



7 day Itinerary | School Exchange & History

Day 1

Arrival in Tokyo and transfer to the hotel. Welcome dinner with a local guide who will give an overview of Japanese culture and customs

Day 2

Visit Tokyo's famous landmarks, such as the Meiji Shrine, Tokyo Tower, and the Imperial Palace. Participate in a cultural workshop to learn about traditional Japanese art forms like calligraphy, tea ceremony, or origami

Day 3

Travel to the rural town of Minakami and stay in a traditional ryokan (Japanese inn). Participate in outdoor activities like rafting, canyoning, or hiking in the beautiful natural surroundings

Day 4

Visit a local school for a cultural exchange program with Japanese students, participate in joint classes or cultural activities together Afternoon, enjoy free time with your host family to experience the daily life of Japanese students

Day 5

Travel to Kyoto, the ancient capital of Japan
Visit the Fushimi Inari Shrine,
Kiyomizu-dera Temple, and the Kinkaku-ji Temple (Golden Pavilion). Participate in a Japanese cooking class or try your hand at traditional crafts such as pottery or fabric dyeing

Day 6

Visit the Hiroshima Peace Memorial Museum to learn about the devastating impact of the atomic bomb on the city and its people. Return to Tokyo for farewell dinner with the group and reflections on the trip

Design & Pop Culture

10 day Itinerary | Design, Branding & Popular Culture

Day 1

Upon arrival, students will settle into their accommodations. In the evening, they will gather for a welcome dinner, where an introduction to Japanese Pop Culture will be given by a local expert.

Day 2

Begin the exploration in Akihabara, the mecca of anime, manga, and electronic shops. Dive into the world of Otaku culture. In the afternoon, transition to Harajuku, the epicenter of youth culture and fashion. Stroll Takeshita Street and experience the kawaii (cute) culture firsthand.

Day 3

Visit the enchanting Studio Ghibli Museum in Mitaka. Discover the magic behind some of Japan's most beloved animated films. In the evening, enjoy a themed dining experience at a local anime or game café.

Day 4

Travel to Kyoto, the historical heart of Japan. Here, explore how traditional Japanese culture influences modern pop culture. Visit the Geisha district of Gion and discuss the impact of Geisha in modern media and entertainment.

Day 5

Spend the day at the Kyoto International Manga Museum, witnessing the historical progression of manga. Participate in a manga drawing workshop led by a local artist.

Day 6

Explore Osaka's vibrant
Dōtonbori district, known for its
entertainment and dining. Later,
delve into Den Den Town,
Osaka's answer to Akihabara,
filled with anime, manga, and
electronic shops.

Day 7

Visit the Hiroshima Peace Memorial Park. Reflect on the portrayal of post-war Japan in pop culture, focusing on anime and films that reference this period, such as "Akira" or "Barefoot Gen".

Day 8

Travel to Yokohama and visit the Pokémon Center, diving into the global phenomenon of Pokémon. Later, visit the Ramen Museum, understanding the importance of ramen in Japanese culture and its rise to global fame, partly due to pop culture references.

Day 9

Return to Tokyo and explore Odaiba, a hub for entertainment. Highlights include the life-sized Gundam statue, digital art museums, and themed shopping malls. Wrap up with a final reflection on Japan's impact on global pop culture at Palette Town.

Transfer to the airport to return home

Land of the Dinosaurs

9 day Itinerary | Gobi Desert Adventure

Day 1 Arrival

Day 2

Transfer to Terelj and meet a local nomadic herder family. Learn about their daily tasks. Divide into teams to try and 'walk a day in their shoes'. After a day spent herding sheep, mending equipment, transporting wools and checking boundaries, gather around to partake in a time-honored evening activity - storytelling. Listen to elders sharing their stories, fall into the cadence and prose of their traditional locution styles.

Day 3

Mount up and ride to Melkhii Khad (also known as Turtle Rock). Continue to Aryabal. Learn about Mongolian Buddhism. Then, with the vast steppes as a backdrop, take part in a meditation workshop.

Day 4

We begin our journey to the Gobi and the dig site at which we'll be digging back through time to the age of the dinosaurs. Participate in a basic skills workshop, end the day with a night exploration where you learn to read the desert stars.

Day 5

We kick off our dig at the Del Uul. The site is famous for numerous petroglyphs and graves which have been uncovered there. Explore these archaeological sites with our resident dig expert.

Day 6

We continue with our scientific exploration of the Gobi. Meet the Director of the Mongolian Institute of Paleontology & Geology, Dr. Tsogtbaatar, for an exclusive guided expedition of the Flaming Cliffs where dinosaur eggs were first discovered. Besides dinosaur eggs, the Flaming Cliffs have also yielded fossils of Velociraptors.

