Introduction

Scripture Is Essential to the Way of Jesus

What we think about will shape what we believe, who we become, and ultimately, how we live. This is why the Apostle Paul tells us to be transformed by the renewing of our minds—a process that will lead to a transformed life. For Jesus, meditating on the Scriptures went beyond self-development or intellect to a more personal and compelling reality. The Bible has the power to translate the world around us and tell a truer, better story that exposes lies and reveals the coming hope of life as it should be. It is a book (or, more accurately, a library) unlike any other, in that as we read it, we are read by it.

The Scriptures played an essential role in Jesus' life and ministry; he lived as if they were authoritative. The Scriptures were not as much a tool, instrument, or weapon for him, as they were part of how he viewed and interacted with both God and the world. The integration of Scripture in Jesus' life was paramount to his ability to see the transforming promise of the coming Kingdom of God. In fact, Jesus is the singular person in all of biblical history to claim that the Scriptures were not only forming him, they were about him. The story of the Bible culminates in the person of Jesus.

Our aim, as **Bridgetown Church**, is to be with Jesus, become like Jesus, and do what Jesus did. The only way to get the life of Jesus is to take on the lifestyle of Jesus. Through the daily reading of the Scriptures, his reality becomes our reality. Following in the footsteps of our Rabbi, we want to read the Scriptures every day so that they might come alive in us and that we might see the world, know the Father's love, and serve our neighbor the way Jesus did.

How To Use This Book

Daily Bible Reading Plan

In these pages, you will find a daily Bible reading plan organized thematically around the church calendar—an annual cycle of seasons and days observed by the global, historic church crafted to remember Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. This book will help you pray, meditate, and journal through the Scriptures using a rhythm called BREAD, which is a modern take on *lectio divina*, an ancient and time-tested method of meeting with God in the pages of the Bible. Simply spend time each day allowing the prompts below to guide your time.

BE STILL: Start by putting away your devices or any distractions and get into a comfortable but alert position. Take a moment to let the noise of your mind settle. Become present to your breath, and invite the Holy Spirit to guide your time.

READ: When you're ready, read through the Scripture for that day. After a minute or two, read the passage again slowly. As you read, notice what stands out to you in the passage and write it down.

ENCOUNTER: Meditate on what God highlighted to you in the passage by journaling through questions like: Where does this intersect with my current life and circumstances? What might God want me to know about himself, myself, or others? Is God revealing a lie or truth he wants me to notice and respond to? What else might God be saying to me?

APPLY: Next, begin to name and write down how God might want you to carry what he's saying into your day. What truth do you need to hold onto today? How might God want to change you through this passage? Write down how you are going to apply this truth practically today.

DEVOTE: Finally, write a prayer, committing yourself to what God has been revealing to you and how you want to be transformed by him and his truth.

How To Use This Book as a Family

Weekly Bible Reading Plan

At Bridgetown Church, our goal is that every person—adult and child—would increasingly grow to be with Jesus, to become like Jesus, and to do what Jesus did. But we also know that these things don't just happen overnight; they take time, intention, and repetition. So, with this in mind, we have designed a supplemental resource with Bread that families with young children can utilize to engage the practice of Scripture together.

On our website, you will find a script to guide your time as you read the weekly Psalm out loud together during your family's Sabbath practice or at another set time during each week. On that page you will also find a printable worksheet with space for kids to write or draw their response to each week's Psalm.

Epiphany & The Season After

January 6-March 4

January 6 marks the first day of the season of Epiphany — a season dedicated to proclaiming God's presence in the world. Epiphany comes from a Latin word that refers to making seen something that was hidden. This season marks three revelations, or revealings, in church history: the gospel to the Gentiles (represented by the Magi's journey to Jesus), Jesus as the Son of God at his baptism, and Jesus' power at the wedding at Cana.

