An important message from the Seigneur A NEW DEVELOPMENT PLAN

It's been 57 years since Sark formally considered the future of island development. Then the relatively new Committee for Preservation of Natural Amenities, now better known as the Development Control Committee, commissioned a plan. The plan and its proposals were narrowly voted down. Since then, our island has drifted on without a master plan for its sympathetic development. The time has come to put this right.

I am a director of the newly formed Sark Property Company, a Guernsey-based entity set up to facilitate potential significant investments in Sark. This aims to include the purchase of property, investments in infrastructure and facilities for residents including affordable housing, and financially supporting the introduction of a mortgage programme. As part of the process the company, in collaboration with key stakeholders, would like to see an independent, objective assessment of what the island needs and what aspirations the community has.

The one organisation I felt has both the expertise and the natural affinity to deliver this objective assessment is The Prince's Foundation, one of the legacy foundations created by King Charles III before he ascended to the throne. It has decades of experience in urban planning in the British Isles and elsewhere.
