The shop will also feature a DVD rental section.


Town Hall

MEET THE TEAM - Natal
Executive Director
Natal is named after KwaZulu
Natal province in South Africa,
where her dad was born.
Portuguese navigator Vasco da
Gama first visited there on
Christmas Day 1497 and named
the area. Natal means
"Christmas" in Portuguese. So
it's NOT short for "Natalie"!

She has deep Yukon roots because her father's parents emigrated from South Africa to the Yukon in the early 1950's. When Natal was born, her mom and dad were living in Shearwater, B.C., a small fishing community a 12-hour ferry ride from Prince Rupert.

When her grandfather, Pat Olsen, passed away, her dad Rick moved his family to Whitehorse to be closer to his mom Rae. Natal graduated from high school in Whitehorse and then, like many teenagers, "I wanted to get the heck out". She's not a fan of winter, so she moved south to Victoria and did

some travelling. She came back to Whitehorse "for the summer" in 2011, met her future husband Troy, and stayed.

Most of her career since she was 19 has been in hospitality. She worked for Northern Vision Development in Events in 2012, but she missed hotel work, so eventually moved over to manage the Gold Rush Inn for them. Then, when NVD was asked to partner on the project that produced Normandy Living, senior management suggested she'd be a good fit here. She joined the project when it was "just blueprints. The day-to-day that you live is kind of my brainchild come to life". She is proud to have been part of the team that built our home.

Her biggest challenge as Executive Director of Normandy Living, personally, is that she feels she's too empathetic. Operationally, it's just coordinating the different personalities – finding the right social and recreational activities for every resident. "Keeping everybody happy. Everyone has different needs and wants, likes and dislikes. Part of it is the excitement around being new – new building, new concept for the Yukon".

And her biggest delight?"There are many roads that can lead you to Normandy, and it can be challenging to get settled in. When someone is settled in and happy, and living the life they want to live, there's lots of joy in that for me. It's nice seeing the improvement in people's quality of life".

What does she herself doing in 5 years? "If I'm in Whitehorse, I'll be here. Normandy Living has become something of a passion project for me, and I want to see it through to being a full, vibrant, successful community. I love it here. Husband, family, friends, great job. But, man, I hate winter!"
