
THANKSGIVING AT THE TABLE



For as often as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes:







INVITATION TO COMMUNION

Come to the banquet, for all is now ready.


Thanks be to God.

We sit. All are invited to the Lord's Table. Communion is distributed by intinction. Intinction involves dipping the consecrated bread (wafer) into the chalice of wine and then eating.

Ushers will invite both sides of the congregation to come forward via the center aisle. The Pastor will hand you a wafer at the head of the aisle. After receiving the bread, proceed to your side and dip it into the chalice of wine, being mindful not to submerge your fingers. If, by chance, the wafer goes directly into your mouth, don't worry—the Pastor will gladly provide another. Return to your seat via the side aisle.

For those who prefer, prepackaged wafers and grape juice are available. Gluten-free wafers are also available. Notify the Pastor of your preference when arriving at the front. You may stay in your seat for communion, and the Pastor and Assisting Minister will bring it to you. Please dispose of your trash after worship if you have any.



MUSIC NOTES from John Sparkman

Today we join in worship with a beautifully diverse assortment of the St Philip community's favorite hymns & songs. We begin singing with *A Mighty Fortress is Our God*, written by Martin Luther sometime between 1527-29 and affectionately known by yours truly as the "Lutheran National Anthem." Inspired by Psalm 46, the hymn proclaims God's unyielding strength amid adversity. Though today we, along with most everybody else, sing a version of the tune with isometric—that is, *evened-out*—rhythm, the original version of Luther's tune is feisty and syncopated. While the tune's original rhythm likely was *inspired* by bar-hall songs, modern scholarship has debunked that Luther directly took the tune from the tavern. Listen for this original rhythm in the organ's introduction and interlude as we sing the hymn today, and find it at hymn 503 if you're interested.

As we conclude Communion, we'll share in *Amazing Grace*, composed by John Newton in 1779, which reflects the author's transformation from a slave trader to a repentant clergyman. Pairing it with *Give Me Jesus*, a 19th-century African American spiritual, is particularly poignant. *Give Me Jesus* emerged from the terrible conditions of enslaved persons, while *Amazing Grace* was inspired by the repentance of one enforcing their unjust oppression. Could these songs proclaim that Christ's Table both nourishes deep, unjust wounds and heals shameful, wicked transgressions, personally and collectively? Amazing, indeed!

We go out on a high note, so take a deep breath first. *Lift High the Cross*, penned in 1916 by George Kitchin and Michael Newbolt, adopts a triumphant, missional tone. Inspired by the Cross as a symbol of victory, it calls believers to proclaim the Love of the Table boldly, carrying Christ's amazing love to our aching world.

While all four hymns share a foundation in Christian faith, offering hope and strength, their expressions vary: Luther's is steadfast, *Give Me Jesus* is deeply personal, *Amazing*

Grace is broadly redemptive, and *Lift High the Cross* is evangelistic. Together, they reflect the rich tapestry of worship and reflection that the music of the church has written on our hearts.
