

- We are asking God to open doors for us to continue to launch prison campuses across Northeast Florida, including our first campus in a women's prison and across the state line into Georgia



- Continue to roll out the red carpet for families in the special needs community with a focus on adults with special needs
- Come alongside our first responders and help support them in the fight for our community
- Honor, love and care for our senior adults, while continuing to equip them to fulfill the Great Commission at every stage of life
- Fight for the mental health of people in our community, particularly those with thoughts of suicide and families that have walked through this tragedy

I first began attending Eleven22 back in 2011, when it was just a service at Beach UMC. With a lot of shuffling around and moving in my life, it took a few years for me to land back at Eleven22, but I finally did and began attending in person. In 2017, I moved overseas. I still felt a connection with Eleven22 and would download and listen to the sermons once they were posted online, but that was the only connection I really had.

But then 2020 and the pandemic hit, and as difficult as things have been since then, there have been so many blessings that have come from that—mainly the fact that Eleven22 Online launched and I could watch the services live, worship included! Online disciple groups also became an option, so I was able to join one, which has been amazing and has been a great way for me to connect with my church family, even though I live half-way ground the world.

Another wonderful opportunity that happened because of Eleven22 Online was that I was able to start serving online. Livestreaming the services had already become part of my normal schedule, and it seemed like a natural next step to begin serving online. It's wonderful having this chance to serve my church and not just be a consumer, even though I cannot physically be present at a campus.

Before the pandemic, there didn't really seem to be any way to serve because of my geographical location. But once Eleven22 Online

started, that opened the door for serving online; it doesn't matter where I am geographically located, I am able to serve my church.

Before 2020, I knew Eleven22, and I considered it my church, but nobody knew me. It felt like a one-sided connection. I considered Eleven22 my church home, but nobody knew who I was and while the thought of visiting Jacksonville when I visited the states again was a nice thought in my mind, it didn't really feel like an option. Now, because of the Eleven22 Online opportunities, I feel known and connected and like I can walk into a campus one day and connect in-person with people I already have a bond with. It feels like a church family that I belong to, instead of just something I listen to.

For most of my life, my walk with Jesus has been lukewarm. I was raised in a Christian household by parents whose faith continued to grow as we got older, and my sister and I got to witness that. There was no lack of Christian influence in our young lives. I accepted Christ as my Lord and Savior in middle school and prayed to Him often throughout my life in times of need. But I never got baptized and I did not behave in a committed way in my walk with Christ.

In my late teens and early twenties, I floated adrift through my life. Personal traumatic experiences from my early teenage years plagued me mentally. I allowed myself to be treated poorly by others, because I felt worthless and insecure of who I was. In many ways, even in this "prodigal period," I know the Lord was there. He continued to be good, gracious and present, even when I was not being obedient. He never left me.

In 2020, my first husband and I separated for the first time. After only two years of marriage, we divorced in April 2021. That moment was the catalyst to my return home to Jacksonville, Florida and my realization that I desperately needed to reconnect with God; that I needed spiritual help and the support of my family.

My sister was attending Eleven22 and insisted I come with her to a service. I have never felt so connected to a church body from one single service. They said, come down front for


prayer and I was connected with a church mentor who followed up with me. Three years later, we still have a relationship. It was clear to me, as soon as I reached out to Jesus, that He had been waiting

for me and He was telling me, "Here I am." I knew Eleven22 was my home.

I had wanted to get baptized, in previous years, but I was sick or busy. Fast forward to 2023, and I was determined that nothing would stand in the way of me publicly proclaiming Jesus Christ as my Lord and Savior. I have received overflowing goodness from God in the past year (moving into a new home, getting remarried, our first baby due in June, etc.). I could hear God's call to demonstrate this act of obedience and declaration. Instead of being discouraged when I realized I would be 39 weeks pregnant at Beach Baptism, I was excited and empowered. I knew this was an opportunity to have Him in the center and to be sanctified in preparation for our daughter's arrival. My experience at Beach Baptism was such a beautiful gift. I am so thankful for how His unending love has transformed my life. I am valuable because He is worthy.

about those exciting and positive things.