Day 7

We return to the present day with an equally fascinating scientific study of the Lammergeier in the Valley of the Vultures. The Lammergeier is more commonly known as the bearded vulture. Continue on to the 'Singing Sands' a geological natural phenomenon. Finish the day with a desert survival skills workshop.

Day 8

The Nadaam is Mongolia's version of the Olympics and focuses on three main sports: Archery, Wrestling, and Horse Racing. We head to the arenas for a taste of the true Mongolian spirit.

After spectating, a local expert will give us a quick crash course in the three sports and we will hold our own minitournament.

13th Century **Emperors**

8 day Itinerary | History & Culture

Day 1 Arrival

Day 2 Transfer to Terelj and meet a local nomadic herder family. Learn about their daily tasks. Divide into teams to try and 'walk a day in their shoes'. After a day spent herding sheep, mending equipment, transporting wools and

checking boundaries, gather around to partake in a timehonored evening activity storytelling. Listen to elders sharing their stories, fall into the cadence and prose of their traditional locution styles.

Day 3

Mount up and ride to Melkhii Khad (also known as Turtle Rock). Continue to Aryabal. Learn about Mongolian Buddhism. Then, with the vast steppes as a backdrop, take part in a meditation workshop.

Day 4-5

Begin a two-day immersion experience. Our historical theme is 'Emperors of the 13th Century'. We transfer to a historically accurate 13th century settlement (no cellphones, no internet, etc.). We draw lots to determine duties & social status. Groups will formulate tactics and strategies based on their instructed knowledge, and (safe) tools and weapons will be given to them to use as if they were a real army of the thirteenth century.

The 2-day experience allows us to have important conversations about why and how the Mongol Empire expanded, as well as draw parallels between international relations then and now.

Day 6-7

Armed with the knowledge and insights we've gained during our historical immersion camp, we travel to the birthplace of Temujin, known to the world as Genghis Khan. Stop off at the Genghis Khan statue complex to see collections of artifacts related to the Khan. Genghis Khan ascribed to

shamanism; particularly, mountain worship. We hike along the Burkan Khaldun, the King of Mountains. At the end of our expedition, we repeat the ritual that Temujin performed before the start of his conquest. We finish our two-day experience with a celebratory campfire overlooking the steppes.

8 day Itinerary | Sustainability & Geography

Day 1 Arrival

Day 2

Transfer to Terelj and meet a local nomadic herder family. Learn about their daily tasks. Divide into teams to try and 'walk a day in their shoes'. After a day spent herding sheep, mending equipment, transporting wools and checking boundaries, gather around to partake in a time-honored evening activity - storytelling. Listen to elders sharing their stories, fall into the cadence and prose of their traditional locution styles.

Day 3

Fly to the north of Mongolia where the Central Asian Steppe meets the Siberian Taiga. Here, we enter Lake Khövsgöl National Park, famous for its spectacular biodiversity and its natives: the Tsaatan, also known as the reindeer people of Mongolia. We'll get an exclusive chance to meet the park rangers who ensure the safety and sustainability of the Park's inhabitants. The rangers share incredible true stories of mysterious encounters and the most rewarding moments from their careers.

Day 4
In a rare once-in-a-lifetime opportunity, we spend a day with the Tsaatan to learn about their day-to-day lives. We learn about the history of the reindeer people and what it means to be reindeer herders.

The day's highlights include attempting to herd the reindeer and milking them. (Optional) Tsaatan Sustainable Tourism Campaign. Our teaching team leads students to think through the nuances and realities of sustainable tourism.

Day 5

Embark on a full day nature exploration hike, or horseback trek, of the Khövsgöl Lake. A local expert and park ranger will lead the journey, introducing the natural wonders of the park and its significance to Mongolia's freshwater resources. Khövsgöl is one of the 17 most ancient lakes on the Earth.

Day 6

Survival on the Steppes – learn vital survival skills that can be the difference life or death when in the wild.

Day 7

Meet a Shaman. Students spend the morning learning about Tengrism - an ancient religion of Mongolia based on shamanism and animism. In the afternoon, go out kayaking on a nearby lake to enjoy the icy blue of the lake and its panoramic views. Celebrate the final evening around a campfire and take part in Mongolian-style celebrations.

Day 6-7

Our steppe adventure finished, we head off to the dunes of Uyurkhangai, Elsen Tasarkha. In this two day expedition, we ride camels and learn about the biodiversity found in the Aral mountains and its surrounding deserts. Together with our rangers and experts, students will learn how to spot and track wildlife such as elk, wolves, deer, and foxes.

