1. Introduction

1.1 Disclaimer

1.2 Background

PF Olsen manages over 90,000 hectares of land from Wellstead through to Augusta and Boddington. Of risk to this asset is fire which requires significant resources to respond quickly and for extended periods to minimise impact. This has tested PF Olsen's capacity in Western Australia impacting on the productivity of other key tasks.

1.3 Objective

The objective of this tender is to identify and engage with a suitable contractor for the purposes of:

- · Maximising fire suppression response;
- Increasing capacity to manage mop up and surveillance following fires; whilst
- Completing tasks that improve the value of the managed assets

1.4 Scope

The scope of this tender is detailed in the table below:

2. Obligations

2.1 Tasks to be completed

A successful tenderer will be asked to complete tasks including, but not limited to::

- · Direct firefighting
- Fire mop up and surveillance
- Prescribed burning
- Wildling control
- Noxious weed control
- Fence maintenance
- Minor erosion works
- Signage installation
- Survival assessment
- Firebreak clearing
- Other forest maintenance works as directed.

2.2 Non-negotiables

The following is a list of non-negoitiables taken on by any tenderer:

1. Business:

- a. Registered pest management business
- b. Non-competing obligations that limit availability under a future agreement
- c. Able to deploy staff at all times within the scope of the tender (refer to previous section)
- d. Audited and functioning safety management system

2. Certification (for all crew members) must be provided prior to commencement for:

- a. Medical fitness test (form attached) through authorised provider
- b. Bushfire Safety Awareness
- c. Bushfire Firefighting Skills
- d. Chainsaw (cross cut and delimbing)
- e. Pesticide technician licence
- f. Attendance to in house training



- g. Drivers licence minimum class C
- h. Within any one crew, at any given time, one crew member, but preferably all, will have an MR-B class licence. A crew is defined as a single group of persons working independently. A crew could consist of an individual.
- i. First Aid

3. Equipment

- a. Satellite device to communicate location
- b. Suitable 4x4 vehicles with relevant GVM allowance
- c. Slip-on units (400L capacity)
- d. Shovel and Rakehoe
- e. Fencing repair equipment
- f. Drag chain and snatch straps
- g. Chainsaw
- h. Fire related and other required PPE
- i. All team members must have smart phones or iPads and be proficient in the use of the mapping APP Avenza or equivalent.
- j. Hand held radios