There has been a "silver lining" to this difficult season. We've drawn near to each other in loss; hugging and crying together.

we're more aware of each other; especially our frailties and we love each other more. A recently widowed woman shared this week how she's being invited to more meals than she can accept—

even five months after her loss.

Most of all, we've drawn nearer to God. After all, what hope other



I became a believer in 2017. From then on, I began to learn of my role in the kingdom and the local church, but never once did I label myself as a "missionary." I sat through years of messages on being a "sent" Christian. "Here I am, please don't send me," I told the Lord. That's just not my calling in life, I thought.

Fast forward to 2021 and the Lord had blessed me with a kingdom-community beyond what I'd ever dared to dream. Through these faithful Bible-believers and loving friends, I began to see the necessity of the Great Commission—not just in my community and nation, but to the ends of the Earth—as Luke describes in the book of Acts:

"Won't you join Me?"

In this simple yet profound nudge of the Holy Spirit, my eyes were opened to the command given by Scripture that I had neglected for so long. As I further dove into the Lord's heart through His Word, I saw His love and compassion for the people in unreached areas. So, that summer, I decided to spend two weeks in Zanzibar, Africa, on mission to the unreached Muslims in that nation. Afterwards, I once again felt the nudge of the Holy Spirit, as He planted a seed to begin the road to discerning my call to long-term mission.

I debated this calling for about nine months, until I was attending a weekly service at Eleven22. We had just started a new sermon series called *The Next Thing*. Pastor Joby asked, "What would you do for the glory of God if you knew you couldn't fail?"

"BE A MISSIONARY TO UNREACHED PEOPLE GROUPS!" screamed my soul.

"The next thing that you and I are to do is the thing that brings the most glory to God. The

next thing is to be obedient to God in exactly what He is telling you to do," Pastor Joby said.


As if I was the only one in the room, the words cut straight into my spirit and I knew what I had to do.

After service, I immediately applied to a three-month, long-term mission training program

geared toward reaching unreached people groups. I was scared out of my mind, but had supernatural faith and confidence that this was my "next thing."

I can now utter the very words, "Here I am, send me" with no hesitation or fear. How different this is from when I first became a believer! Through the 10:10 Life discipleship journey, I will spend three months in Mozambique and Zambia, Africa, learning how to reach the thousands of unreached people groups on this Earth. I'm not sure how the end will play out—only He knows—but I can't wait to see what's on the other side of this "yes."





For us, choosing to foster is much like the old "Starfish Story" by Loren Eisley.


One day a man was walking along the beach when he noticed a boy picking something up and gently throwing it into the ocean. Approaching the boy, he asked, "What are you doing?" The youth replied, "Throwing starfish back into the ocean. The surf is up and the tide is going out. If I don't throw them back, they'll die." "Son," the man said, "don't you realize there are miles and miles of beach and hundreds of starfish? You can't make a difference!" After listening politely, the boy bent : to save them all, but to the children and families down, picked up another starfish, and threw it back

into the surf. Then, smiling at

the man, he said..." I made a difference for that one."

We discussed fostering years ago when our kids were just babies. It has been in our hearts for a while now. When the 10:10 Life initiative was announced and foster care was a part of it, we immediately looked at one another and smiled in agreement that this is where we were being led to serve. After the service, on the way home that day, we shared why fostering was important to each of us and talked about what our journey may look like.



Watching each child explore God's creations in the world around them and witnessing children's lightbulb moments has forever brought us great joy. When it comes to foster children, we believe that every child has a need for love, safety

and security that we can provide while their biological parents find healing. Through our training, we learned we may have the opportunity to mentor and help the children's biological parents as well. Like the

starfish, we may not be able we are called to serve, with

God's help, we can help to change everything for them.

