the shared joy and private melancholy of a holiday she took with her father twenty years earlier. Memories real and imagined fill the gaps between as she tries to reconcile the father she knew with the man she didn't.

In Charlotte Wells' stunning debut film, we are gifted with a very rare thing in the obvious on-screen chemistry between newcomer Frankie Corrio and our own Paul Mescal, who inhabit their roles in such a completely believable way that the narrative ambiguity about their relationship (fellow hotel guests mistake them for siblings) washes straight over us.

But Aftersun's power, like many great films, is also in what we don't see: Wells' great achievement in the film is to give us a rising sense of unease about Calum's mental state, while Sophie herself deals with tricky new encounters as a young female which the freedom of the resort allows her to explore. The film's emotional conclusion is sure to leave a lasting impression.

PAUL MULDOON: A LIFE IN LYRICS

Plus Q&A with director Alan Gilsenan

For Pulitzer prize-winning poet Paul Muldoon, music matters almost as much as poetry. He sees little difference between a poem and song lyrics.

In Alan Gilsenan's surprising musical documentary, Muldoon's creative life is explored by many of the musicians he has worked with in words written by Paul himself.

The unique and innovative format of this 'documentary album' reflects the allusive and playful poetry of Paul Muldoon who narrates this film.

Among those taking part are Paul Simon, Ruth Negga, Bono, Iarla O'Lionáird, Run DMC, Moya Brennan and PJ Harvey reflecting Paul's personal and professional life on both sides of the Atlantic.

## **NORTH CIRCULAR**

Plus Q&A

Dublin's North Circular Road defines the working-class north inner city as it curves from the Phoenix Park in the West to Dublin Bay in the East, passing parks, barracks, asylums, stadia and prisons along the way.

North Circular is an ensemble documentary featuring disparate, marginal urban characters, which explores numerous themes and histories as it progresses along the street.

Its black and white aesthetic conjures a solemn and austere place at first, but the kaleidoscope of people, places and musical performance captured by McManus in the film soon breathe colour enough into this document of Dublin life that one could scarcely say a full colour palette would have improved audience experience.

With the folk music of the area employed as a narrative storytelling device, *North Circular* becomes a creative musical of sorts; the stories told in songs echo the stories coming out of this place, while Gemma Dunleavy's appearance in the film's denouement reminds us that through a new generation of working-class musical storytellers in the city, there's tales still to be told.

# HOW TO TELL A SECRET

+ GHOST LIGHT

Plus Q&A with the film's directors, chaired by Riyadh Khalaf

How To Tell A Secret explores the act of disclosure and the stigma that drives people to withhold a HIV status in Ireland today. Based on a theatre show, the stories in this film move between bodies of young men, migrant women, drag artists and activists. A form-flipping documentary, it features a cast of actors as well as ordinary people coming out on screen for the first time.

Having done the rounds at Dublin International Film Festival and Galway Film Fleadh among numerous others, we're very excited to bring Anna and Shaun's wonderfully experimental documentary to London audiences. Gripping and intriguing from the very start, How To Tell A Secret combines aspects of Panorama-style hidden testimony with performed scenes which are made all the more powerful by Shaun's straightforward, on-camera explanation of how they will combine narrative and performance to create something very different in its form.

As powerful as it is important in its message, films like this remind us that there is still work to do to destignatise and legitimise experiences of people living with HIV.

# THE CRY OF GRANUAILE

+ GILGAMESH

A grieving American filmmaker and her Irish assistant tour the west of Ireland, researching a film about Granuaile, the legendary 16th century rebel and "pirate queen". The two women develop an uneasy intimacy as they journey towards a remote Atlantic island, where boundaries begin to blur between past and present, myth and history, dream and reality...

Filmed in lush 16mm, *The Cry of Granuaile* is a genre-defying blend of psychodrama and fantasy starring distinguished American character actor Dale Dickey alongside a stellar Irish cast.

Not unlike Foreman's previous film, 2018 documentary *The Image You Missed*, this narrative fiction makes ample use of shifting camera formats to subtly but effectively comment on the way we see the world differently depending on who's telling the story.

## **ABOVE THE LAW**

Above the Law links the routes of migratory birds with the journeys of people who traverse the same bodies of land and water.

Unfolding atop a pigeon coop in Cairo, across bird watching towers on a Greek island as well as the border in Northern Ireland, these parallel journeys depict the laws of nature vis-à-vis the rule of man, reminding us that geopolitical are irrelevant to some species.

# MILLION DOLLAR PIGEONS

+ ABOVE THE LAW

Pigeon racing is now a multi-million dollar industry, attracting high-stakes competitors from all around the globe. Pigeon fanciers register their prize racers, box them up and dispatch them to faraway places to compete in a series of lucrative races, but corruption lurks in the wings.

Affluent owners from the US, China and elsewhere enter as many birds as their hearts desire while the lads in the pigeon club in Clondalkin, faced with the hefty entry fees, send just a carefully-chosen few.

This handsome documentary from Venom Films invites us into an unknown world where tensions simmer between old-time purists and the new breed whose eyes are fixed firmly on the big prize.

