

## The Ordination and Consecration of The Reverend Canon John Toga Wea Harmon

As a Bishop in Christ's One Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church And Fourteenth Bishop of Arkansas

Episcopal Collegiate School Little Rock, Arkansas A warm welcome from the people and the Episcopal Communities in the Diocese of Arkansas, Bishop -elect John Toga Wea Harmon, Bishop Larry Benfield, and the Standing Committee to this service of ordination and consecration of our Bishop. This is a holy and life-giving moment in the life of our Christian community, and we hope that you will find meaning and joy in this worship and that your faith in God will be strengthened.

The ordination of a bishop represents a singular moment in the life of a local Church. The bishop stands in a pivotal relationship of service and support for all the congregations, schools, ministries, and institutions of a diocese that seek to make known the saving grace and work of the Gospel of Jesus Christ in the world. The bishop is also a visible link for the local Church with the wider Church, reminding us that our common life depends on, and is related intimately to, our sacramental communion with Christians throughout the world. Further, the bishop is the visible sign of the succession of apostolic communities that stretch back in time to the first apostles whom Our Lord Jesus Christ gathered around himself in his earthly ministry.

Today, we also celebrate the feast of the Epiphany. The name "Epiphany" is derived from a Greek word meaning "manifestation" or "appearing." Anglican Prayer Books interpret the word with an alternative title, "The Manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles." The last phrase, of course, is a reference to the story of the Wise Men from the East.

A Christian observance on January 6 is found as early as the end of the second century in Egypt. The feast combined commemorations of the visit of the Magi, led by the star of Bethlehem; the Baptism of Jesus in the waters of the River Jordan; and Jesus' first recorded miracle, the changing of water into wine at the marriage of Cana of Galilee—all thought of as manifestations of the incarnate Lord.

The Epiphany is still the primary Feast of the Incarnation in Eastern Churches, and the three-fold emphasis is still prominent. In the West, however, including Anglican Churches, the story of the Wise Men has tended to overshadow the other two events. Modern lectionary reform, reflected in the 1979 Prayer Book, has recovered the primitive trilogy, by setting the event of the Baptism as the theme of the First Sunday after the Epiphany in all three years, and by providing the story of the Miracle at Cana as the Gospel for the Second Sunday after the Epiphany in Year C.

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## Preface to the Ordination Rites

The Holy Scriptures and ancient Christian writers make it clear that from the apostles' time, there have been different ministries within the Church. In particular, since the time of the New Testament, three distinct orders of ordained ministers have been characteristic of Christ's holy catholic Church. First, there is the order of bishops who carry on the apostolic work of leading, supervising, and uniting the Church. Secondly, associated with them are the presbyters, or ordained elders, in subsequent times generally known as priests. Together with the bishops, they take part in the governance of the Church, in the carrying out of its missionary and pastoral work, and in the preaching of the Word of God and administering his holy Sacraments. Thirdly, there are deacons who assist bishops and priests in all of this work. It is also a special responsibility of deacons to minister in Christ's name to the poor, the sick, the suffering, and the helpless.

The persons who are chosen and recognized by the Church as being called by God to the ordained ministry are admitted to these sacred orders by solemn prayer and the laying on of episcopal hands. It has been, and is, the intention and purpose of this Church to maintain and continue these three orders; and for this purpose these services of ordination and consecration are appointed. No persons are allowed to exercise the offices of bishop, priest, or deacon in this Church unless they are so ordained, or have already received such ordination with the laying on of hands by bishops who are themselves duly qualified to confer Holy Orders.

It is also recognized and affirmed that the threefold ministry is not the exclusive property of this portion of Christ's catholic Church, but is a gift from God for the nurture of his people and the proclamation of his Gospel everywhere. Accordingly, the manner of ordaining in this Church is to be such as has been, and is, most generally recognized by Christian people as suitable for the conferring of the sacred orders of bishop, priest, and deacon.



When the reading of the testimonials is ended, the Bishop presiding requires the following promise from the Bishop-elect.

In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, I, John Toga Wea Harmon, chosen Bishop of the Church in Arkansas, solemnly declare that I do believe the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be the Word of God, and to contain all things necessary to salvation; and I do solemnly engage to conform to the doctrine, discipline, and worship of the Episcopal Church.

The Bishop-elect signs the above Declaration in the sight of all present. The witnesses add their signatures.

• All stand. The Bishop presiding then says the following and asks the response of the people

Brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus, you have heard testimony given that John Toga Wea Harmon has been duly and lawfully elected to be a bishop of the Church of God to serve in the Diocese of Arkansas. You have been assured of his suitability and that the Church has approved him for this sacred responsibility. Nevertheless, if any of you know any reason why we should not proceed, let it now be made known.