We are looking forward : to providing love, safety and security for the children who come into our home, and also to being a place of light and hope for their parents. We understand that, many times, being placed in foster care is a generational cycle, and we can only imagine what the impact on the world will be when that cycle is broken, one family at a time. We believe in the value of life and that every life is a gift from God. We feel called to action to help support the need for foster-care families.

As a family, we have talked about what fostering may look like and we understand it may not always go the way we envisioned, but either way we are here to serve. We have been truly blessed and we can only hope to be a blessing to those we are serving with and for on this mission.

The same day the world shut down, my sweet, Jesus-loving mama was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer. My siblings all live in Alabama and Covid restrictions prevented them from coming to Jacksonville, so it was just mama and me—and cancer and Covid. She lived for only eight weeks after her diagnosis. I had never known fear like this before. Not only was the whole world seemingly falling apart, but my own little world was too.

So began my quest to defeat fear. I started to read every Scripture that had the word "trust." I wrote down every verse and turned them all into weapons to use against Satan and his right-hand man, fear. When I had read all the "trust" verses, I asked Jesus to reveal to me other weapons I would need: grace, forgiveness, peace, strength, kindness, joy and hope.

One day, I was reading about spiritual gifts. I knew what the gifts where, I knew which ones

God had given me—teaching, encouragement, hospitality—so there I was breezing through this Scripture when the Holy Spirit stopped me in my tracks. The notes at the bottom of the



page said, "The purpose of the gifts is to build up the church." I'd heard that my entire life. Why did it sound different that day? My time with Jesus went in a completely new direction. "Jesus, can You please show me how You want me to use these gifts for building up the church and increasing Your kingdom?"

I had started my 30th year teaching, which is when you're eligible for retirement in

Duval County. Instead of retiring, I enrolled in DROP—a deferred retirement option plan that would allow me to work up to five more years and accumulate about \$200K in additional retirement money. Now, it doesn't compare to the "crown of life," but it is a pretty shiny reward for those of us in Duval County Public Schools. At the end of those five years, I'd collect shells and read for fun for the rest of my life.

God had other plans. Abundant life plans.

One night after Saturated, my daughter Hannah and I were debriefing in the parking lot at the Arlington campus. She said, "I want to ask you to do something and I don't want you to say no until you have prayed about it. There's a Kids Minister position open that I think you would be a great fit for." I didn't say no (not out loud anyway) and since I told her I would, I prayed about it.

Pastor Joby introduced 10:10 Life and asked, "What would it look like for you to live out His plan for your life?" He said, "There is no retirement in God's kingdom" and that people my age are on the JV team and God has plans for us. Retirement and collecting seashells...not in God's plans for you! Was He really calling

me to this drastic life change?

Three months later, surprising everyone but God, the Kids Minister position opened at the Baymeadows campus and I was offered the job. The Bible says that when we draw near to God, He will draw near to us. I am trusting God—I want to do whatever He tells me to do. I want to hold fast to Him and drop my grip on everything else—even \$200K.

MOVE FORWARD, PAST OUR FEARS.'

As a Jacksonville Sheriff's Officer, my life verse has been Joshua 1:9 NIV "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the LORD your God will be with you wherever you go." But, I never imagined how that verse would come alive on February 23, 2023, when I faced a battle for my very life with a suspect who intended nothing but harm for me.

While responding to a call, I was severely injured and found myself in need of support and encouragement as I started my long

journey to recovery. I knew very little about the 10:10 Life discipleship journey at Eleven22, but almost immediately found myself and my family experiencing firsthand

the amazing support available to us. Whether it was tangible support or visits from the team that brightened my day, I felt incredibly blessed by this ministry and want to be a blessing to others in this very challenging and difficult work that we are called to do.

As police officers, we see the worst that humanity can dish out and our families don't necessarily understand the horrors of what we can experience every day. That's what makes the support of the 10:10 Life and First Responder Ministry so special. Everyone understands; everyone has experienced those life-changing calls, witnessed the unspeakable...yet through this support, we are able to continue to work within our personal mission field and provide the care that our community and citizens need and deserve

while maintaining a work/life balance that is based on a foundation of faith and trust that God and my support group at Eleven22 have my six.

