All FPS sailors Paul Phillips and Mike Everitt needed to do was win to secure the overall series! This proved to be challenging in the very strong and gusty wind conditions but both were up to the challenge and claimed the wins.

**The Hansa UK National Championships** were held at Rutland in variable conditions. FPS sailors did well to finish on the podium in all 4 classes. Lindsay Burns took the 2.3 honours with Andrew Lebec 2<sup>nd</sup> and Lara Sturgis 3<sup>rd</sup>. Mike Everitt came 2<sup>nd</sup> in the 303 1P, James Woosnam 2<sup>nd</sup> and Harry Holland 3<sup>rd</sup> in the 303 2P and Paul Phillips was 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Liberty class.

The Hansa UK World Championships were held in Portimao, Portugal. Katie Apse, Kim Davies, Lara Sturgis, Lindsay Burns, Tessa Watkiss, Andrew Lebec, James Woosnam, Mike Everitt & Paul Phillips joined 12 other GB sailors and sailors from 17 other nations who entered a total of 189 boats across 4 classes: 87 Hansa 303 1P, 75 Hansa 303 2P, 17 Liberty's and 10 Hansa 2.3s.
