


GEORGIA VEHICLE REGISTRATION AND EMISSIONS INSPECTION HOW-TOS

An annual emissions inspection is required for **2023** vehicle registrations for **1999 – 2020** model year gasoline-powered cars and light-duty trucks (8500 pounds GVWR or less) for the following 13 Georgia counties: Cherokee, Clayton, Cobb, Coweta, DeKalb, Douglas, Fayette, Forsyth, Fulton, Gwinnett, Henry, Paulding, and Rockdale.

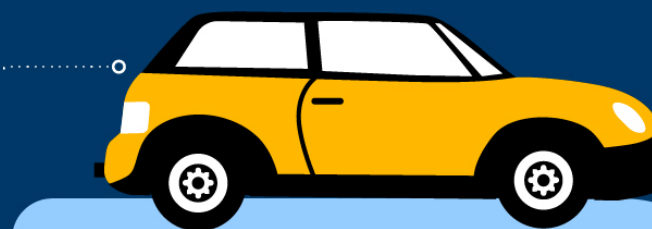
 **Registration renewal dates coincide with the vehicle owner's birthday.**

Each year vehicle owners will receive a registration renewal notice from their county tag office in the mail far in advance of the registration renewal date.

It is recommended to have your vehicle inspected **four to six weeks prior** to the registration renewal date.

Inspections can be performed at any Georgia's Clean Air Force inspection station.

You must receive a passing inspection to complete your vehicle registration. An emissions inspection is valid for 12 months or one registration renewal, by the same owner.

Your inspection results are sent to your county tag office electronically at the time of testing. When renewing online, the system will search for a current, valid inspection.

Registrations can be done online, in person at a county tag office, by mail, by phone, or at a self-service tag kiosk.



If you are new to Georgia or the 13-county testing area, you need to test and register your vehicle with a valid Georgia driver's license or ID within 30 days of moving to one of the 13 covered counties.