#### If no objection is made, the Bishop presiding continues

People That is our will.

Bishop Will you uphold John as bishop?



#### TheBishop presiding then says







very high priest chosen from  $oldsymbol{ extstyle oldsymbol{ extstyle L}}$ among mortals is put in charge of things pertaining to God on their behalf, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He is able to deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is subject to weakness; and because of this he must offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the people. And one does not presume to take this honour, but takes it only when called by God, just as Aaron was.o also Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the one who said to him, "You are my Son, today I have begotten you"; as





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#### THE EXAMINATION

My brother, the people have chosen you and have affirmed their trust in you by acclaiming your election. A bishop in God's holy Church is called to be one with the apostles in proclaiming Christ's resurrection and interpreting the Gospel, and to testify to Christ's sovereignty as Lord of lords and King of kings.

You are called to guard the faith, unity, and discipline of the Church; to celebrate and to provide for the administration of the sacraments of the New Covenant; to ordain priests and deacons and to join in ordaining bishops; and to be in all things a faithful pastor and wholesome example for the entire flock of Christ.

With your fellow bishops you will share in the leadership of the Church throughout the world. Your heritage is the faith of patriarchs, prophets, apostles, and martyrs, and those of every generation who have looked to God in hope. Your joy will be to follow him who came, not to be served, but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many.

Are you persuaded that God has called you to the office of bishop?

Answer I am so persuaded.

The following questions are then addressed to the bishop-elect by one or more of the other bishops

Bishop Will you accept this call and fulfill this trust in obedience to Christ?

Answer I will obey Christ, and will serve in his name.

Bishop Will you be faithful in prayer, and in the study of Holy Scripture,

that you may have the mind of Christ?

Answer I will, for he is my help.

Bishop Will you boldly proclaim and interpret the Gospel of Christ,

enlightening the minds and stirring up the conscience of your

people?

Answer I will, in the power of the Spirit.

Bishop As a chief priest and pastor, will you encourage and support all

baptized people in their gifts and ministries, nourish them from the riches of God's grace, pray for them without ceasing, and celebrate

with them the sacraments of our redemption?

Answer I will, in the name of Christ, the Shepherd and Bishop of our souls.

Bishop Will you guard the faith, unity, and discipline of the Church?

Answer I will, for the love of God.

Bishop Will you share with your fellow bishops in the government of the

whole Church; will you sustain your fellow presbyters and take counsel with them; will you guide and strengthen the deacons and

all others who minister in the Church?

Answer I will, by the grace given me.

Bishop Will you be merciful to all, show compassion to the poor and

strangers, and defend those who have no helper?

*Answer* I will, for the sake of Christ Jesus.

#### ¶ All stand. The Bishop presiding then says

John, through these promises you have committed yourself to God, to serve his Church in the office of bishop. We therefore call upon you, chosen to be a guardian of the Church's faith, to lead us in confessing that faith.

We believe in one God.

Then all say together

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation

he came down from heaven:

by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures;

he ascended into heaven

and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son.

With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified.

He has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.


#### THE LITURGY OF ORDINATION AND CONSECRATION

#### THE CONSECRATION OF THE BISHOP

All continue to stand, except the bishop-elect, who kneels before the Bishop presiding. The other bishops stand to the right and left of the Bishop presiding.



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A period of silent prayer follows, the people still standing.

#### The Bishop presiding then begins this Prayer of Consecration

God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, Father of mercies and God of all comfort, dwelling on high but having regard for the lowly, knowing all things before they come to pass: We give you thanks that from the beginning you have gathered and prepared a people to be heirs of the covenant of Abraham, and have raised up prophets, kings, and priests, never leaving your temple untended. We praise you also that from the creation you have graciously accepted the ministry of those whom you have chosen.

The Bishop presiding and other Bishops now lay their hands upon the head of the bishop-elect, and say together

Therefore, Father, make John a bishop in your Church. Pour out upon him the power of your princely Spirit, whom you bestowed upon your beloved Son Jesus Christ, with whom he endowed the apostles, and by whom your Church is built up in every place, to the glory and unceasing praise of your Name.

#### The Bishop presiding continues

To you, O Father, all hearts are open; fill, we pray, the heart of this your servant whom you have chosen to be a bishop in your Church, with such love of you and of all the people, that he may feed and tend the flock of Christ, and exercise without reproach the high priesthood to which you have called him, serving before you day and night in the ministry of reconciliation, declaring pardon in your Name, offering the holy gifts, and wisely overseeing the life and work of the Church. In all things may he present before you the acceptable offering of a pure, and gentle, and holy life; through Jesus Christ your Son, to whom, with you and the Holy Spirit, be honor and power and glory in the Church, now and for ever.

