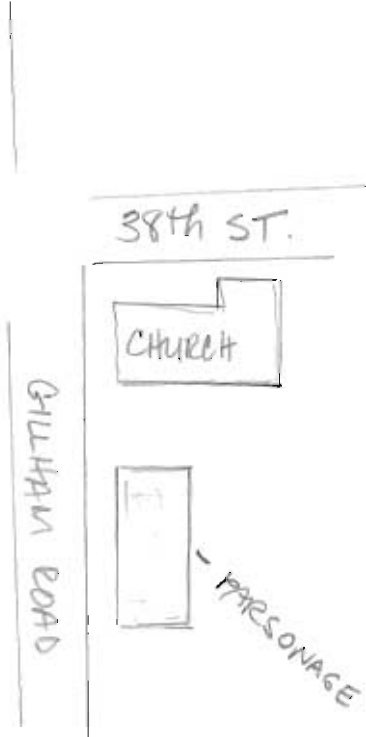

<p>T. At the time of construction, this chapel (eleven Lutheran churches of its type in the United States) was built for the worship by the deaf exclusively. It was a missionary project under the leadership of Rev. Alvin E. Ferber, pastor. Funds for its construction were provided by other Lutheran congregations. A parsonage was built to the south (3607 Gillham Road). The architect for the church, Rev. Webber, authored a book entitled "The Small Church". Clifton Ramey was the associated architect.</p> <p>2X. Additional features of the church include projecting entryway, joined batten wood double doors set within cut stone Gothic arch; quatrefoil stained glass window with cut stone surround; wood steeple or fleche, recessed stained glass windows placed with Gothic arches with cut stone surrounds and sills; decorative buttress. 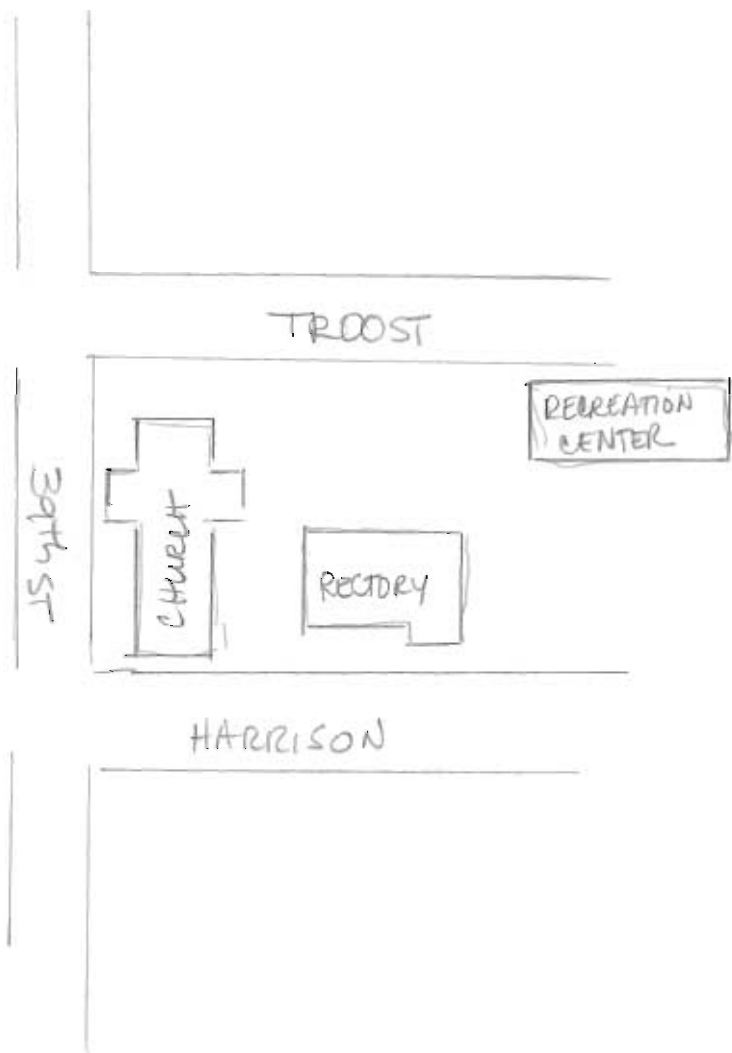

