

CABINET NEWS

Quick highlights:

- We are hopeful that the City of Portsmouth will accept our code path that alleviates our need to put sprinklers in the building. However, we do not have final approval yet. Please keep the prayers coming! On a related note, current building code requires that we have five restrooms. Though we wonder if this is the best use of our limited space, we can reframe that to believe that we are building for the future with a packed sanctuary! As we await approval from the City, we also await pricing from our engineers. Once we receive these important pieces of information, we'll let you know by way of informational meetings, hopefully in late April, to discuss the construction process, timeline, and address congregational questions. After we have answered questions from the congregation, we will announce a date for a congregational meeting to vote to approve the amended plan and required funds. In the interim, please contact anyone on the renovation/construction team (Christine Groleau, Pete Kinner, Doug Woodward) if you have any questions or concerns. Information as to updated plans, pricing, and timing will be communicated to the congregation as soon as it is available.
- The Cabinet is facilitating a ministerial review. Many thanks to our ministerial review committee (Barb Bolko, Betty Gilman, Liz Good, Christine Groleau, Betsy Kinner, Nancy Layton, Nichole Prince, and Pam Woodward). Keep your eyes peeled for a survey coming your way soon. The surveys will be sent through email, and hardcopies will be available for anyone who prefers to respond on paper. The purpose of this review is to understand better what North Church does well and where we can grow. Please offer your insights by completing the survey when you receive it.
- Select pieces from the North Church silver collection have been lent to the Portsmouth Historical Society (PHS) for display in "The Matter of Memory" exhibit. Swing by the PHS April 1 November 3 (open seven days a week from 10 5) to check out our silver.
- Become a part of the Cabinet team! We have two members cycling off the Cabinet at the end of June and would love to offer anyone with interest the opportunity to discuss the role and/or attend a meeting.

The furnace is working, and we're back "home." We have overcome the many obstacles that have delayed our construction. North Church is on a path forward! Many thanks to all who continuously work hard to make this happen with both grace and grit. And, as always, thanks to you, the congregation for your continuous support.

Throughout the centuries, shawls have been made and worn to provide comfort, warmth and protection from the elements.

Gifts of Prayer shawls are handmade well wishes for the recipient; offering comfort, warmth and fortification from the emotional elements of the world around us.

Shawls can be gifted for those undergoing medical procedures, as a comfort after a loss, in times of stress, during bereavement, for commitment or marriage ceremonies, as a bridal shower or wedding gift. A prayer shawl may be used for prayer or meditation, in leading a ritual, during an illness and recovery, ministering to others, birthing, nursing a baby, ... the possibilities are endless.

Knitting a prayer shawl can be as comforting for the knitter as it is for the intended recipient. Marcia Leach has put together Prayer Shawl kits for members of the congregation who would like to join her in this ministry. Kits include yarn and a pattern for a shawl. Needles are not included, but she has extra needles if anyone needs them.