Day 8
Finally, we visit the Valley of the Vultures where the Lammergeier, more commonly known as the bearded vulture, roosts.
Afterwards, we go to experience first-hand a well known phenomenon of the Gabi Desert - the Singing Sands. Finish the day with a desert survival skills workshop.

Message from the CEO

I spent 7 years of my childhood in Nepal. When I was a child there, Nepal was one of the poorest nations in the world. When the royal family was massacred, we didn't dare to leave our house for almost a month. Women in the countryside who bore more than two daughters were often cast out of their homes. Mountains of garbage would clog the rivers and slum empires would be built atop of those. Blood sacrifice was a common practice. It was wild!

But my greatest memories of Nepal are the creeping revelation of the Himalayas across the skyline on a misty morning. The kind people. My adoptive sisters. The incredible work ethic of the working class. The jungles, the roaring rivers. They say that if you were to flatten Nepal's slopes out it would be bigger than North America...

It is vast.

Nepal has mellowed out since my childhood, so it is safer. Some of my best school trips have been in Nepal. There is so much to see and learn in this mountain kingdom. I invite you to bring your students here - there is much to do still. There is much to learn, and much to exchange.







Traces of Tibet

7 day Itinerary | Service Learning & Geography

Day 1

Upon arrival, participants are transferred to their lodgings. The evening features a welcome dinner where they can engage with the Nepali hosts and learn about Kathmandu's culture.

Day 2 Participants visit the Boudhanath Stupa, a significant site for Tibetan

Buddhists, and interact with a Tibetan refugee organization. The day concludes with a Nepali cooking class and dinner.

Day 3

A trip to a Tibetan school offers insight into the refugee education system in Nepal. Participants can support various educational activities. The day ends with a Tibetan cultural performance.

Day 4

Visit a Tibetan healthcare center: Participants will explore the healthcare challenges faced by Tibetan refugees and the solutions in place. Assist in healthcare outreach: Participants will help with activities like health fairs and screenings. Engage in a Nepali dance class: Participants will learn and practice traditional Nepali dance with local hosts.

Day 5

Visit to a Tibetan handicraft center to learn about traditional Tibetan arts and crafts: Participants will visit a local handicraft center that supports Tibetan artisans. They will learn about traditional Tibetan arts and crafts and the importance of preserving these traditions. Assist with marketing and sales activities to support the center's sustainability: Participants will assist with marketing and sales activities, such as promoting products online or helping to set up a pop-up shop.

Day 6

Participate in a community event or festival organized by the Tibetan refugee community: Participants will have an opportunity to participate in a community event or festival organized by the Tibetan refugee community, such as a cultural fair or a sports tournament. Volunteer with a community service project, such as cleaning up a local park or community center: Participants will engage in a community service project, such as cleaning up a local park or community center, as a way of giving back to the community. 7 day Itinerary | Duke of Edinburgh Qualifying Trek - 50km

Day 1: Kathmandu to Pokhara

- Distance: Flight or 200km drive.
- Highlights: Enjoy a scenic flight or drive through lush valleys.
- Overnight: Hotel in Pokhara's Lakeside with views of the Annapurna range.

Day 2: Pokhara to Tikhedhunga

- · Distance: 9km
- Highlights: After a drive to Nayapul, the trek's starting point, walkers journey alongside the Modi River and pass through terraced farms, getting an introduction to Gurung villages.
- Overnight: Tea house in Tikhedhunga.

Day 3: Tikhedhunga to Ghorepani

- Distance: 13km
- Highlights: The day involves a challenging ascent up the famous '3,000 steps' to Ulleri village, trekking through dense rhododendron forests, and enjoying panoramic views of the Annapurna and Dhaulagiri ranges.
- Overnight: Tea house in Ghorepani.

Day 4: Ghorepani to Poon Hill to Tadapani

- Distance: 10km
- Highlights: Trekkers start
 with an early morning hike
 to Poon Hill for sunrise
 views over the Himalayas,
 then descend through lush
 forests, crossing various
 streams and soaking in the
 serene environment.
- Overnight: Tea house in Tadapani.

Day 5: Tadapani to Ghandruk

- Distance: 10km
- Highlights: The path descends through forests alive with birds and cascading waterfalls, eventually leading to Ghandruk, a picturesque Gurung village. In Ghandruk, visitors can explore its cultural museum and enjoy traditional dance performances in the evening.
- Overnight: Tea house in Ghandruk.