T. The parish for this church was canonically established in 1906. The first pastor was Father John Keyes. The original site for the church and school was at Fortieth & Tracy Streets. In 1909, part of lots 23 and all of 24, Troost Highland Addition, were purchased from R. S. Asbury at a cost of \$39,000. There was a house on the site which was used as a rectory. In 1910, the remainder of lot 23 and part of lot 22 were deeded to Father Keyes. The following year the present church was built and modeled after St. James Episcopal Church in London. The architects, Sanneman and Van Trump declined to take a fee for their design. The church was completed Dec. 22, 1912. The Carthage limestone used in the construction of the church came from the top 65 ft. of the Winner Piers (forerunner of ASB Bridge). The stone was mined in Cotton Falls, Ks. in 1887 and cost \$19,000. The church itself cost \$40,000 to construct and originally had a seating capacity for 430 persons. There are no pillars in the church. The church was dedicated on Aug. 24, 1913. In 1924, a \$60,000 addition to the east of the church was begun. New stained glass was installed in this addition. This addition was dedicated in 1925. In 1927 a \$40,000 Kilgen organ was installed and 1965 the high altar and communion rail were removed. The rectory is to the west of the church and connected by a 102 foot colonnade.

2X. Main facade faces west. Additional features of the church include: twin towers (north tower belfry); main entrance centrally placed and placed within blunt arch with stone voussoirs; buttress flanking entrance supports; cut stone stepped coursing; stained glass windows with sills and blunt arches on first story of towers and on north and south facades; triple rectangular windows with continuous stone sills in towers; cut stone parapet; stone cross at ridge; stone retaining wall surrounds property on west and north; cornerstone north tower. *The 1924 addition is not discernable.*

This church was the first of the original denomination to be built in Kansas City.

Additional features of the building include; double wooden door entrance; casement windows with brick sills; small iron balcony with font over entrance, cut stone medallions (head of boy with basketball-right, and girl with tennis racket-left) flank the entrance and are the prominent decoration on the building; brick cornice consists of alternating six headers and six stretchers and barrel vault roof.

- T. In 1914 a lot was purchased for the construction of this church. The foundation was laid immediately and the church was dedicated January 16, 1916, costing \$60,000 to complete. Owen and Payson's design included a parsonage adjoining the auditorium, Sunday school rooms and ladies parlor in the basement, and the auditorium, vestry, study and council room on the main floor. At the time of construction the large art glass window over the main entrance was to be the largest in the city. In 1922, a balcony was added and organ was enlarged. On March 24, 1923, an application was made to change the name of the church to St. Mark's Lutheran Church. In 1924, the lot west of the church was purchased in order to build a parish house. Also included in the plans at that time were the enlargement of the auditorium, a new parsonage, and general remodeling. The three-story Tudor design parish house was designed by Shephard and Wiser, architects. The original parsonage was incorporated into the 1924 addition when the auditorium was expanded, and an existing residence to the south was purchased (Charles H. Surber Residence) and used as the parsonage. It should be noted that the intent of the architects for the 1924 addition (parish house) was to design a building which would preserve the residential nature of the street.
- 2X. The church originally measured 66' x 110'. The main entrance faces east. Additional features of the church include: corner towers (north-belfry); crenelated projection - first story; entrance recessed and centrally placed; stepped cut stone parapet with pointed arch and shield motif over entrance; windows have stone lintels and sills, large stained glass window framed within cut stone arch surround with drip stone; cut stone coping; decorative stone cross at ridge; north elevation stucco, false half-timber, 1/1 double hung sash window; stone retaining wall and iron fencing run along property.
