EMRS State Voting Intentions Poll May 2023

The survey was conducted from the 15th to the 19th of May 2023.

1,000 adult Tasmanian residents were interviewed and responses weighted to reflect the Tasmanian adult voting population.

A sample of this size provides a maximum margin of error of +/- 3.1 percentage points at the 95% confidence level.

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The survey was implemented according to ISO 20252: 2019 standard, certificate number 888027.

The most recent EMRS poll was conducted from the 15th to the 19th of May 2023, calling landline and mobile phone numbers throughout Tasmania.

- At 36% currently, support for the Liberal State Government fell significantly from the previous poll in February 2023, by 6 percentage points.
- Support for the Labor Party now stands at 31%, up by a marginal 1 point from 30% in February 2023.
- Decided voter support for The Greens is currently at 15%, rising marginally from 13% in February.
- Of the remaining decided voters, 18% currently stated that they would vote for another option to the three major parties, a rise of 3 points from 15% in the previous poll. The current 18% was comprised overwhelmingly of those supporting an independent candidate (16%).