Interestingly, the season of Epiphany relates to the portion of Jesus' life about which least is known: the time between the Magi's visit and Jesus' baptism. But what we do know is that "Jesus grew in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and man" (Luke 2v52), and that the story of the Magi highlights God's heart to bring all nations and peoples to himself, which is a beautiful narrative of inclusion that we are living out today.

Epiphany serves as an annual reminder of the revelations of God: he is good, and he is with us. We can participate in Epiphany by doing what Jesus did: studying the scripture and committing to grow in wisdom. As we move through the year and live into our identity as God's image bearers, "we are transformed into walking epiphanies, minimanifestations of God shining forth in the dark world" (Danielle Hitchen, *Sacred Seasons*).

Lent, Easter, & Pentecost

March 5-June 8

Lent is traditionally marked as the 40 days preceding Easter, corresponding with the 40 days Jesus fasted in the wilderness. Beginning with Ash Wednesday, we as followers of Jesus often partake in our own 40 day practice of fasting from food or abstaining from a particular habit. While the length of time itself is actually 46 days, Sundays are omitted and considered "feast days" in which we break our fast and participate in a foretaste of the coming resurrection.

The season of Lent, in its many deaths to self, prepares our hearts for resurrection. As C.S. Lewis puts it in *Mere Christianity*, "Nothing in you that has not died will ever be raised from the dead."

Palm Sunday begins Holy Week, in which we walk with Christ over the seven days before one of the most significant events on the church calendar, Easter. On Easter Sunday, we celebrate Jesus' resurrection and the defeat of death itself! Easter begins a 50 day season of Eastertide, in which we mark Jesus' resurrection and new life all season long with feasting, joy, and celebration of the freedom we have in Christ.

50 days after Easter, we mark the gift of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. We recall and embody the moment the Holy Spirit fell on the disciples hiding and waiting in the upper room—the same Holy Spirit who fills us now.

Ordinary Time

June 9-November 29

Ordinary Time is the longest season of the church calendar, stretching from Pentecost to the beginning of Advent.

Epiphany, Lent, Pentecost, and even Advent invite us to reflect on and anticipate major shifts: resurrection, the birth of the Messiah, and light breaking through darkness.

Ordinary Time asks us: What do we do after we receive this gift of new life? We live faithfully. We practice resurrection in our regular, every day, "ordinary" life.

We must remember, however, that something being ordinary does not stop it from being sacred. Every part of creation—big and small—is being redeemed and restored to God. Each moment in our lives is an opportunity to live out the story of redemption, from the casual hidden act to the grandest or most public moments of our lives. In Ordinary Time, we live out and lean into our own ongoing conversion to be with Jesus, become like Jesus, and do what Jesus did.

Historically, Ordinary Time has been an opportunity to reflect on the humanity of Jesus, and many of the themes we will encounter and explore in the coming months will focus on his life, ministry, teachings, and the various ways in which we, the church, are invited to carry on his ministry on earth.



Advent & Christmas

November 30-January 5

For 400 years before the birth of Christ, God was silent. We enter Advent together in a posture of waiting: for hope, for light, for God himself.

And in the darkness, the Word himself broke the silence. The season of Advent is one in which we enter into mystery and wonder, living in the reality of what is and in anticipation of Jesus. Together we enter into the story of God and his people, living in the reality of how very long they waited for the Messiah, and the reality that we, too, are awaiting his return.

One of the ways we can lean into Advent is acknowledging the areas of our life where we are in need of a Savior.

The anticipatory posture in Advent gives way to a beautiful celebration on Christmas Day! Together, we get to celebrate the birth of our Savior—Immanuel, God With Us. And together, we get to stand firm in awaiting our Savior's return. God broke into human history, becoming as fragile as can be—an infant refugee. He joined us down in the dirt of human life, and overcame the world.

Our readings for the first four weeks will explore classic themes of Advent: hope, peace, joy, and love. As we turn to Christmas (traditionally a 12 day celebration leading up to Epiphany!), we'll reflect on and celebrate the reality of God coming near with his good, beautiful, and perfect Kingdom.