The People in a loud voice respond

#### Amen.

The new Bishop is now vested according to the order of bishops.

Symbols of office may now be given.

The Pastoral Staff is presented by Bishop Benfield

On behalf of the people and clergy of the Diocese of Arkansas, I give into your hands this pastoral staff. May Christ the good Shepherd uphold you and sustain you as you carry it in his name. Amen.

A Bible is presented with these words

Receive the Holy Scriptures. Feed the flock of Christ committed to your charge, guard and defend them in his truth, and be a faithful steward of his holy Word and Sacraments.

The Bishop presiding presents to the people their new bishop.

The Clergy and People offer their acclamation and applause.

The new Bishop then says

The peace of the Lord be always with you.

The People greet one another.

The new Bishop also greets members of the clergy, family members, and the congregation.

# THE VESTMENTS AND APPOINTMENTS OF THE BISHOP

The ALB, the long white garment that is already being worn, is the garment that all the baptized receive at the baptism, and it is a reminder that we are all, in our baptisms, first Children of God and co-heirs with Christ, in whom we all share in Christ's royal priesthood.

John, receive this alb. May God cleanse your heart, sharpen your mind, and strengthen your spirit for the service of the Gospel, that you may go to the altar of God with joy and gladness. In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The STOLE, is worn by bishops, priests, and deacons when officiating at the Eucharist or other sacramental celebrations. The stole is linked to the towel used by Christ while washing the feet of his disciples and is a fitting symbol of the yoke of Christ, the yoke of service.

John, receive this stole, the symbol of service to which you are called. May our Lord Jesus Christ, whose servant you are, support you with his grace, that you may always be a sign of the love and care which God has for all creation. In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The CHASUBLE is the outermost vestment in an oval or circular shape covering the other vestments worn by bishops and priests during the celebration of the Eucharist. The original Latin name of the chasuble, casula, or "little house," reminds us of the universality of the Eucharist as Christ's eternal wedding feast for all in the household of God.

John, receive this chasuble, the garment of humility. May our Lord Jesus Christ, who said, "My yoke is easy, and my burden is light," give you grace so to help others to bear the burdens of this life, that your ministry may be a sign to all people of the generosity and gentleness of the kingdom that is to come. In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

A PECTORAL CROSS is worn exclusively by bishops as a symbol of their office both to the Church and to the world. It is a daily reminder of the duty they now carry.

John, receive this pectoral cross, the sign of our salvation. May Christ give you grace to deny yourself, take up your cross, and follow him, that you may meet him when he comes in glory. In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The EPISCOPAL RING, like a wedding ring, is a symbol of the bishop's faithfulness to God and the Church. Since the Middle Ages, each new bishop has received an Episcopal Ring as a sign of office. Since the Middle Ages, each new bishop has received an Episcopal Ring as a sign of office. The ring is used as an official seal on documents that call for the bishop to affix a seal in wax. Each bishop at the ordination impressed a wax seal on the bishop's ordination certificate before the liturgy began.

John, receive this ring, the sign of your fidelity. With faith and love protect and defend God's people. In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The MITRE is perhaps the most distinctive symbol of the bishop. The shaped of the mitre is reminiscent of the tongues of fire that rested on the heads of the Apostle gathered in the upper room on the Day of Pentecost when they were filled with the Holy Spirit. Attached to the back of the mitre are two strips of cloth, called fanons, which are symbolic of the spirit and authority of the Old and New Testaments. The mitre is a reminder of a bishop's apostolic authority and ministry of "proclaiming Christ's resurrection and interpreting the Gospel" to the Church and world.

John, receive this miter. May our Lord Jesus Christ, who was crowned with thorns, uphold you, that you may lead the People of God in sacrificial service to all who live now in the shadow of the cross. In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The COPE: The cope is a long cloak, open in the front and fastened with a band or clasp across the chest. From the Latein capa, meaning cape, it may be worn by any order of the clergy on festival occasions.

The CROZIER, another distinctive symbol of a bishop, is a staff with a curved or hooked top similar in the appearance to a traditional shepherd's staff. It symbolizes the bishop's role as Chief Shepherd or Pastor who leads the flock with mercy and compassion, and the firmness necessary to uphold the justice, peace, and dignity of all God's Beloved.

The ROCHET and CHIMERE are worn by bishops as "choir dress" in non-Eucharistic liturgies such as the Daily Office or in a diocese where a cope and mitre are not preferred. "Choir dress" is traditionally worn by clergy in a public prayer when they are not part of the altar party and are seated in the choir. For example, if they are preaching but not presiding at the Eucharist. A rochet is a vestment of white linen with long sleeves that often end in ruffles or pleated cuffs It is worn under a chimere, which is a red or black, sleeveless vestment.
