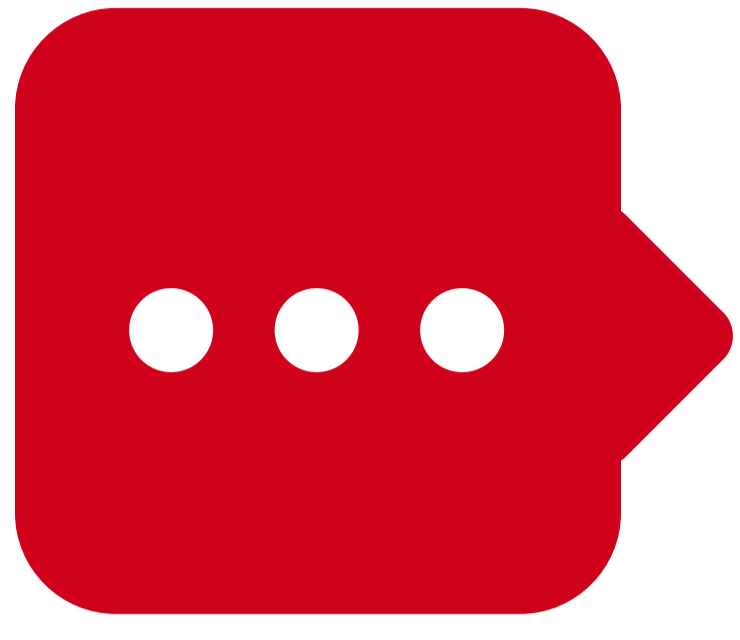


Precinct Chair Spotlight

I wanted to contribute something on a local basis to save my country for generations to follow.

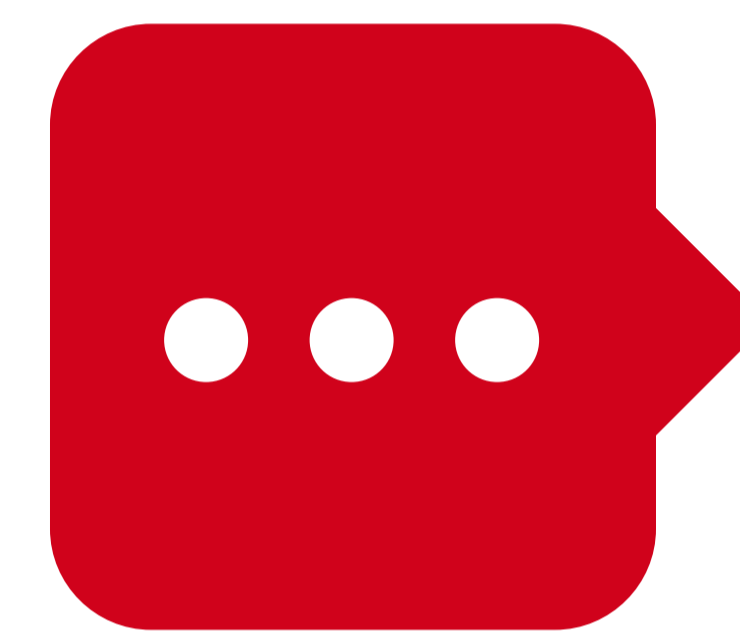

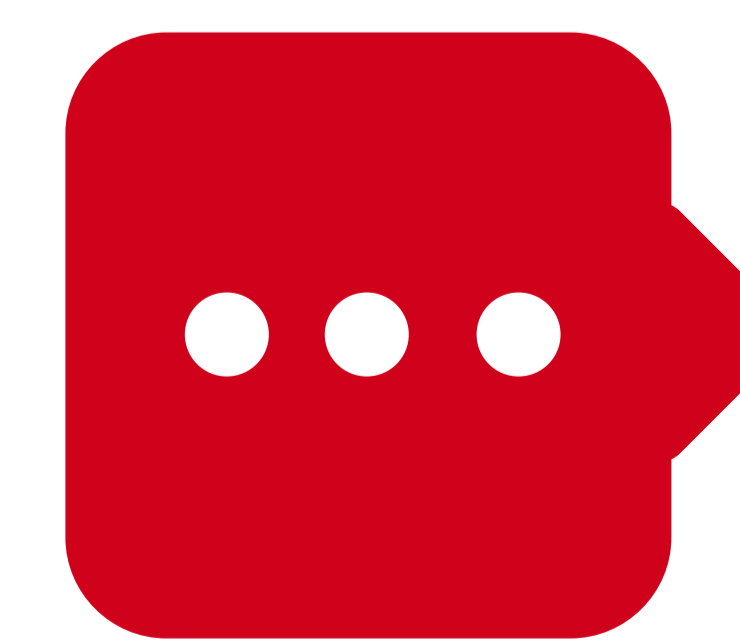
What contributed to your love of country?
