Guest speaker -

Steve Lelewer gave us a very informative talk and demonstration on U V resin embellishments to woodworking projects. He offered hints for how to work with resins and various decorations, and what materials work better than others. There are small molds and resins available at local stores like Hobby Lobby and Michaels.

The resin cures when exposed to U V Light, in short periods of time. Black backed materials cure faster. Sizing can be applied to help fasten materials prior to applying the resin. Glitter and semi-transparent materials work better than opaque materials like metal powders. He produced a beautiful decoration for a ring in a very short amount of time while the club watched. Very impressive Steve - Thank you!

7:00 pm: Meeting called to order – Previous meeting minutes approved.

Finances (Arie K.): EOM April balance \$2,999.52.

Membership (Steve R.): 42 active members. 36 members have paid 2025 dues to date. (Not including 1 comp, 5 emeritus.) 19 members at the April meeting, wth 2 guests.

Raffle Discussion: (Paul W.)

\$100 in tickets sold at the last meeting. Expenses were \$103. \$30 proceeds from the 50-50 raffle..

Toy project (Paul W.): **Several** Boats and Planes in stock, approx half the numbers of cars already made that are needed for the November wheels and axles meeting. Hathaway activities to concentrate on blocks and sanding cars

New Business:


This month we have two submissions, from Chris Voien and Michael Perovich. Thank you both!
