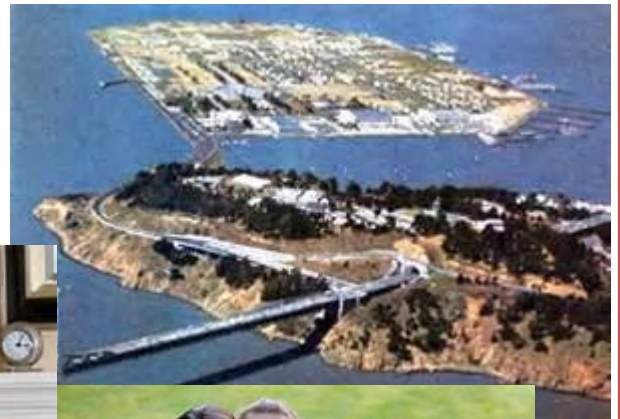

The SFYBL is run by a board of partner and volunteer commissioners.</p> <p>SFYBL is team based. There is no draft where your child is assigned to a different team each season.</p> <p>Registration for SFYBL opens on November 12th and a close date is yet to be determined. Registration is team-based as well as individual. The SFYBL Opening Day Ceremony will be held in February. The season will begin shortly thereafter and end around late May/early June.</p>

<p>Additional Information</p>	<p>The Life Learning Academy is an alternative to a traditional high school setting. LLA is committed to a nonviolent community for students who have not been successful in traditional school settings. LLA welcomes students into an “extended family” that motivates everyone to give and receive support, develop responsibility and judgment, and build the academic, vocational and social skills necessary to be successful.</p> <p>LLA is a project based learning environment. LLA successfully engages students with histories of school failure who desire new paths to academic, career and life success. LLA is designed specifically to serve the highest-need students in San Francisco. To serve these students effectively, LLA’s multidisciplinary team of educators, counselors, peers and alumni surround each student with support, identify their strengths, and work to ensure that no one falls through the cracks. Their student to teacher ratio is much smaller than a traditional school setting with a ratio of 6-12 students to 1 teacher.</p> <p>Students graduate with a high school diploma offered at a credit count of 200, as opposed to a traditional high school graduation credit count of 220+ credits.</p> <p>In the fall of 2019, LLA will open a dorm for up to 24 students who are at risk of homelessness and/or are unstably housed.</p>

<p>Process to Obtain Services</p>	<p>All Community members must complete a YMCA of San Francisco membership application. All Treasure Island community members will be known as ‘Community Participants’ and memberships will be free of charge and only valid at the Treasure Island YMCA. Youth under the age of 13 must be accompanied by an adult 18 years of age to enter the facility. Youth under the age of 13 must be enrolled in the Treasure Island Youth Programs to enter the facility without an adult at least 18 years of age. All members must have a valid membership to enter the facility.</p>

<p>Additional Information</p>	<p>Afterschool Program Description:</p> <p>For TI youth to learn, grow, and thrive, they must be given equitable opportunities to engage in extra-curricular activities. Our program curriculum focuses on 3 main areas: academic achievement, enrichment and skill-building, and health and wellness. Participants receive daily tutoring support from trained staff. If students do not bring homework, they will have extended reading time or engage in hands-on academic-based activities. Participants will engage in skills building activities that foster creative expression and leadership development including but not limited to: music, dance, and visual arts or sports. All activities are intended to enhance participant’s social, physical, and mental well-being.</p> <p>Weekend Program:</p> <p>Participants will be able to participate in either Art, STEAM or Sports related skills building and/ or development during the weekend. The TI YMCA will provide developmentally appropriate skills building programming for youth in K-12. Participants will have the option to participate but not limited to: basketball, volleyball, soccer, football, martial arts, yoga, swimming, Lego building, cooking, creative arts, and dancing. Sports leagues will focus on the development of fundamental skills through weekly practices and competitive games. For team-based sports, we will offer both gender-specific and co-ed team structures. Activities such as martial arts, yoga, and dance will focus on cultural competency as well as skill development through weekly lessons and demonstrations/performances. All activities in the program will incorporate team work, nutrition education, and skill progressions, and will be led by trained program staff and volunteers.</p> <p>Holiday and Summer Camps Program:</p> <p>In partnership with the Embarcadero YMCA Treasure Island Youth Program participants have the opportunity to participate in various Holiday and summer camps free of charge. During both the summer and school year participants gather at the Treasure Island YMCA to leave the island and explore the Bay Area! Interested families must confirm which weeks and camp groups they are interested in attending. Camps are 100% free to all residents of Treasure Island with proof of address. One Treasure Island integrates all its employment programs with financial educational services. These services include budgeting, credit and credit repair, free tax preparation and linkages to help open bank accounts, address student debt, child support arrears and identity theft.

One Treasure Island operates a **Job Broker System (JBS)** which offers job search and placement assistance for individuals interested in construction/trades and non-construction/trades job opportunities that are both ‘on island’ and ‘off island’. We work with Treasure Island employers to assist them with fulfilling their training and hiring goals.

To access the JBS and Financial Educational & Coaching services, all participants must attend a One Treasure Island Orientation which are held Wednesdays starting at 10:00am. After Orientation, participants will be asked to enroll with One Treasure Island services.

Dial **415-553-0123** for situations that require the San Francisco Police Department, but do not require an immediate police response (e.g., loud parties, a group of juveniles loitering in front of your home, noise complaints, reporting theft and other property crimes).

The purpose of San Francisco's 911 Emergency Telephone System is to provide for the immediate response of police, fire, or medical personnel for emergency occurrences. To accomplish this, it is imperative that the calls received on 911 lines be restricted to those situations that require immediate dispatching of Police, Paramedic, or Fire Department personnel.