Day 6: Ghandruk to Pokhara

- Distance: 8km trek, then drive to Pokhara.
- Highlights: The morning begins with a descent to Nayapul followed by transportation back to Pokhara. Celebrate the trek's conclusion by exploring Pokhara's Lakeside, visiting the World Peace Pagoda, or relaxing by Phewa Lake.
- Overnight: Departure from Pokhara or stay in a hotel

Then, embark on an amazing journey through Haw Par Villa's remarkable landscape, filled to the brim with cultural sculptures of all shapes and sizes.


Day 6

The center showcases NEWater, highgrade reclaimed water that has found its place as a Singapore success story and the pillar of Singapore's water sustainability.



7 day Itinerary | Outdoor Education

Day 1

After check-in, tour the trendy area of Myeongdong – the centrifuge of fashion in Korea. Go for a stroll along the Han River to take in the Seoul skyline. Relax in the evening by enjoying a unique Beyond Classrooms activity: a "squid games" take on traditional Korean Board Games.

Day 2

Start the day at Gyeongbok Palace and finish your tour by witnessing the change of Guards ceremony. It's time to don a dobok (도복) and learn Korea's national martial arts, Taekwondo. Spend the evening winding down through a street tour at charming Insadong.

Day 3

Embark on a must-do cycling route along Korea's central river, the Han river. Feel the cool breeze and enjoy the grass and changing cityscapes as we pedal through the heart of the city. Baseball is a massive part of Korean popular culture and attending a baseball game here is a completely different experience than anywhere else in the world. Let's go to the ball game! Day 4
Transfer to Gangwon (3



Sports culture is massive in Korea and South Korea is one of the world's top contenders in baseball. Go to watch a game at Jamsil Stadium!


Day 6

8 day Itinerary | Language Immersion

Day 1

After check-in. Enjoy the view from the tenth tallest building in the world, Taipei 101.

Day 2

Transfer to Tamsui Fisherman's Wharf to begin a series of language adventure activities leading students through Fort Santo Domingo and ending in Tamsui Old Street. Meet our expert Shih Yen-Shiang for a lecture on the relationship between Taiwan and Mainland China and the history of Taiwan's Indigenous communities. Enjoy dinner at a famous night market with a snack tour and language scavenger hunt game.

Day 3

Transfer to Hualien by train and have a short hike along the beach. Dolphin & whale watching is available at certain times of the year. Visit Taroko Gorge. Meet and learn about the Amis Indigenous peoples through participating in a tribal field game and an evening musical dancing activity. Stay overnight at Leader Village Taroko, an Amis-run guesthouse, to get a sense of the local way of life.

Day 4

Travel over to the Kiwit people, another Amis Indigenous peoples, and learn how to cook Kiwit cuisine. Visit the Kiwit Tribes Museum to learn more about the culture and folklore of the Kiwit people. Experience fish hunting in the afternoon with an Amis guide.

Stay overnight in a thatched house that's traditional to the Kiwit people.

Day 5

Experience a rafting tour with the Amis, in which we learn more about the wisdom of the Amis ancestors (秀姑峦溪泛舟). After lunch, travel to Shitipin for a night out camping, have a BBQ dinner and movie night at the campground.

Day 6

Cycle along the coast enjoying the breathtaking scenery and fresh air. Visit the College of Indigenous Studies and attend the Aboriginal Youth Conference with young Indigenous students sharing their life stories and studies. Head back to Taipei by train and enjoy dinner at the famous Toilet Restaurant.

Day 7

Engage in community service with the Sweet Potato Mama Program, a project helping single mothers to live independently by supporting them to become vendors of traditional Taiwanese sweet potatoes. Support the mamas by helping them sell sweet potatoes and get to know them as they teach you how to roast these snacks. Have lunch and, afterwards, visit the Sungye Museum of Formosan Aborigines. Finally learn how to make a Taiwanese specialty, Pineapple Cakes!

Day 8 Departure Day







Geology & Adventure

9 day Itinerary | Outdoor Education

Day 1

Arrive in Kaohsiung. Visit
Hamasen Railway Cultural
Park, a perfect place to join
locals at sunset, enjoy a picnic
and fly kites. Have a welcome
dinner.

Day 2

Transfer to the Wushanding Mud Volcano Geology Park for Geology Survey #1 – climb around, finding a small caves and watching the mud bubble out of the volcanic cones. Then explore Fengshan Old City and the Naval Juancun (眷村, Military Village) to gain a deeper glimpse of Kaohsiung's port town past. Experience a Juancun Cooking Workshop, making your own dumplings and bubble tea for dinner.