# BICYCLE THIEVES: PUMPED UP

Mags (played with comedic enthusiasm by Roxanna Nic Liam) is a pizza delivery cyclist with anger issues who has her bike stolen. Mags resolves to hunt down the thief and get her bike back. Hopefully before she gets evicted.

Bicycle Thieves: Pumped Up is a magical realist action comedy set in a very modern Dublin, which pulls no punches in describing the plight of a generation of young tenants with unsecured jobs, unsecured tenancies and unsecured handlebars. The tongue-in-cheek approach comedy is timely,

We first saw this whirlwind of a comedy last year but were surprised to find it had never reached UK audiences. Far be it from IFFL to deny you this laugh out loud experience, so strap yourselves in: we're merging onto the Astral Lane.

# THE BALLAD OF A GREAT DISORDERED HEART

A film about Edinburgh's Old Town and the centuries of adjacent and vertical communities who have called it home. About a handful of streets around the Cowgate which have long housed a proud Irish diaspora. A film about folk music and its power to connect people. A film told through folk music.

Musician Aidan O'Rourke lives in the heart of the Old Town. During lockdown, he got to know three of his octogenarian neighbours, all of them called Margaret, and he listened to their stories. With fresh appreciation for his own family roots, he brings together a group of sensational Irish and Scottish folk musicians and investigates what home and belonging mean and the role of music and storytelling in binding these elements together.

## **OUT OF PLACE**

A meditation on the role music plays in building community, exploring the tensions that emerge when musicians struggle to carve out a space for themselves in their city.

Featuring performances from Denise Chaila, God Knows, Hey Rusty, His Father's Voice, MuRli, and Post Punk Podge & the Technohippies, OUT OF PLACE is an intimate portrayal of a local music scene, capturing the incredible diversity of cultural activity happening in Limerick City.

Exploring music made at a local level, this film follows a variety of musicians as they try to navigate their changing city, in an attempt to find places to create, perform and connect with others. This proves difficult as space provided for culture is always shrinking, turning the act of music-making into an act of defiance.


# SPECIAL EVENT: IN BRUGES

Celebrating the release of McDonagh's new film *The Banshees* of *Inisherin*, which reunites Brendan Gleeson with festival patron Colin Farrell, we're celebrating the film which brought them together in the first place in this special retrospective event.

London based hit men Ray (Farrell) and Ken (Gleeson) are told by their boss to lie low in Bruges, Belgium, following their latest hit, which resulted in the death of an innocent bystander.

While they wait for Harry's call, Ken, following Harry's advice, takes in the sights of the mediaeval city with great appreciation. But the charms of Bruges are lost on the simpler Ray, who is already despondent over the innocent death, especially as it was his first job.

With a morbid, self-effacing humour throughout, and a few high stakes action set pieces to keep our adrenaline raised, *In Bruges* is a classic Irish film which deserves a repeat viewing as part of the festival.

# AUDIENCE CHOICE WINNER: AN CAILÍN CIÚIN / THE QUIET GIRL

Ahead of every festival we find ourselves at IFL pining for the films that have come and gone throughout the year that we didn't get to screen in a festival context. But we can never decide which one we think is the best Irish film of the year...

So this year we let our audience choose for us, from a shortlist of three, determined by info we collected from our audiences through the year. By far the most popular of these options was Colm Báiread's runaway success story of 2022 - An Cailín Ciúin.

Set in 1981, the film tells the story of a young girl, Cáit, who is sent away for the summer from her dysfunctional family to live with relatives she has never met. Slowly, in the care of this couple, Cáit blossoms and discovers a new way of living, but in this house where affection grows and there are meant to be no secrets, she discovers one.

# WAR OF THE BUTTONS

This year's family film is a classic film with a Hollywood sheen, though its setting is far from the glamour of the big studios. John Roberts and David Puttnam's vision of rural Ireland is in this case, one which is characterised by the friendly and innocent use of stereotypes to build an ensemble of characters which we are drawn to as the film's battle-driven plot develops.

In the film, the children of Ballydowse and Carrickdowse engage in battles in which they cut off the buttons, shoelaces, and underwear of their captured opponents, in order to get the boys in trouble with their parents. The gangs go to battle throwing stones and getting ever more cunning in their strategies as things escalate. But which side will be victorious?

This screening will be followed by one of our popular craft workshops run by Kabutar Arts.

# THE WHITE HANDKERCHIEF

+ A SPECIAL LIVE PERFORMANCE

January 30th 2022 marked the 50th anniversary of Bloody Sunday in Derry. As the City came together to commemorate the event, a bold new piece of musical theatre was staged in the Guildhall - the intended, but never reached, destination for the fateful 1972 Civil Rights march.

Commissioned by Derry's Playhouse Theatre, The White Handkerchief sought to create a dramatic elegy to the fourteen killed alongside those others injured, and to catalyse a bold creative legacy from those devastating events.

The result is a bold experiment which renders the events of Bloody Sunday on a vivid new audio visual canvas and seeks to inspire a new generation of local talent in musical theatre, offering a bright and unexpected legacy of that day 50 years ago.

For IFFL 2022, we are proud to host both this exciting film which covers the creation of Kieran Griffiths play, but also a live performance, recreating scenes from the play itself, in the cinema. Film director Vinny Cunningham and theatre director Kieran Griffiths will also join us for a Q&A on the entire creative process.