Those first few days and weeks after I was beaten are something of a blur. My

jaw was wired shut "THE RESOURCES PROVIDED THROUGH TOOLS AND SUPPORT FOR ALL OF US AS A FAMILY AND HELPED US ALL TO

and the headaches and pain were overwhelming. My children, aged five, six and thirteen, didn't know what to think and worried when I

: was not in their immediate sight. The resources provided through the First Responder Ministry were tools and support for all of us as a family and helped us all to move forward, past our fears.

Returning to work is going to bring new fears and concerns to the surface in all of us, but I am confident in my faith and know that God has other plans for me. As part of my recovery, I hope to be a beacon of hope to others within the profession who face their own difficulties, and let them know that just as God was there for Joshua and gave him the courage to sustain him, I can be there to help lend a helping hand and a listening ear when circumstances are difficult.

When I think back on my 27year career with Jacksonville Fire and Rescue (JRFD), there there are specific incidents that are forever burned into my brain. I have delivered babies

on the side of the road, pulled severely injured people out of mangled cars and held the hands of someone as they took their last breath, knowing there was nothing I could do for them.

One of the highlights of my career was teaching EMT and paramedic students. I could teach them how to perform lifesaving procedures, but the fire service as a whole is not good at teaching skills and techniques to protect us from the trauma and compassion fatigue that is always present in this line of work. That's why I am excited about the First Responder Ministry at Eleven22 and want to make supporting this ministry a priority in both my personal and family life.

My family is a three-generation fire-fighting family. My father retired from JFRD, I am retired from JFRD and my daughter is currently in the fire academy and plans to follow in our footsteps. I want my daughter to understand that it's okay to talk about the things that we see and experience. It's okay to need support and encouragement; it doesn't make you less

of a firefighter or paramedic, it may help you to be a better one

I have seen too many of my peers suffer from addiction, depression, failed relationships or worse, find themselves at the point of suicide because it's not considered "okay" to discuss the fear and pain this sort of work will always bring. My hope is that through the First Responder Ministry, I can be a support too and help fellow first responders through the rough patches that we will all face and do it in a way that other first responders understand, as we are a unique group!



I can share my own personal experiences and challenges along with how I have tried to overcome them. And, I can be a positive light in a profession that often only sees dark.


I look forward to the growth of the First Responder Ministry through 10:10 Life and can't wait to see the good that it will bring to our community.

As I sit down to write this, I wonder where to begin. In 5th grade, after leaving the school and church I went to for my whole life, I entered a new public school without a church home. My anxiety skyrocketed and I ended up in the hospital with a diagnosis of obsessive-compulsive disorder (OCD). It was scary and frightening, but somewhat comforting to have a diagnosis.

My family started attending The Church of Eleven22 and I got saved during my first service. This was back in 2013 and Pastor Joby was talking about having faith the size of a mustard seed. I cried out to God and said "That's all I have."

After surrendering my life and starting middle school, things got much better and my OCD basically shrunk into nothing. However, in 2022, I was faced with some hard, traumatic experiences, including my dad leaving and filing for divorce (which was completely unexpected and heartbreaking).

My OCD came back with a vengeance, and it started to convince me that I was going to lose people that I love. It was completely debilitating. I

was in a constant, sick state of anxiety and was trapped in an endless loop. In January of this year, I Baker Acted myself because of these thoughts. They started to become so overwhelming, that I wanted to take my own life. I entered a 30-day mental health clinic in

order to try and get some relief and answers.

Through the inpatient stay, I got a lot better and learned so much about Jesus and His goodness and purpose for this pain. Then three

weeks later, I found myself on the bathroom floor, desperately gasping for air and crying out to God, begging for Him to take away these negative, intrusive thoughts.

I went back to the hospital because the suicidal thoughts were so prevalent and I felt hopeless. But God. I felt and saw Jesus working in and through the entire staff at the hospital. I was so broken and they prayed for me and encouraged me. I'm still on this journey and still struggling, but I know that the Lord is going to use my story and my heartache to bring others to Him and for that, I am forever grateful.

