

GETTING ON THE ROAD 2017

Modus received initial funding from the Tulsa Area United Way and was supported, in partnership, by Youth Services of Tulsa (YST) and TCPTP during the pilot year (April 2017-April 2018).

MODUS BECOMES 501(C)(3) 2019 Modus received tax exempt, 501(c)(3) status, moves operations out of Youth Services of Tulsa and becomes and independent non-profit.

2016 A COMMUNITY NEED

In 2016, the Tulsa Campaign to Prevent Teen Pregnancy (TCPTP) shed light on the fact that many young women in Tulsa could not access reproductive health services because they lacked transportation. TCPTP proposed the problem to the Mine, who selected the issue as one of their projects for their annual fellowship program.

2018 MODUSED BEGINS

Through a partnership with Tulsa Transit and Tulsa Public Schools, ModusEd begins to offer transit trainings classes for high school students. Together, Modus Drive and ModusEd increase youth transit use, reduce agency spending on inefficient transportation and increase access to healthcare and social services.

2020 EXPANSION OF SERVICES

Modus Drive expanded to serve individuals of all ages through partnerships with senior-serving organizations. Modus begins talks with Tulsa Transit to provide "trainthe-trainer" classes to teach individuals working in the social service field.

2022 DRIVING FORWARD

Modus continues to thrive as an organization dedicated to removing barriers through innovative solutions. After receiving an innovation grant from Tulsa Area United Way, Modus Delivers begins to deliver fresh groceries to homebound seniors.

THE PROBLEM

A confluence of factors, ranging from suburban sprawl to inequity across historically marginalized people, have created transit deserts. These are areas where people do not own or cannot afford cars and/or lack convenient access to other major forms of transportation. Some of the largest transit deserts exist within and outside of cities with transit systems in place; this is the case in Tulsa.

Transportation barriers contribute to disparities experienced by under-resourced communities.

Tulsa Equality Indicators Report, 2021



Roughly 20% of the Tulsa population cannot access the health services they need due to inadequate transportation options in the area. Many others do not have access to reliable, affordable, and safe transportation to reach social service appointments, jobs, and school. Ultimately, this problem leads to poorer education, lower employment rates, and decreased physical and mental health compared to those who have reliable transportation. Transportation vulnerable people become isolated in their communities, cut off from access to health and mental health care, social services, and educational and occupational opportunities.




INNOVATIVE SOLUTIONS

MODUS DRIVE

Modus' flagship program, Modus Drive, provides safe and reliable transportation by utilizing trained and vetted volunteers and staff drivers. Modus drives clients who have been referred by an authorized partner agency. This year, Modus provided 9,029 rides to 618 Tulsans from thirty-four partner agencies.



MODUS DRIVE STATS




Rides by Service Type in 2022

MODUSED

Modus trained thirty-five individuals from sixteen local social service agencies how to teach their clients to utilize public transportation. MODUS DELIVERS

In partnership with Catholic Charities and LIFE Senior Services, Modus announced the launch of a new service: Modus Delivers. Funded through an Innovation Grant from the Tulsa Area United Way, Modus Delivers was created as a way to delivery dignity and nutrition to seniors who are homebound.

Through Senior Link (a program of LIFE Senior Services), staff have identified reliable transportation to be a significant barrier for approximately 80% of seniors. In addition to transportation vulnerability, many of the seniors in Tulsa face financial hardship, which forces many to choose housing or utilities over fresh groceries. Modus Delivers addresses both food and transportation insecurity. The program works to eliminate food deserts in Tulsa at a reduced cost and to provide autonomy for individuals to make their own healthy dietary decisions.
