

2016 Homecoming Report

As of Morehouse College's fiscal year end, June 30, 2015, The Psi Chapter Endowed Scholarship Fund had an audited market value of \$205,084. Morehouse uses a prior three year ending FY market value to calculate an average endowment value for the current year's awards. Based on the College's up to 5% spending policy, the Psi Chapter Endowment has \$8,372.61 for scholarships for the 2016-2017 school year.

Donations from October 1, 2015 to September 30, 2016 totaled \$71,848.28. This represents \$47,950.99 in fraternity donations and \$23,897.29 from the Coca-Cola match. (Provided by John Monds)

Dosh R. Jackson, Sr.

February 22, 1911- September 23, 2016 Initiated into Psi Chapter- Spring 1935

Mr. Dosh R. Jackson of Atlanta, passed away on September 23, 2016 at the age of 105.

The Omega Service of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. was held on Friday, September 30, 2016 at The First Congregational Church, followed by Visitation.

Survivors are his children, Dosh (Sandra), Michael (Glenda) and Marguerite (Julius); grandchildren, Scott, Nicole, Kia,

Renaldo, Maria, and Keith; great grandchildren, Jorre', Dosh, David, Taaj, Regis, Raine, Aubrey, Brooklyn, Xavier, Cadence, Brielle, Savanah, and Sage.

Known for his high energy, electric smile and zest of life, Mr. Jackson was recognized throughout the city of Atlanta by Mayor Kasim Reed, City Council President Caesar Mitchell, and Governor Nathan Deal, among many, for his outstanding contributions and service to his city, state and community.

A supremely talented free spirit, Mr. Dosh Jackson was musically inclined and played both the violin and the saxophone. Doing everything from shining shoes to working in a barbershop and as a cashier as a young man, he had a thirst for knowledge and for how things worked. He was fascinated by electronics and love to build things. He lived through two world wars, segregation in the South, and the Great Depression. He witnessed the terms of 19 presidents and remembered vividly when he paid only five cents for a loaf of bread, 35 cents for a half-gallon of milk, and \$700 for a new Ford.

Mr. Jackson was full of life and enjoyed each day he lived and every person he met. He loved people and wanted to make an impact on his family, community and the world for the better. Actively involved in a number of organizations and causes, he was simply iconic within his fraternities.

Close to his heart was being a member of the Masons and his role with his beloved Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. to which he was a financial member for 81 years and proudly known as the oldest living active member. "Dosh" was initiated into Psi Chapter at Morehouse College in 1935 and subsequently founded Alpha Sigma Chapter at Morris Brown College in that same year.

Mr. Jackson was resilient and determined. He was the light of his family and in his community.

At 102, he wrote an abbreviated autobiography in which he proudly shared that he was blessed to still be able to exercise regularly and communicate with his friends via Facebook and email.

The time since last year's homecoming has been both bitter and sweet. For those of you who attended last year's banquet our special guest was Brother Dosh Jackson. Our chapter and fraternity's oldest living brother. Last year was the second time he graced us with his words and spirit.

Brother Jackson entered Omega Chapter on September 23, 2016. He lived a life that represented our cardinal principles. His son told me that over 500 Omega Men attended his Omega services. I know Psi was well represented and I thank my line brother, Gerald Brown, for making sure we honored Dosh properly. Thank you to all the Brothers who attended Brother Jackson's homegoing. The time and history he shared with us was profoundly moving and meaningful. I have never seen Brothers so focused and on the edge of our seats as when Brother Jackson told us of his time pledging at Psi, his quest to get a chapter at Morris Brown and meeting the Founders. He will be missed. Safe travels my Brother.

Brother Murray Luke Townsend, Jr. entered Omega Chapter on June 5, 2016. He was initiated into Psi Chapter in the fall of 1939 and he was the father of Fred "Brutus" Townsend who preceded his father into Omega Chapter.

This was also a very good year for Psi Chapter. We had our biggest year of donations to the endowment. This year we raised over \$71,000 thanks to your many and sizeable donations and helped by the Coca-Cola challenge which was in excess of \$23,000.

Thanks to each and every Brother who donated and helped us to have such a successful fundraising year! Each and every dollar will make a difference for young Morehouse Men and Psi Chapter brothers for the rest of our lives and beyond. Please think of the power of that each time you give.

Finally, it is our Psi Chapter's 95th anniversary and we should all take a moment to celebrate 95 years of service, friendship and brotherhood by young men of like attainment at Morehouse College. In December of 1921, Morehouse Omegas petitioned their national leadership for a charter during the conclave held in Atlanta. Since then, the Men of Psi Chapter have positively impacted every field of endeavor whether in the local community or in the highest positions of influence throughout the world. Let us not rest on past accomplishments but strive to do even better, for humanity needs us more than ever.

We have created a legacy.