If you find yourself feeling suicidal, reach out to friends and family and cry out to God.

Jesus is always there to wrap His arms around you in the moments of deep, crippling pain.

Always remember, people would rather sit and listen to your struggles than attend your funeral. You are all so loved and valuable and so is life. I'm thankful that I have the desire to start living it again.

BACK-TO-SCHOOL SUPPLY DRIVE HOSTED BY ELEVEN22 KIDS, LOCAL MISSION AND HOPE'S CLOSET

Ethan was a miracle from the very beginning. He was born at 32 weeks, gestation due to having a stroke in utero. We were told that there was brain damage, along with many other issues and that he would more than likely not make it or ever leave the hospital. Doctors know a lot, but God our Great Physician had a better plan for Ethan.

Since Ethan entered high school, he has truly struggled with being "special

needs." Ethan knows that he is different but is not sure why and hates that he cannot be like everyone else. He wants friendships, hangout time, and typical teenage stuff. Between some deep depression and bullying at school, Ethan decided that the world would be a better place without him, and in January of this year, he tried to take his life.

That has been the hardest thing that we have ever been through as a family. Ethan started hanging out with a friend named Ava and going to Eleven22 Students on Tuesday nights. Soon he became a part of the "McArcher" family, as we call them. Jason, Ashley and the whole family have embraced our sweet son like their own. They have not only loved on Ethan but our entire family during these tough months. They bring food, watch other kids, call, text etc. Ethan's whole demeanor has changed; not every day is great or perfect in any way, but he is slowly starting to see his worth.

Ethan loves being at church now and asks to go all the time—he even asked to go to camp. If I'm being honest, I did not want him to go because I was so nervous about

him being away and me not being able to control what would go on without being there to make sure he wouldn't be picked on, would brush his teeth, etc. so I decided to just pray about it. Prayers were answered about my worries one after the other. Matt, the Eleven22 Student Minister at the St. Johns campus, has been a huge blessing and said, "YES! He is going, we will make it work."

Still questioning whether this was a good move or not, we took the leap of faith and signed him up. God said, "I've GOT THIS," loud and clear. While on the camp Zoom call, I learned that a good friend of ours, Krystal, who lived down the street from us in Hong Kong and who doesn't even have a high schooler, is going to camp as the camp nurse. Only God could ordain that!

God is continuing to show us that Ethan can have an abundant life. We are truly thankful for The Church of Eleven22 and that they are a movement for all people, including our miracle Ethan.

I was a chapel clerk at Baker Correctional, when Chaplain Kopp showed up to evaluate the chapel for upgrades to allow for Eleven22 sermons to be broadcast to the inmates. As I spoke with the team, I found out that we were to be an official campus, not just a place for the ministry team to visit!

I remember what they dubbed the "beta" service. Pastor Joby preached on redemption. He used the illustration of a time his dogs escaped his yard and he found them at the pound. They told him that to get his own dogs

was close to \$200, but to adopt any other animal was \$50! So, he signed away his ownership of them to the pound, walked out the door and

walked right back in and adopted his dogs back. What a powerful image of God doing everything to bring us back to Him!

For the next two years (minus the Covid lockdown), I spent every Monday handing out notecards and materials for study and working closely with the team to help other inmates. Even if I had not been a chapel clerk, I know the teams would have been there to help me. I watched them pray over, anoint and offer assistance to the men getting out of prison. They were a picture of Christ's love to us. I would spend the time in-between services

getting to know the character of these men and enjoyed discussing God's Word with them.

Once I was released. I started going to the Arlington campus where I was able to

meet back up with Pastor Eddy Foye, another long-time prison campus team

> member. I got connected with my first disciple group, but was only able to attend for a short time due to work. Pastor Greg Farah connected

me with Mike Van Bibber, and after being absent from the group for over a year, he was delighted to see me! He even offered me a part-time job working in his office.

