

11:00am - Canberra Celtic Pipe Band

11:30am - Blacktown Pipe Band

The Blacktown City Pipe Band, originally established in 1975 as the St John's Ambulance Brigade Pipes & Drums, became affiliated with the City of Blacktown Council in 1985 and adopted its current name. The band has a history of competing in both national and international events and has recently seen competitive success, placing in all competitions over the past year. It actively participates in community and cultural events in Blacktown and across Sydney. The current Pipe Major is Glynn Potter, and the Drum Sergeant is Angela Merrilees. The band wears the Ancient Oliphant tartan and performs a range of tunes, including their Grade 4B competition sets.

Midday - Canberra College Pipe Band

Founded in 1999, the College promotes and teaches piping and drumming in the Canberral region. Over nearly 25 years, it has taught hundreds of students, hosted 14 workshops with world-class instructors, and now celebrates its 10th Highland Gathering. In 2022, the learner program was strong enough to form its first-ever pipe band — the band you see performing today, made up of students and instructors of all ages.

The College is inclusive, welcoming learners of all backgrounds. If you're interested in learning pipes or drums, visit the College tent at the southern end of the grounds and chat with our team!

12:30pm - Bateman's Bay Soldier's Club Pipe Band

A Pipe Band sponsored by Batemans Bay Soldiers Club and for the community of the Batemans Bay and surrounding areas. The Band was reformed in 2015 after being disbanded for quite some years due to lack of interest and started with learners being taught by Rod Parker and Cameron Bell in January 2015 and the first engagement was Anzac Day 2015. The Band wears the tartan of Modern Elliott.

1:00pm - Canberra Burns Club Pipe Band

Canberra's oldest pipe band, the Canberra Burns Club, has been sharing Scottish music and tradition for over 80 years. With members from young learners to experienced players, the band performs locally and internationally, including the World Pipe Band Championships. Currently competing in Grade 4A, they've played across Australia, the Asia-Pacific, and Scotland. Upcoming contests include the NSW State Championships (Nov 2025) and NZ Championships (Mar 2026).

1.30pm - Bundanoon Pipe Band

The Bundanoon Pipe Band is a relatively new community band based in Bundanoon in the Southern Highlands of NSW and is part of the Bundanoon Community Association. The band started meeting just prior to the pandemic. Virtually all of the members have only been playing pipes or drums since joining the band. The band uniform is the official registered Bundanoon Tartan.

PIPE BAND SCHEDULE

2:00pm - Canberra City Pipes & Drums

Wearing the City of Canberra Tartan, the band has performed at community and ceremonial events for over 30 years, including the Bundanoon Games and Canberra Highland Gathering. As the AFP Pipes and Drums, they support Australian Federal Police events and have played internationally, including the Royal Edinburgh Military Tattoo. They welcome pipers and drummers of all levels — connect via Facebook, and tag them in your photos today!

2.30pm - Illawarra Pipe Band

Formed in 1945, the Illawarra Pipe Band regularly performs across the region, from Sydney to Ulladulla, and at events like Brigadoon at Bundanoon. The band wears the Wallace Tartan and competes in Grade 4 of the NSW circuit. New members are always welcome — whether you're learning for the first time or returning to pipes or drums. Free tuition is offered at Wednesday night practices at the George Cross Falcons Centre, Cringila. Come along to get involved, either as a player or supporter!

3:00pm - ACT ESA Pipes & Drums

Affiliated with the ACT ESA since 2022, the band performs at community and ceremonial events including ANZAC Day, the Multicultural Festivals, and Highland gatherings like Bundanoon and Canberra. They offer professional, enjoyable performances and welcome new learners through their development group. Practices are held in Hume — Mondays for the full band, Wednesdays for learners. Interested? 3:30pm - The Highlands Pipes & Drums

Based in the Southern Highlands, the band was formed 26 years ago and continues to grow and improve. They welcome new members of all levels, with tuition available for beginner pipers and drummers. As a proud community group, the band regularly performs at events like ANZAC Day, Australia Day, competitions, festivals, and more — always committed to music and community spirit.

4:00pm - Sydney Thistle Pipe Band

Formed in 1918 by WWI servicemen, Sydney Thistle is one of Australia's longest-running pipe bands, proudly marching in every ANZAC Day since its founding — including the original Victory March. The band has won State and National titles and performs at competitions, festivals, parades, and community events. Known for its musical excellence and sharp presentation, the band plays both traditional and modern pipe band music, including original compositions. They wear the Farquharson tartan in both full regimental and modern dress.

HIGHLAND DANCING

The Joy Reiher School of Scottish Dancing has been teaching students Highland Dancing for over 50 years. Joy, as well as being a qualified teacher, is an Adjudicator with the Australian Board of Highland Dancing and the Scottish Official Board of Highland Dancing. The school has produced many dancers who have competed successfully at local, National and International level. Two senior dancers have performed at the Edinburgh Military Tattoo, the Basel Tattoo in Switzerland, and the Halifax Tattoo in Canada.

Dancers have taken part in events such as the Queanbeyan Ceilidh, the Multicultural Festival, Floriade, St Andrew's nights and Burns Dinners, Bundanoon is Brigadoon, Canberra Pipes and Drums Highland Gathering, Lifeline Gala Ball, and 40th and 90th Birthday Party celebrations.



KILTED WARRIORS

ATLAS STONES

WEIGHT OVER THE BAR

CABER TOSS

Comprising of 5
Stones ranging in weight from 100kg to 145kg. They are to be lifted on to barrels 5 meters apart fastest time wins.

A box weight of 56lbs is tossed up over a bar that is progressively raised until all competitors have been eliminated. Each competitor has three attempts to clear each height.

The caber is 5.94 m tall and weighs 79 kg.
The objective is to toss the caber so that it turns end over end. The distance thrown is unimportant.

Kurt is a high school PE teacher form the Hunter Valley. He is the 2020 Winner of the Newcastle Highlander Championship; 3 time Australian Brick Throwing Champion; placed 4th at the Oceanic Championship in NZ; 2nd at the East Coast Championship 2023; 3rd at Aberdeen 2023; 3rd at the Canberra Gathering 2023; 4th at the Oceanic Championships in Hororata 2023; 2nd at the East Coast championships 2023 and 5th at the National Highlander Championships at Saltire estate this year.

Andrew Fraser (Frazer the Amazer)

A proud Ngunnawal-Wallabalooa man with ancestral ties to Fife Shire, Scotland, hence Fraser. Andrew is 32 years old and has been competing in Strength Sports since 2014. Mainly Strongman, some Powerlifting, and a few Highland Games. His achievements include 5 times NSW Strongest Man podium; 2019 NSW Strongest Man; Top 10 Australias Strongest Man; Australian representative Powerlifting Champion, multiple federation state and national champion; Multiple highland games and stone lifting champion.

Aidan Canini

29 years old. Retired from strongman, and currently playing rugby league. His Scottish ancestors have been in Australia since 1840.

This will be his first Highland Games. He currently hold's the Australian record of atlas stone to shoulder, which is 170kg for 3 reps in a minute. Aidan's biggest accolade in strongman is Australia's strongest man runner up in 2022.


Luke Reynolds

A long time competitor with the Tartan Warriors, Luke is a 3x Bundanoon Champion- 2016-18 and a 13 time competitor, 2024 & 2025 Aberdeen champion Outside of the strength world, you may recognise Luke from his acting credits. Appearing often in television commercials, movies, and TV shows, Luke was a guest star on NBC hit show- Young Rock and most recently was a star of the Channel 10 reboot of Gladiators as the Supersize Strongman Gladiator!


