WORDS FROM THE PASTOR

I did not grow up in a church culture that followed the liturgical calendar. I was introduced to Lenten practices during my studies at Princeton Theological Seminary. Knowing that across the world, Christians of every denomination are walking closely with God for the next 40 days is just what my soul needs. The unexpected loss of my dear friend, the Rev. David Van Brakle has left me with hard questions. I need to know now more than ever that I am not alone. This year's Ash Wednesday hit differently than in years past. Pastor Rich Villodas captured the feeling with words on an Instagram post, "Ash Wednesday is a day to recognize our brokenness, humanity, and trust in God's love. It's a day to freely come before God and declare, 'I am human, I am dust, and you still love me." Formal and consistent recognition of Ash Wednesday is relatively new to our church community. I encourage you to read this article which underscores the importance of it for our maturation in Christ.

Our churchwide Lenten theme of Seeking: Honest questions for a deeper faith will allow us to question and explore all that is within our hearts. Throughout this season, we hope you will continually ask yourself: what am I seeking? What is God seeking? We pray that these questions will create a safe space to explore—to be drawn more deeply into the fullness of life, into the heart of God. Let's go deeper.

CABINET CORNER

- A special Cabinet meeting was held on 1/13/23 to review the revised proposed 2023 FBC budget to be presented to the congregation at the end of January.
- A congregational meeting was held on Sunday, 1/29/23 to present the 2023 budget. The congregation moved to approve the proposed budget.
- The journey toward stewardship for 2024 will begin earlier in 2023 and will include advance training for leaders to improve direction and clarity around planning.
- A new slate of FBC leaders was approved for both the cabinet and commissions, including Tammy Kendig coming onto Cabinet as an at-large member.

- 2 new commercial ovens have been installed in the FBC kitchen. Special thanks to the Trustees for coordinating getting them installed.
- The Dream Team continues to work in conjunction with Cabinet to develop draft goals coming out of the small group and Day of Historical Reflection meetings.
- The next congregational meeting is scheduled for Sunday, 3/26/23 after worship. The agenda will include the dissemination of the 2022 Annual Report and updates from the Commissions. Full agenda to be shared separately at a later date.

UPCOMING NEEDED MAINTENANCE PROJECT

The windows of the church annex are in need of repainting to avoid deterioration of the wood. Quotes for the work are currently being sought. It is estimated that the total expenditure for the project will be between \$12,000 and \$15,000. It is hoped the work can be done this summer. This expense is not covered by the 2023 annual budget recently approved by the congregation. A capital fund raising project will be announced upon receipt of a specific amount needed to be raised. Members and friends of FBC will be asked to "adopt" a window or two so this needed project can be accomplished in a timely manner. Further information will be forth coming.



DREAM TEAM UPDATE

On Sunday, February 12th FBC held a Day of Historical Reflection. The goal was to discover meaningful statements about FBC from generation to generation. Approximately 30 congregants gathered in the dining room to look back over 250+ years of FBC history. Starting at the present and looking back through each pastor's term of service we examined the events and people who made FBC. After reflecting on the history, we broke into small groups to develop "meaning statements" based on what we had learned. The meaning statements were shared and complied then voted on to determine the top 3 priorities which will be used by the Dream Team to enhance or create additional draft goals.

These are the 9 meaning statements that were developed (in rank order);

- 1. A strong Youth Fellowship program has been foundational for FBC and brings life and energy to the church
- 2. Change Management/Leadership is something we've struggled with in the past causing anxiety, poor communication, and a lack of follow-through
- 3. The relationship of the pastor and the congregation and the accessibility of the pastor is very important to FBC
- 4. FBC has a history of being inclusive and welcoming
- 5. Music and traditions and rituals are passionate topics
- 6. A vibrant music program is an important part of our church life
- 7. The Adult and Children's Sunday School program is thriving
- 8. It is important to encourage each person to contribute their talents in service to the church
- 9. Food is important. How else can we feed the community?

The Dream Team thanks all who gave their time and energy to participate in this event. We will continue to gather input from the congregation to form FBC's strategic plan and mission statement. Our next activity will be examining our Church's norms so stay tuned for ways to participate.

YOUTH SPRING MISSION PROJECT

In keeping with the FBC commitment to our community, our Youth Sunday School will be "giving back" to our local first responders, which includes the Flemington Fire Company, Police Department and the Flemington Raritan Rescue Squad.

We will be kicking off the project in February and concluding in March.

Our youth, and with the support of the congregation, will be holding a collection of snack foods to assemble and fill baskets to be delivered to the first responders.

Students will have the opportunity to visit the rescue squad building upon the delivery.

Suggested snacks foods: Chips, granola bars, candy bars, nuts, dried fruit, beef jerky, and small packages of cookies. Cash/check donations, as an option, may be collected to purchase gift cards for coffee/drinks at local businesses.

Please identify cash/check donations as Youth Spring Mission Project and deliver to the church office or place in the offering plate. We will have a designated box by the Fellowship Hall entrance to collect the "goodies."
