In our pause, we say thanks to our wives, and our children. You have supported for all these years. We are family.

As we talk about our Psi's 97th anniversary and our 100th we think about the legacy of the current Brothers of Psi Chapter. What legacy will we leave at the 100 year milestone? What will be talked about 100 years from now? Will it be the individual accomplishments of a few extraordinary Brothers? We're sure some names will be remembered. There is a lot of work on many fronts to keep Psi Chapter – the G.O.A.T. Not the least of which is our 100th.
