I know are already planning another retreat with more Brothers for more progress and fellowship. Thanks to this group we now have a yearly working weekend.

As you can see we have much to be thankful for and plenty of work to keep us busy as we do our part to make a difference. We need your help Brothers to accomplish all that is possible.


