Second, for those of you that were at homecoming in 2011 when we presented Morehouse with the ceremonial \$100,000 check, you will remember that we issued a challenge to the other fraternities and sororities to do the same. I am happy and proud to say the Alphas, Kappa's and Delta's have become endowed! This means We have started and lead a charge that has created \$500,000 in endowment funds at Morehouse and Spelman!

As I continue to say, I truly believe the Psi Chapter Endowment Fund is the most important collective accomplishment of One Psi/The Soul, the graduate Brothers of Psi Chapter. It represents and exemplifies all of our Cardinal Principals.

In the 2014 update we challenged the Brothers to get us to \$200,000 - our donated capital is \$193,079 through September 30, 2015. We reached that amount because of the support of our largest donor - Brother Gilchrist, who joined Omega Chapter on August 21, 2015.

A special shout out to the LY-ON 9, Spring 1984. They have donated \$6,100 since homecoming and having donated \$16,172 since the endowments beginning. Congratulations leading all lines from the 1980's.

Finally, I would ask you to think about our Chapter's 100th anniversary. What things, events do you want us to do to commemorate our 100th anniversary and what are you willing to do to help. #### Captain James Leon Gilchrist

After graduating high school, he attended and received his Bachelor of Arts degree from Morehouse College in Atlanta, Georgia and his

Masters of Public Administration from George Washington University in Washington, D.C.

In his professional career, he served as the Director of Quality Management with the Florida Department of Corrections, past Florida State Director of the United States Selective Service System. Captain Gilchrist retired from the United States Navy after twenty-eight (28) years of service to our country, twelve (12) years of which were as the Commanding Officer of NROTC Unit at Florida A&M University.



He was past President of Tallahassee Rotary Club, past President of Southern Scholarship Foundation, Emeritus Board Member of Southern Scholarship Foundation and past President of Sigma Pi Phi Boule. He confessed Christ as a young adult and joined Bethel A.M.E. Church where he was a member for over 30 years. He was a devoted and faithful member of the Greeter's ministry.

On Friday, August 21, 2015, God summoned James Leon to his eternal home. In addition to his parents, he was also preceded in death by his wife, Tina Gilchrist; son, Jai Leon Gilchrist, Sr.; brothers Clarence, Melvin, Bernard, Edward and Prince Edward Gilchrist; sister Ethel Gilchrist Stroud.

Quiet spirit, strong of faith, caring heart and caring hands, he loved helping others. He always had words of wisdom and encouragement to share. He enjoyed nurturing his fruit trees and most importantly sharing the harvest.

He leaves to cherish his precious and loving memories, one grandson, Jai Leon Gilchrist II, of Murrieta, CA; foster granddaughter, Chassidy Youngblood, Atlanta, GA; daughter-in-law, (Ret.) I remember when I got the call from Brother Gilchrist. I was just getting ready to sit down in my barber's chair. When I answered and realized it was a Psi Chapter Brother from 1953. Needless to say, I got my haircut an hour later. To make a long story short, we spent the next hour finding out how much we had in common as it relates to the importance of black philanthropy, estate planning and giving back to institutions and causes that are important to you. I look back and understand he may have known that his time was approaching. He understood what we had accomplished and was very proud of the "young" Brothers and the Endowment. He mentioned he had just made a large gift to the school before he knew about the Endowment, but hoped he could do something for the Endowment later. A few months later John Monds and I got a report from the school with a big jump in value. Brother Gilchrist had donated \$25,000. A few months later he donated another \$5,000!



### Endowment

**Definition:** the property, funds, etc., with which an institution is **endowed**.

**Endowed:** to provide with a **permanent** fund or source of income: to endow a college.

The Omega Psi Phi – Psi Chapter Endowed Scholarship Fund at Morehouse College is part of the Morehouse Endowment which is valued at approximately \$130 million. All donations to the Psi Chapter Endowment are tax deductible (consult your tax advisor). All contributions in the Psi Chapter Endowment count toward your class goal.

## The Importance of the Morehouse Endowment and The Psi Chapter Endowed Scholarship Fund

The measuring stick that President Wilson uses is the endowment – expense ratio. Ideally, an institution's endowment-expense ratio should be 10-1, meaning its endowment is 10 times its annual expenses.

Among historically black colleges, Spelman College has the highest ratio – 4-1, Morehouse is second with 1.3-1. Morehouse's endowment is only \$130 million when it should be closer to \$1 billion! Excerpt from *Atlanta Business Chronicle*, March 15, 2013. Every dollar we raise helps us to close the gap. We all know that the major, core issue in our community is a lack of capital. Education, employment, health care and other issues in our community have a common core, a lack of capital.

The Endowment is our way to help address this issue at Morehouse.