I leave you with this hope: if you discover who at your campus is a former attendee of an Eleven22 prison campus, welcome them home. Tell them that their past no longer matters; their future is in Christ!

God is moving in Sarasota, and we just want to be a part of what He is doing. Over 200 people are gathering together on the weekends, hosting their own Eleven22 service.



As we roll out the red carpet for families in the special needs community, we are praying for:

- a sensory-friendly adult environment at San Pablo
- what foster care would look like specifically for kids with special needs
- the expansion of Night to Shine in Jacksonville, multiplying the number of events that we are hosting

In our fight for the unborn we have plans to create new serve opportunities to **support pregnant mothers in low-income communities** and provide additional resources through funding, training and hands-on serving through our local partners.



We have plans to partner with a
Christian mental health facility, which
will help us continue to educate and
equip our Care team to walk alongside
those who are fighting for their mental health,
specifically providing pockets of the Care
team with mental health first aid training.

Moving foward, we are setting out to scale prison ministry and leverage our influence to help churches everywhere begin to adopt prisons.

We plan to hire a Senior Adults Pastor to lead and disciple seniors who are still on mission and care for our senior adults who can no longer care for themselves. We will not let people be forgotten; we will bring the gospel to them, with plans to increase the number of services we are hosting in senior living facilities across NE Florida and beyond.

We will provide additional resources and funding to our partners and through them, give men, women and children who have been victims of human trafficking a safe place to be cared for and learn about the love of Jesus.

As a part of the fight against childhood poverty, we will continue sponsorships through Compassion. And in our partnership with the Boys & Girls Club of NE Florida and Tiny Hope, host a club in Jamaica that our short-term missions teams will be able to serve alongside.

Others made a 10:10 Life commitment one year ago and perhaps for some of us, this journey has been as difficult—or possibly more difficult—than we had envisioned.


Maybe you went to a completely new level in your generosity and are still adjusting your








GIVING INIIRNEY

This tool is designed to help you move money from being an idol to money being a tool for God's kingdom. The journey focuses on the condition of our hearts, further transforming us into the likeness of Christ.

Each step of the journey represents growth in a lifestyle of generosity and sacrifice.

INITIAL GIVER

Philippians 1:5-6

An INITIAL GIVER is someone who decides to give for the first time, out of a response to God's Word about giving. This is someone who decides to give something and trust God and the leaders of the church with this gift.

CONSISTENT GIVER

2 Corinthians 8:7

A CONSISTENT GIVER is someone who decides to give something and to give it on a consistent basis to exercise the discipline of giving. Often, someone who decides to make their gift an online recurring gift will be someone who is learning the behavior of consistency. Non-online givers can be consistent givers as well, of course; it just requires more discipline.

SURRENDERED GIVER Colossians 1:15-20

Luke 14:28-30 An INTENTIONAL GIVER

INTENTIONAL GIVER

is someone who thinks about their giving in relation to their other financial priorities. This giver starts to make their giving an intentional choice that reflects how they prioritize it in relation to other things on which they spend their money.

A SURRENDERED GIVER

is someone who recognizes the power of the gospel and is surrendered to honoring God with 100% of their resources as a result. A Surrendered Giver is someone who gives in a way that changes them, in a way that reflects that their giving is governing their spending/saving rather than their spending/saving governing their giving. A Surrendered Giver isn't just concerned with what they ARE giving, but is more concerned with what they're NOT giving and why, and they seek to honor God with ALL He has given them, whether that means direct monetary giving or a God-honoring use of an existing resource.

ETERNAL GIVER

1 Timothy 6:6-19

An ETERNAL GIVER is someone who is thinking about the longer tail of generosity rather than just the shorter term of month-to-month generosity or even year-toyear. An Eternal Giver makes decisions in the short term that have long-term effects as it relates to their generosity capacity. They think of what home they buy, what car they purchase, how much savings they choose to keep, all in relation to their generosity capacity. An Eternal Giver is driven by the things of eternity, putting their hope in God and not in the things of this earth.


