

Additional	Afterschool Program Description:
Information	For TI youth to learn, grow, and thrive, they must be given equitable opportunities to engage in extra-curricular activities. Our program curriculum focuses on 3 main areas: academic achievement, enrichment and skill-building, and health and wellness. Participants receive daily tutoring support from trained staff. If students do not bring homework, they will have extended reading time or engage in hands-on academic-based activities. Participants will engage in skills building activities that foster creative expression and leadership development including but not limited to: music, dance, and visual arts or sports. All activities are intended to enhance participant's social, physical, and mental well-being.
	Weekend Program:
	Participants will be able to participate in either Art, STEAM or Sports related skills building and/ or development during the weekend. The TI YMCA will provide developmentally appropriate skills building programming for youth in K-12. Participants will have the option to participate but not limited to: basketball, volleyball, soccer, football, martial arts, yoga, swimming, Lego building, cooking, creative arts, and dancing. Sports leagues will focus on the development of fundamental skills through weekly practices and competitive games. For team-based sports, we will offer both gender-specific and co-ed team structures. Activities such as martial arts, yoga, and dance will focus on cultural competency as well as skill development through weekly lessons and demonstrations/performances. All activities in the program will incorporate team work, nutrition education, and skill progressions, and will be led by trained program staff and volunteers.
	Holiday and Summer Camps Program:
	In partnership with the Embarcadero YMCA Treasure Island Youth Program participants have the opportunity to participate in various Holiday and summer camps free of charge. During both the summer and school year participants gather at the Treasure Island YMCA to leave the island and explore the Bay Area! Interested families must confirm which weeks and camp groups they are interested in attending. Camps are 100% free to all residents of Treasure Island with proof of address. 



As part of our **Construction Training Program (CTP)**, we offer a 6-week construction focused workforce development program serving adults who are interested in the trades and have experienced barrier in successful employment. Working in partnership with San Francisco CityBuild, our CTP has been developed to assist local contractors in meeting hiring and training goals on Treasure Island and across San Francisco. Our partnerships include the Laborer's Unions #67 and #261. Upon successful completion of the 7-weeks training program and passing a drug test, participants will be offered employment opportunities through a variety of contractors and construction companies.