Day 3

Transfer to Taitung by train then take the ferry to Green Island (50 minutes). Visit the National Human Rights Museum, located in a former island prison. Go snorkeling in the late afternoon. Follow our expert naturalist for a night exploration along the coastline. (Optional: Relax at the local coastal hot springs.)

Day 4

Engage in Geology Survey #2
– go on a road trip around
Green Island to explore its
lava pillars and learn about
costal erosion. Participate in a
local school exchange. Go
kayaking in the ocean before
taking the ferry back to
Taitung and have dinner
there.

Day 5

After breakfast, get ready for a 3-day biking trip in Huadong Valley (total 175 km)! Cycle from Taitung to Luye (32 km) in the morning, enjoy views of mud volcano, rivers, mountains, highlands and rice paddies. Continue biking to Fuli (35km), enjoying the breath-taking scenery.

Day 6

Bike from Fuli to Yuli (25km). En route, stop by the junction of the Eurasian Plate and Philippine Sea Plate, where you may "set foot on" both plates at the same time. Continue biking to Ruisui (25km) on a route that will require you to conquer 300 meters of altitude. Get to the top to enjoy panoramic views of tea plantations and take a triumphant photo at the Tropic of Cancer monument. Relax at a local hot spring in the evening.

Day 7

Bike from Ruisui to Fenglin (35km). On the way, stop by Danong Dafu Forest Park, which in the last century used to be a sugar-cane field. Continue biking to Hualien (38km). After getting refreshed visit the biggest night market on the Taiwanese east coast and enjoy the famous Taiwanese night market atmosphere!

STEAM School Trip

5 day Itinerary | Science & Technology

Day 1

Arrive in Taiwan. Transfer to Tamsui Fisherman's Wharf to begin a series of language adventure activities leading students through Fort Santo Domingo and ending in Tamsui Old Street. If you arrive in the afternoon, have a short but steep hike up Xiangshan and enjoy the best night view of Taipei 101 during sunset. Transfer to hotel and check in.

Day 2

Transfer to Yilan Jiufen (1 hour). Visit Gold Ecological Park, a Japanese-era mining complex turned tourist park, where hillside paths connect 1930s offices, workshops and dormitories, and touch what is reputedly the world's largest gold bar at the Gold Museum. (Additional option: Join old miners to experience traditional gold mining in the creeks.) Visit Cingshuei Geothermal Power Plant and learn about sustainable energy production in Taiwan. Choose your own food adventure and try a variety of local delicacies for dinner at a famous local night market, while also competing in a language scavenger hunt

Day 3
Transfer to Sanxia (1 hour).
Take part in a traditional indigo-dyeing workshop.
(Alternative options: pottery workshop or wood workshop.) Visit Tzushr Temple and appreciate the sophisticated handicrafts in this Taiwanese Palace of Art, which is undergoing a renovation for the past 80 years!

Start your two-day STEAM school exchange with Grass Book House, an afterschool community center which acts as second home for disadvantaged students.

There are 3 different possible activity themes: Option 1: Robot Building Challenge Option 2: Cooking Workshop Option 3: Career Path Training

Engage in evening activities with local students after dinner.

Day 4





After lunch, walk along the Lotus Pond and explore the numerous temples and palaces that dot the area, including the Confucius Temple, the Spring and Autumn Pavilions, and the Dragon and Tiger Pagodas. Visit the Dulan people (an
Amis Indigenous group), learn
about local Indigenous
culture, and participate in a
housing renovation project.
Have dinner at a local Dulan

and go stargazing in this rural
part of Taiwan. (Optional:
Relax at the coastal hot
springs).

Day 4 Visit the Forest Culture Museum to learn about forest protection Learn about the local Sazasa Indigenous people, lunch in the forest. Cook in a traditional woodfire kitchen to make traditional mochis. Finally, experience reforestation by planting seedlings. Transfer to Hualien.

Day 5

Head straight to the beach, enjoy a beach hike and use found materials to design your own art. Visit the stunning Taroko Gorge. Meet and learn about the culture of the Amis Indigenous peoples by playing traditional field games together and learning their musical dances. In the afternoon, choose one of the activities below:

- Dolphin & whale watching (seasonal)
- · Adventure river tracing
- Cycling along the coast

Day 6

Transfer back to Taipei. Visit Tamsui Fisherman's Wharf. Engage in community service with the Sweet Potato Mama Program, a project helping single mothers to gain financial freedom by helping them to become vendors of traditional Taiwanese sweet potatoes. Roast and sell sweet potatoes together. Enjoy a short but steep hike up Xiangshan. For dinner, explore a night market and go on a snack tour.






