SYNOPSIS AFTER DINNER

After Dinner is a poignant and hilarious collision of lonely hearts, sex, friendship and Friday night drinks.

A suburban pub, circa 1987. Paula, Monika and Dympie are going to paint the town red... or maybe just a deep shade of embarrassment.

Paula's frocked up, it's Monika's first night out in years and Dympie just wants a table with a good view of the band. Semi-eligible blokes Gordon and Stephen are shaking off the office and revealing their own peccadillos while they're at it. Between the Chardonnay, the oysters and the odd Valium things are bound to loosen up!

This play was written in 1984, and the themes within – love, relationships and loneliness – are just as relevant today as they were back then. On the surface, this play seems like a benign comedy of manners, but dig a little deeper and we find an existential piece full of timeless yearning for human connection. It's a beautifully observed period piece from a time when we were all a little less knowing. A true celebration of the iconic 1980s.

"What's interesting about bringing to life a play from this era is exploring human interactions in the decade just before technology completely changed the way we connect with and relate to one another. There was no internet, no social media, no mobile phones. How did we meet people? How did we communicate? Most importantly, how did we avoid looking awkward while sitting alone in a bistro? What did we do with ourselves? It's also fascinating to reflect on how dramatically certain values and attitudes have shifted in the intervening years."

Hannah is delighted to be working with collaborator and mentor Michelle McAleer to co-direct After Dinner for Bladwell Productions. The pair first crossed paths almost a decade ago when Hannah performed in The Children's Hour which was directed by Michelle.

Amanda is so excited to get back on stage, doing her first show with Bladwell Productions. Originally from Canberra, Ally has been performing in theatre since she was 12 years old. Some of her favourite roles include Nelly in South Pacific (Queanbeyan Players), Glinda in The Wizard of Oz (RHMTC) and Maureen in Rent (G-String Productions). Ally has also performed in several locally written musicals and short films set in Australia, and is very excited to take on this role written by one of Australia's most talented playwrights. Ally's first real introduction to the 80s was playing Kim in Back to the 80's and ever since she's been in love with the music, the fashion and the overall fabulousness of the era. She looks forward to bringing some of that to the stage as Monika.

SOPHIE LINTON she/her PAULA

Sophie has been involved in acting since she was 7 years old. She has completed over 10 years of speech and drama lessons at the Hume Conservatorium, where she regularly performed and compèred concerts. She previously played Zoe in Debra Oswald's *The Peach Season* (The Lieder Theatre). Sophie was selected for state drama ensemble on two occasions. Sophie has always had a passion for creativity, with her 2018 short film 'Musician Man' being selected for ArtExpress and being showcased at the Art Gallery of New South Wales. Since her last performance, Sophie has been busy at university studying advertising and public relations.

A lover of supercars, musical theatre, guitar and historic vehicles, this father of six has a diverse range of theatrical credits.
