

HOW SHOULD WE ADDRESS AN INCREASINGLY SCARCE RESOURCE?

Water is life. It is a resource vital to sustaining life on this planet-from filling up a water glass at the dinner table, to washing clothes, to growing food across millions of acres, water is life. While the Earth may seem like it has abundant water, less than 1 percent is available for human use. The rest is either salt water found in oceans, fresh water frozen in the polar ice caps, or too inaccessible for practical usage. As population and demand on freshwater resources increase, especially here in the Southwestern region of the US, concerns over the supply and shortages loom.

Solving the water crisis in the Southwest is complicated and involves a lot varying and sometimes competing interests—farmers, city dwellers, conservationists, Indigenous tribes, recreationists, etc. What we hope to accomplish in this pub theology is explore our response as Christian people to the water crisis through a Scriptural and theological lens while learning more about the perspectives of Colorado River stakeholders.
